(Commencing at approximately 7:30 p.m.)

PRESIDENT MOURY: Okay. I'd like to get started. I would like to call to order the Regular Council Meeting of May 11, 2020. We are doing this remote.

Mr. Christian, would you please call the roll. Mr. Christian, go ahead.

MR. CHRISTIAN: Dr. Campbell?

MR. CAMPBELL: Here.

MR. CHRISTIAN: Mr. Cenci?

MR. CENCI: Here.

MR. CHRISTIAN: Mr. Consolmagno?

MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Here.

MR. CHRISTIAN: Ms. Gibbons?

MS. GIBBONS: Here.

MR. CHRISTIAN: Mr. Hannan?

MR. HANNAN: Present.

MR. CHRISTIAN: Mr. Harrison?

MR. HARRISON: Present.

MR. CHRISTIAN: Mr. McLean?

MR. McLEAN: Here.

MR. CHRISTIAN: Mr. Moury?

1 PRESIDENT MOURY: Here.

2 MR. CHRISTIAN: Mr. O'Brien?

3 MR. O'BRIEN: Present.

4 PRESIDENT MOURY: We have nine members of
5 Council that are present this evening.

6 We have no Chair Announcements.

7 I would like to at this time return to the
8 Reports of Officials; and the Library Director's report.

9 MS. McINTOSH: Good evening. My name's
10 Christine. I'm the Director of your public library,
11 where we provide services to inform, inspire, and enrich
12 the community.

13 As announced last Friday, Governor Wolf has
14 moved Allegheny County to the yellow phase of the
15 COVID-19 plan beginning Friday, May 15 for libraries in
16 Allegheny County. In-person services are not permitted
17 until the County is moved into the green phase.

18 During this yellow phase the library will be
19 acquiring appropriate protective -- personal protective
20 equipment. We're having Plexiglas shields installed at
21 all service points, as well as acquiring masks and
22 gloves for staff.

23 In addition, staff will be reconfiguring
24 some furniture and moving some computers around to

1 comply with social distancing recommendations.

2 At this time, please keep your library
3 materials at home. We're not yet equipped to
4 accommodate returned items. Late fees are not charged
5 when the library is closed. If you do have need for a
6 reference or research assistance, you can visit
7 Powerlibrary.org to chat with a librarian.

8 Summer reading for adults and summer
9 learning programs for youth will begin as virtual
10 programs this summer. And we'll transition to in-person
11 programs and events when permitted and appropriate.
12 Virtual programs for youth are currently being hosted on
13 the library's Facebook page. And opportunities for
14 adults are posted there as well when they become
15 available.

16 The staff and I miss everyone very much. We
17 understand the frustration of not being permitted to
18 visit the library and borrow materials or to attend
19 programs. However, just -- just keep -- keep at it.
20 And whenever we get clearance from the Governor and
21 Allegheny County moves to a 'green phase, we will be back
22 with you. So be patient, and we'll see you soon.

23 PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you very much.

24 MS. McINTOSH: Thank you.

1 PRESIDENT MOURY: Are there any other
2 questions from Council?

3 (No response.)

4 PRESIDENT MOURY: Hearing none, can we turn
5 to the Police Chief's report; and Chief O'Connor.

6 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Affirmative.

7 The Police Department, we have been busy.
8 Business is good. We have been making arrests of the
9 calls we've been going to; prowler calls at night, drug
10 calls, domestic violence calls, site calls, and
11 disturbances by disorderly people.

12 Under difficult circumstances, the officers
13 have been performing very well. And I'm very pleased
14 with their -- with their efforts.

15 PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you very much,
16 Chief.

17 Is there any discussion from Council?

18 (No response.)

19 PRESIDENT MOURY: Hearing none, can we turn
20 to the Fire Chief's Report; and Chief Dave Gerber.

21 MR. GERBER: Hi there. For the month of
22 April the Fire Department ran 30 fire calls. We ran two
23 structure fires, one vehicle fire, one Dumpster fire,
24 one brush fire, two gas leaks, one set of wires down, 14

1 fire alarms, two CO alarms, five good intent calls, and
2 one smoke investigation.

3 At this point, the Fire Department, we're
4 still closed up except for emergency -- emergency calls.
5 Anything that -- all of our outreach programs and all
6 are on hold at this point. Hopefully, once things get
7 back to going green, we can get back out into the
8 community for fire prevention details and all the other
9 stuff that we do.

10 At this point, other than that, we're still
11 staying safe. Like Chief O'Connor just said, those guys
12 are busy. We are not so busy. So we appreciate
13 everybody's effort into staying safe during this whole
14 thing at Bethel Park. We've been very good.

15 We've had a bunch of fires, but they've
16 actually all been out of town, so... The residents here
17 in Bethel Park are doing fantastic as far as fire
18 prevention on their own right now, so...

