

ORDINANCE NO. 2008-O-2B

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE PLACEMENT OF STOP SIGNS IN THE ROSEWOOD SUBDIVISION; AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF ARCOLA/LOCUST STREETS AND CHENANGO/MRYTLE STREETS ALL WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ANGLETON; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF POLICE OR HIS DISIGNEE TO ERECT AND MAINTAIN SIGNS STATING SUCH REGULATIONS; PROVIDING A PENALTY OF NOT MORE THAN \$200.00 FOR EACH VIOLATION, OR THE MAXIMUM ALLOWED BY TEXAS LAW FOR TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING A SEVERANCE CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE EFFECTIVE AFTER ITS PASSAGE.

WHEREAS this Ordinance is authorized by relevant Texas statutes, including the Transportation Code and Texas vehicle laws; and either the residents or city officers or employees have requested that the City of Angleton, Texas, pass this Ordinance; and the City Council of the City of Angleton finds that this Ordinance will promote the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Angleton;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ANGLETON, TEXAS, DULY ASSEMBLED:

- I. The need for the placement of the following stop signs at the following locations has been established as necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Angleton:
  - a) On Jasmine Court where it intersects with Rosewood Drive;
  - b) On Wisteria Court where it intersects with Rosewood Drive;
  - c) On Rosewood Drive where it intersects with Downing Road;
  - d) Four way stop signs at the intersection of Arcola Street and Locust Street;
  - e) Four way stop signs at the intersection of Chenango and Myrtle Street.
- II. The placement of said stop signs and the enforcement of same by the appropriate law enforcement agencies is hereby determined and declared to be reasonable and safe.
- III. The Chief of Police of the City of Angleton (or his designee) is hereby directed to erect and maintain such signs as are necessary to effectuate and to notify the public of the new stop signs established in this Ordinance.
- III. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not more than \$200.00, or the maximum sum allowed by state law, whichever is greater, for each separate offense.

IV. If any section or part of this Ordinance is held unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, then such unconstitutionality, illegality, or invalidity of such section or part shall in no way affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining portion hereof, and such remaining portion shall remain in full force and effect.

V. This Ordinance shall be effective from and after its passage and adoption.
