PARKS OPERATIONS:

Administration

Bates Park

This park is mowed on Thursdays by the parks crew. The park is cleaned and stocked every Monday by the parks crew. Pixie field is being extended to regulation play size to increase tournament play for AGSA and the City. A new A/C was installed in the concession stand.

Dickey Park

Major aesthetic improvements are underway as well. A faux dry river bed has been dug with a bridge installed. Landscaping selection is underway, and we are hopeful to have the project completed by spring.

On Friday the following places are mowed: Veteran's Park, Masterson Park, Micks Old Office; drainage ditch at Tinsley and all restrooms