19 Other than that, that's all we have. We're
20 staying safe and plugging along here.

21 PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you very much,
22 Chief.

23 Is there any questions from Council?

24 (No response.)

1 PRESIDENT MOURY: Hearing none, can we turn
2 the Mayor's report; and Mayor Allen.

3 MAYOR ALLEN: Thank you, Mr. Moury.

4 I just have a few items this evening. The
5 first one is, as you know, last Sunday we had Bells
6 Across Pennsylvania. We publicized it quite a bit. And
7 we got a lot of good feedback from it. A lot of people
8 were out there. So I want to thank all the residents
9 that participated in that.

10 The second thing that I have is a
11 proclamation. It's a proclamation for COVID-19, Health
12 Recognition Week, May 11th to the 17th. Whereas, the
13 spread of COVID-19 is a global pandemic affecting life,
14 health and safety of the Municipality of Bethel Park and
15 the residents, and, whereas, the residents, businesses,
16 educational, religious, and other establishments in the
17 Municipality of Bethel Park are striving to comply with
18 the guidance provided by the Pennsylvania Department of
19 Health in the face of this public health crisis, and
20 even their compliance presents obstacles and challenges
21 for financial, physical, emotional, mental, and
22 spiritual health, and, whereas, certain individuals and
23 organizations in the Municipality have shown exemplary
24 courage, persistence and fortitude in providing support

1 and assistance and others during this stay at home
2 period, even as viruses continue to spread, representing
3 a risk to them, their own health and wellness to their
4 immediate family.

5 So, therefore, I, Jack Allen, the Mayor of
6 Bethel Park hereby proclaim of week of May 11th to the
7 17th, 2020 as Health Recognition Week in the
8 Municipality of Bethel Park, and further encourages
9 individuals to reflect and find some way, large or
10 small, to acknowledge and recognize the people for the
11 health in the community.

12 The second thing I wanted to do is recognize
13 one of our residents, and that's Rodney Ambrogi from
14 Al's Cafe. Rodney and his group, and there's quite a
15 few in his group, they furnished 800 free meals to the
16 Bethel Park community with the help of the Blackhawk
17 Relief Fund and the Assembly of God Church. And he did
18 such a great job, I'm going to (inaudible) a certificate
19 of recognition for what they all did.

20 I wanted to mention also, we're getting a
21 lot of calls for primary election day. It's scheduled
22 for Tuesday, June 2. If you're planning to vote by
23 mail, the county election office must receive your
24 application by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 26. The

1 deadline to return your completed mail-in ballot is
2 8:00 p.m. on June 2nd.

3 So if you want more information about that,
4 visit our website at Bethelpark.net, or you can call the
5 Allegheny County Board of Elections at 412-350-4500.

6 I also wanted to mention that the Municipal
7 Building is now open to the public. The Municipality is
8 operating at full capacity. And they're actively
9 accepting building and other permits, dye test, and all
10 other function.

11 And, lastly, we still have our food drive
12 going on. The last couple weeks, it's dropped off a
13 lot. But if people still have food to help our
14 residents, you can drop the food off at the Community
15 Center Monday through Friday, 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
16 And you can continue to support your residents -- or,
17 our residents, but your neighbors.

18 And that's my report, Mr. President.

19 PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you very much, Mayor
20 Allen.

1 thinning out the deer heard on Ridgeway Drive? Thank
2 you."

3 The second comes from Celeste Pollock
4 (phonetic). And I quote, "On Thursday afternoon, when I
5 went out shopping for groceries, I noticed a few
6 businesses opened in Bethel Park ahead of the yellow
7 phase reopening schedule set by our Governor. One was a
8 bar with an almost full parking lot and a customer
9 entering without a mask. Another was a bakery with a
10 packed parking lot. Is this legal? Are enforcement
11 officers noting this and giving appropriate fines? I
12 hope that our local officials are enforcing proper
13 measures to ensure our safety, which will enable us to
14 all get back to business sooner. Thank you for sharing
15 this in your meeting this evening."

16 PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you, Mr. Christian.

17 At this time, could we turn to General
18 Policy and Finance; and Mr. McLean.

19 MR. McLEAN: Thank you, Mr. President.

20 The first item on the agenda under General

15 the Governor signed into law what's become known as Act
16 15, which was the legislature's response to the COVID
17 pandemic, it included a provision that allows
18 municipalities to extend the date that real estate taxes
19 can be paid without any penalty or fees being incurred
20 until the end of the year.

21 We typically charge penalties for real
22 estate taxes that are not paid by November 1st. By
23 adopting this resolution, we will provide that for real
24 estate taxes only -- for 2020 only. We will not collect

1 any interest or penalties on -- on payments provided or
2 made by the end of the year.

3 So this is an opportunity to give folks some
4 relief if they find that they can't make their taxes or
5 their tax payments until the end of the year, we're
6 permitted by the legislature to do that. And so we're
7 going to do that by adopting this resolution.

8 PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you, Mr. McLean.


