Okay. Can we turn to the Fire Chief's Report

MR. RUSSELMAN: Good evening. My name's Bob Russelman. I'm Assistant Chief at the Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company.

Before I give you the Incident Report for the month, I just want to talk about fireplace safety. Even though the groundhog did say we're going to get an early spring, it's still a little cold out. So we're going to just remind you to keep a few things in mind if you're going to use your fireplace.

Always cover your fireplace with the screen. It's very important to keep embers coming out and potentially catching the furniture or other things in the room on fire.

It's always important to make sure that there's a good, safe distance between your fireplace and other contents in your room. So, we like to say at lease 5 to 10 feet away. But it could be more than that, depending on how big the fire is you're making in your -- in your residence.

Never leave your fireplace unattended. If you do have to leave the room and you have a small child with you, make sure you take that child with you.

Always make sure you have a smoke detector and carbon monoxide detector. Check your batteries monthly in those. And always replace your batteries once a year. And, if possible, keep a fire extinguisher on hand at all times.

So with that, that's the fireplace safety reminder.

Now for the Incident Report for

January of 2020. We had a total number of 45

incidents. One Dumpster fire, three smoke
investigations, four gas leaks, one vehicle
accident cleanup, one chemical leak, one
downed power line, five good intent calls,
four CO alarms, and 25 fire alarms.

So, luckily, none of those were major incident. So keep being safe and keep practicing good fire safety.

The second thing I wanted to mention was the Blueprint Bethel Park. This Friday, February 14, Valentine's Day is the deadline to submit comments to Blueprint Bethel Park. That's their Municipality's long-range plan.

This plan is an official document based on public input, and will drive our land use. And we'll use that for the development and budget decisions for the years to come.

The draft's available online at Blueprintbethelpark.com, where readers can look it over, and they can send in their comments, suggestions.

And, additionally, there's comments
-- or copies are available for review at the
library, and also the Community Center.

So Council will consider all the comments that come in, and that way we'll move Bethel Park forward in the next 10 years.

And speaking of moving Bethel Park forward, we had a press release today. The

Allegheny Land Trust will permanently protect
the 40.5 acres of green space in Bethel Park
by the end of March, by the end of next month.

So Council will be voting tonight to approve a grant to the Allegheny County -- or Allegheny Land Trust to fulfill our portion of the agreement. And this will complete the necessary funding of the project.

There also be a public meet, greet and plan event. And that will be held at Cool Springs on March -- March 11 between 6:00 and 8:00.

So everyone's invited to come to that event to learn more about the land, about Allegheny Land Trust, and about the immediate plans for the new green space.

So this is a rare slice of green space that's in a densely populated area, and already has some trails through it. So it's a great project that Council worked on with Allegheny Land Trust. And we're looking forward to moving that project forward.

And that's all I have.
