General Announcements

- 7/4: Officers arrested Corey Needham, 30, after reportedly trying to enter a resident's parked vehicle and then resisting arrest when officers tried to detain him.
- 7/5: The BPPD took 7 reports of thefts from vehicles in the Coverdale area, including one vehicle which was stolen. The vehicle was recovered in the City of Pittsburgh, and investigation revealed that juveniles had come to BP in a separate stolen vehicle, taken items from resident's cars then stole the second vehicle with the keys inside. The investigation is on-going. Please lock your vehicles at all times and remove valuables from inside.
- 7/19: Michael Kelly, 29, of Pittsburgh was arrested for trespass and loitering & prowling at nighttime after entering a residents enclosed sunroom after being given notice to stay off the property.
- 7/21: Ashlie Pusateri, 22, of Mt. Lebanon, was arrested for Possession of Controlled Substances and Possession With Intent to Deliver after Detectives responded to a resident's tip of possible drug sales.
- 7/25: David Bianco, 32, and Ashley Hammill, 31, of Bethel Park were arrested and charged with Endangering Welfare of Children, Recklessly Endangering Another Person, and Drug Law Violations. EMS had responded to the house twice in July for their 1-year-old son choking and unresponsive. Medical personnel became suspicious and additional testing showed illicit narcotics in the child's system. The investigation is on-going.
- 7/28: BPPD responded to a suspected drug overdose death for a 50 year old male. Incident under investigation.
- Law Enforcement continues to receive reports of fraud and mail theft, surrounding stimulus payments from the Treasury Department. If you received an unemployment payment that you did not apply for, please contact the Treasury Dept. as your personal info may be being used for fraudulent payments.
