

ORDINANCE NO. 2008-O-10A

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE PLACEMENT OF STOP SIGNS AT THE FOLLOWING LOCATIONS: DOWNING ROAD/STADIUM DRIVE, STADIUM DRIVE/CAMPUS DRIVE, CAMPUS DRIVE/FM 523, AND AT THE TWO CROSSOVERS ON CAMPUS DRIVE; ALL WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ANGLETON; DIRECTING THE CHIEF OF POLICE OR HIS DISIGNEE TO ERECT AND MAINTAIN SIGNS STATING SUCH REGULATIONS; PROVIDING A PENALTY OF NOT MORE THAN \$200.00 FOR EACH VIOLATION, OR THE MAXIMUM ALLOWED BY TEXAS LAW FOR TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING A SEVERANCE CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE EFFECTIVE AFTER ITS PASSAGE.

WHEREAS this Ordinance is authorized by relevant Texas statutes, including the Transportation Code and Texas vehicle laws; and either the residents or city officers or employees have requested that the City of Angleton, Texas, pass this Ordinance; and the City Council of the City of Angleton finds that this Ordinance will promote the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Angleton;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ANGLETON, TEXAS, DULY ASSEMBLED:

- I. The need for the placement of the following stop signs at the following locations has been established as necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Angleton:
  - a) On Campus Drive where it intersects with F.M. 523;
  - b) Three way stop signs at the intersection of Downing Road and Stadium Drive;
  - c) Three way stop signs at the intersection of Stadium Drive and Campus Drive;
  - d) Two way stop signs at the two crossovers at the entrance to the new AISD high school campus located on Campus Drive.
- II. The placement of said stop signs and the enforcement of same by the appropriate law enforcement agencies is hereby determined and declared to be reasonable, prudent and safe.
- III. The Chief of Police of the City of Angleton (or his designee) is hereby directed to erect and maintain such signs as are necessary to effectuate and to notify the public of the new stop signs established in this Ordinance.
- IV. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not more than \$200.00, or the maximum sum allowed by state law, whichever is greater, for each separate offense.

V. If any section or part of this Ordinance is held unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, then such unconstitutionality, illegality, or invalidity of such section or part shall in no way affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining portion hereof, and such remaining portion shall remain in full force and effect.

VI. This Ordinance shall be effective from and after its passage and adoption.
