This is the best part of my evening right here; I get to tell you all the wonderful things going on in Bethel Park. So without further ado, just a little, couple highlights here we got going on.

On Thanksgiving Day, we hosted our Third Annual Turkey Trot. It was very well attended and a very successful event with over 320 participates out there on the Montour Trail. Incredible event. We're going to keep that going for the foreseeable future.

The winter edition of the Bethel

On December 1, we held our Annual

Light-Up Night at the Community Center. This event drew a fantastic crowd of approximately 250 residents. Refreshments of hot chocolate, pre-bagged cookies were provided. We had to change it up a little bit for COVID. So that was to accommodate those additional safety requirements.

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As you may have known, recently we conducted our communication survey to determine how our residents get information from the Municipality. Those surveys were given in person, at the Community Center, the Farmers Market, and Community Day, and online through our website, and on Facebook.

For those who took the survey, thank you for your input. And this data will help us better communicate with all of our residents.

We want to throw out some congratulations to Eric Sprowls, host of Dead and Buried Treasures and many of the programs on our very own BPTV. Eric was recognized by horrorhost.net and received the Golden Turkey Award for the best horror-hosted program in the country. We appreciate all of

We have some park updates coming on.

Over the past month we have wrapped up

Millennium Park playground construction. We

are awaiting the playground boards. And once

they're delivered and installed, the mulch

will be delivered and blown in, and Millennium

Park playground will be complete.

working to get that shade structure installed

as soon as possible. This will be a great

addition for next year's Spring Ball. And

the much-anticipated Gaga Pit has been

installed at Oak Tree Park, and has already

generated a lot of interest by the

neighborhood kids.

I know my kids were already there, and they already had a game going on. So it was fantastic.

And with the arrival of the cold weather, we want to send out our reminder that all our parks have been closed for the year, with a few exceptions:

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At this time, I would like to turn to Bob McCormick. If you would like to come up and state your name for the record to talk about the Coverdale Preservation Building Project.

My name is Robert McCormick. And currently I live at 2856 Cherry Street, up until January. I have been a Coverdale resident for most of my life. And I am also the curator of the Coverdale Exhibit.

But before I begin, I would like to
thank -- go back a little bit in time here and
thank everybody that was involved in the
Miners Park renovations. It is really
beautiful. The park project, along with
Coverdale's 100th Anniversary was a huge
success.

I also wanted to thank the Historical Society for their kindness and support at the

Coverdale 100 Anniversary.

And last, I'd like to thank Joe
Consolmagno for always being there for Ward 1.
We appreciate you.

In January of 2015, I spoke in front of the Bethel Park Council about transforming a vacant house located at 2853 Cherry Street into a showcase for Coverdale. Although this was supported by Council and the Bethel School District, the project ran into more and more obstacles, and in the end it just didn't work out at all. But as the good book teaches us, when the time is right, the Lord will make it happen.

while going through Coverdale stories in 2017, it was realized that the 100th Anniversary was coming up. Pastor Lee Walls at Bethel Baptist Church was approached with an idea of having a Coverdale Exhibit with my many decades of Coverdale memorabilia in front of the church. With no hesitation at all he agreed and the Coverdale Exhibit was born.

But from this point everything is really a blur. It took off like a rocket. And it was amazing to see the interest in

this. So many people wanted to share their stories and display their Coverdale items.

As time went on, it was very evident that the Coverdale Exhibit needed a permanent home. So with that, the Coal Town Preserve was created. 101 years of Coverdale artifacts will be displayed at a Coverdale company house located where I will be moving from, 2856 Cherry Street.

In 2015, this was a possibility.

Today, this is a reality. The house is secured, paid for, and we will be moving items into the house starting in January in hopes that people can visit this August. We'll try.

To give you a quick glimpse into what we're doing and what we're trying to do, the Preserve will have rooms with different aspects of a coal town and a coal town's evolution.

