ORDINANCE NO. 2016-2

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE MANAGER TO  
DISPOSE OF CERTAIN VEHICLES

**WHEREAS**, from time to time the Village's vehicle fleet becomes outdated, inefficient, or unusable;

**WHEREAS**, the Village currently has a 2001 Dodge  $\frac{3}{4}$  ton Extended Cab Pick-up Truck, and a 2006 Ford  $\frac{3}{4}$  Crew Cab Pick-up Truck, that are well past their useful lives and have cost the Village more in repairs, maintenance, and downtime than is reasonable or efficient for normal operations;

**WHEREAS**, Council determines, based on the recommendation from staff, the two vehicles should be sold for a reasonable price on the market in order to facilitate the purchase of replacement vehicles;

**WHEREAS**, the Village has been quoted a trade-in value on the two vehicles of \$7,600 and \$16,600, respectively, by the Bob Ross Auto Group, from which the Village is purchasing the replacement vehicles;

**WHEREAS**, the Village finds and determines that the quoted trade-in values are fair and reasonable, and bring the best return to the Village;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE** Council of Amberley Village, State of Ohio, seven (7) members elected thereto concurring:

**SECTION 1:** The Village Manager is hereby authorized and directed to dispose of the 2001 Dodge  $\frac{3}{4}$  ton Extended Cab Pickup Truck, and the 2006 Ford  $\frac{3}{4}$  Crew Cab Pickup Truck, by trading them in to the Bob Ross Auto Group in connection with the Village's purchase of replacement vehicles, for trade-in values of at least \$7,600 and \$16,600, respectively.

**SECTION 2:** This authority is expressly intended to bypass the procedures set forth in Ohio statutes, including but not limited to Revised Code 721.15, for the disposition of personal property.

**SECTION 3:** This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare, and it shall have immediate force and effect. The reason for such emergency is to ensure that the Village is able to purchase replacement vehicles at a quoted price under the State Purchasing Contract in connection with the Village's trade-in of outdated vehicles at the quoted price, and such quoted prices are not likely to be available without immediate action.
