Camp Crayon Registration will be held on Saturday, March 12th for Village Residents (Village residents have a 1 – 4 digit address and live inside the Village limits) from 9 – 11 a.m. in the classroom at the Parks Building at 806 Holbek Dr. Antioch Township residents can register on the same day from 11 a.m. – noon (Township residents will have a 5 digit address and have a 60002 zip code). You must be on the premises to be in line. If openings are still available, Non-Residents can register on Monday, March 21st at 9:00 a.m. at the Parks Office. 2011/12 classes will begin the week of September 12th, 2011 and go through mid-May. Payment sessions are every 6 weeks with the first payment due on the first day of school. **A \$50 non-refundable registration fee will be due at registration** as well as a birth certificate and proof of residency. **New for this year each person will only be able to register 1 family.** There are two classes available for 3 year olds, either Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday. Children must be 3 by September 1, 2011 to register. The 4 year old classes are as follows: Monday/Wednesday/Friday a.m. class from 9 – 11:30 a.m. or M/W/F p.m. class from 12:30 – 3 p.m. or Tuesday/Thursday class from 9:00 – 11:30 a.m. Children must be 4 by September 1, 2011 to register. There are 20 children per class. If you have any questions regarding Camp Crayon, please call the Parks Office at 847-838-4330 or 847-395-2160. A detailed brochure concerning this program is available upon request.

DRIVERS AND PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS

The Illinois Vehicle Code 625 ILCS 5/11-1002, states Pedestrians right of way at cross walks. It is the responsibility of the driver to slow or stop to pedestrians in or partially into the roadway or so closely from the opposite half of the roadway as to be a danger. No pedestrian shall suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a moving vehicle to constitute an immediate hazard. Whenever stop signs or flashing red signals are in place at an intersection or plainly marked crosswalk between intersections, driver shall yield the right of way to the pedestrian.

SNOW REMOVAL ORDINANCE

• Persons Required to Remove Snow. The owners, occupants, or lessees of lots which abut a public sidewalk are required to clear snow after two inches has accumulated. Additionally, the owner is required to clear off accumulations of ice, sleet, or freezing rain. The responsible person is required to maintain the sidewalk in a reasonably clear condition.

• Area required to be cleared. The responsible person is required to clear the lesser of 72 inches or the full width of the sidewalk. Additionally, owners most closely abutting sidewalk ramps are required to clear the ramps.

• Timing. Clearance should occur within 24 hours after the cessation of an event that deposits at least two inches of snow.

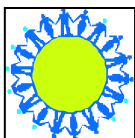
THE FIRE DEPT NEEDS YOUR HELP!

The Fire department wants to remind everyone that Snow-covered fire hydrants, blocked access routes, and covered address markings will slow down not only the department's response, but also our ability to provide the necessary emergency service. There is something that you can do to help.

Everyone in the community, residents, business owners, and snow removal crews can assist the Fire Department by clearing away the fire hydrants, and keeping an area approx. four feet around the hydrant clear. Furthermore, when possible, keep the sidewalks, driveways, and entrances to a business or residence clear. The snow removal companies can help by making sure they are not placing the plowed snow in any of the above-mentioned area, which would create the hazards we are trying to avoid. Last year due to many snowstorms combined with little or no snow melting we had a situation where the snow on the ground has passed the height of a hydrant.

In this situation, the clearing of hydrants becomes crucial; and by taking the extra effort, we may all be preventing a tragedy.

The fire department wants to remind everyone that shoveling snow can be a very labor-intensive process, and anyone who may doubt his or her physical condition should take it slow and get someone to help you. 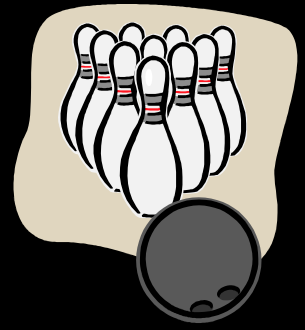