Some of the things you'll see, of course, is coal mine artifacts, homemade -- early homemade toys -- we have a collection of early homemade toys -- cooking and local recipes, coal heating and cooking stoves, replicas of handmade hay and horse hair

mattresses that many had to use in the early years of the neighborhood, furniture from Coverdale from 1920 all the way through the '70s, sports in Coverdale with a section for NBA star Armon Gilliam and his family.

It is interesting that this same house that we're talking about is the childhood home of Armon Gilliam. And, of course, my favorite, a deep dive into the homemade wine and moonshine in Coverdale.

For the kids, a miniature coal-picking table is being created in the likeness of the one at the Coverdale tipple. The table will have different types of coal in it so children can pick through and identify the difference.

Also, a small train set with company home models that are identical to the Coverdale houses and train cars in an attempt to mimic a coal town will be on display. And last but not least, a part of the house will be dedicated to Coverdale faith.

My goal is that everyone will identify with something in that house. The Coal Town Preserve has gone further than a

house on Cherry Street. An application has been submitted to the Pittsburgh History and Landmark Foundation for Coverdale to be recognized as a historical neighborhood. We appreciate their consideration, and hopefully will hear from them this summer.

Lastly and quickly, as a part of the Coal Town Preserve, I would like to have a conversation with Council, Joe, Laurence, or whoever is interested about permission and the process of possibly having trees planted with tree markers on the unused flats between lower Miners Park and the upper field identifying their characteristics.

This is a project a lot of residents of Coverdale are very interested in. And it would teach children about their environment.

On a side note, it would go along with the tree street names of Coverdale.

As you can see, there's much work to do. But I hope this is the -- this is a community project that doesn't have an end.

The topic that I'm going to speak about is my son's property at 988 Fairview Drive and the flooding that occurred on September 1st of this year.

I'm speaking because I did most of the research. Tom's the one handing out handouts.

Tom purchased the house in January.

And he, my wife, and I have renovated the house during the spring and summer months.

Tom was ready to move in over the Labor Day weekend, but the remnants of Hurricane Ida caused a flood that resulted in 4-plus inches of water in his basement.

An investigation of the causes of the flooding brings us to the handout that you have in front of you now.

The first page is -- it contains both a top view and a side view of the property and the stormwater drainage system.

The second page is the perfect storm outline, which I will discuss shortly.

And the third page is a timeline of the events that you can read at your leisure. Please pay particular attention to the September 23rd item.

What we have here is what we call in the engineering profession a perfect storm. The old street drain is 18 inches below the current street drain, which causes the drains to actually act in reverse when the current street drain is overwhelmed by water. And this occurs during heavy rain events.

The old street drain is in serious state of disrepair. The connecting pipe between the old drain and the current drain actually slopes backwards towards the old drain.

The connecting pipe between the old drain and the current drain is only 12 inches in diameter. And the connecting pipe between the current drain and wherever it leads to is only 12 inches in diameter.

Both sides of the street at 988

Fairview Drive slope towards Tom's house.

There is no crown to the street. The elevation of the street has been raised by approximately 18 inches over the years, which now prevents the water from draining into the creek that's across the street from his property.

But the house at 988 Fairview Drive now sits in the bottom of an hole because the street elevation has been raised beyond the height that would allow natural flow stormwater runoff to empty into the creek across the street.

All these factors have come together

And while we're hiring them tonight, there's a couple more steps. There's a psychological evaluation. There's a physical they need to take, and also a drug screening. So this is the intent to hire. But there's three more steps in the process before they can come into the Bethel Park Police Department.

And then they'll go through up to three months of training or longer, if needed. So we do have a training process and education process.

And I will say the list of candidates that we interviewed on Saturday from top to bottom was probably one of the best lists that I've worked with. We had a lot of great candidates. So all these efforts, of course, you know, are paramount is protecting life and property. And I consider accepting this property, certainly, a win-win. And I'm most happy to support it.
