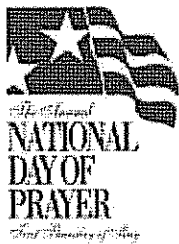

**"PRAYER...America's Hope!"
Millions will pray for America on May 7th, 2009**

Dear Mayor Henry and Angleton City Council:

Tens of thousands of prayer events are planned across the country on Thursday, May 7, 2009 to honor the 58th Annual National Day of Prayer. In churches, parks and on courthouse steps, citizens will be praying for our nation; government leaders, media, military, schools, churches, businesses and families.

The Brazoria County NDP Team will host a prayer event for the community on East Locust Street directly across from the south side of the Courthouse in Angleton. Free lunches for the first 250 participants will be served from 11:30 to 12:00. The ceremony will begin at noon and prayer groups will gather from 12:30 until 1:00 when the event will end.

This year's theme, "Prayer...America's Hope!" is based on Psalm 33:22, "May your unfailing love rest upon us, O Lord, even as we put our hope in you" The Lord hears and responds to His children's cry for help. He is our strength, refuge, and courage in both personal and national times of suffering, despair and loss.

National Day of Prayer Task Force Chairman Shirley Dobson said, "At this time of economic downturn, terrorist threats, and relentless assaults upon foundational biblical principles, it's heartening to reflect that we serve a God who has repeatedly shown Himself 'mighty to save' (Zephaniah 3:17) in

the lives of those who trust in Him.” Dobson continued, “Let’s not lose sight of the hope our Heavenly Father holds out to us. As we remain on our knees before Him, interceding on our behalf of our land, we can derive great comfort in knowing that He hears His people’s cries.”

About the National Day of Prayer:

Recognizing that prayer has been and continues to be an integral part of our nation’s history, Congress established the National Day of Prayer in 1952. This observance is currently held on the first Thursday each May, when all Americans are encouraged to exercise their religious freedom by gathering publicly to worship and pray for our land.
