DISCUSSION:

1. Welcome

3. Tree Inventory

- a. Wendi stated that a tree inventory is a functional tool for managing maintenance, planting, diversity, etc. and recommended a quadrant rotation plan.
- b. Type of inventory depends on how it will be used—planting plan?
- c. 50% canopy coverage in residential areas is desirable
- d. software programs are available for inventorying and mapping i.e. 1-Tree Freeware, City Tree Program, ArcView
- e. can ID trees on inventory with tags

4. Update on Slab Garden

- a. the landscape plan was separated into 7 elements each to be rebid individually:
 - Demolition & Site Preparation; buried slab removal
 - Import Topsoil Placement and Rough Grading;
 - Provide and install, buried 1" PVC electrical conduit
 - Prepare planting bed with amended soil; finish grade
 - Provide and plant four trees; mulch ring in each tree
 - Provide and install sod
 - Optional: Provide and install seeding
- b. installing plants in beds can be 2010 Arbor Day project
- c. Question raised about using AV residents for contracting services as part of fundraising
- d. Is this project the priority or is the gateway project or flowering trees?
 - Gateway is much bigger project financially, even if limited to southeast corner
 - Start with small project to show credibility to raise money for larger project.

- b. Jim, Leslie, Pam (and others) will work on ideas discussed included:
 - hold an annual Beautification Campaign; naming rights to sell significant trees; walk/run; tree walk; parties; garden tours
