     Incident Report for July of 2021.
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               For the month, we had 61 total
19
     incidents. It was a rather busy month for us.
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     We do not like busy months. We would rather
21
     have it be slow, but...

               We had seven building fires, fire
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     other fires, one vehicle fire, two motor
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     vehicle accidents, one elevator rescue, six
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     gas leaks, six electrical conditions, two
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water main breaks, seven where we assessed the police and had good intent calls, two smoke investigations, 20 fire and CO alarms, and two weather condition alarms.

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As Chief O'Connor said, it is back to school month. Back to school is coming very soon. The United States Fire Administration has a great website. It's usfa.fema.gov, where they have some great materials -- where they have some great materials, where you can learn about how to help your kids understand what to do if there's a fire at a school.

And especially what I like to do is, my kids are getting older, they're starting to get ready for college. If you have college students, you know, a lot of accidents happen when they live outside of the dorms and they have their own apartment buildings, so there's materials out there as well.

All right. Can everybody still hear me? Is that better? Okay.

So with that, we recommend that you go to that website just to get some more materials on back to school education for fire safety.

The other thing is, October is -there is fire -- National Fire Week in
October. And this year's topic is Learn the
Sounds of Fire Safety.

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So some things around that is:

Respond immediately to smoke and CO alarms sounding by exiting the home. If your alarm begins to chirp, it may mean the batteries needs replaced or the alarm needs replaced altogether.

We get this a lot. If you're not sure, call the police desk, call dispatch, we'll come out and check it and let you know to make sure everything's safe in your structure or in your house.

Test all smoke and CO alarms on a monthly basis, install a bed shaker and strobe light alarms if someone in your household is deaf or hard of hearing, know the difference between the sound of smoke alarms and CO alarms.

Obviously, if there's an alarm going off in your house and you're not sure what it is, call -- call us right away. We'll come and check it out to make sure everything's

1 okay.

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That's all I have for the Chief's Report. Any questions?

I'm at 2019 Cool Springs Drive.

I would also like to speak about the bond release money for Rolling Lambert. I

request that you do not release the bond money for Rolling Lambert. And you should require them also, in addition to the work that they have already agreed to complete, that you ask them to replace our bad sections of sidewalk.

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I passed out some photographs to you to show some of those things. There was some water meter valves -- shutoff valves shown there.

There were nine water meter valves in our sidewalk either sticking up a certain amount or depressed down into the sidewalk a little bit. We have to cross the sidewalks to get into our driveways and garages. That's the way the plan was designed.

The sidewalk's cracking where the cars had gone over the sidewalk. Granted, a normal sidewalk is for pedestrian traffic.

One that's designed to take cars to go over it, which these are, should not crack under the normal use of an automobile.

Also, we have large amounts of spalling and scaling due, in my opinion, to improper installation; either too much air in the concrete mix, poor finishing, or possibly

being installed in bad weather.

The scaling and spalling is not due to rock salt. The older sections are four years old; they've got the scaling and spalling. The new sections are two and a half years old; they're clean as a whistle. So I think the original sections were poorly installed.

The management of the HOA was not handed over to the residents by Rolling

Lambert until about a year and nine months ago, almost a year after our warranty had expired. Which is different than your bond warranty.

So the HOA had no control over correcting these sidewalks until November 2019. Our only hope of having a bad installation corrected is if the municipality requires it as a condition of bond release.

The municipality has told me that the shutoff valve locations, while not the best, are not in violation of developmental approvals. Since the sidewalks are intended to be used by the general public, the developmental improvements should include the

safety of the pedestrians using the sidewalks.

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Studies of pedestrian falls have identified that small changes in elevations are particularly dangerous because of the low probability that pedestrians will reliably detect them. I think that Rolling Lambert should be required to move the shutoff water valves to make the sidewalk safer for pedestrian use.

When the sidewalks were formed, when the boards were put up before pouring the concrete, Rolling Lambert could see that the shutoff valves would be in the middle of the -- of the sidewalk. But they chose to proceed with the pouring of the sidewalks rather than correct their mistakes.

The shutoff valves for the remaining 13 homes have -- are located in the front yards, as they should be. There are two that I can't even locate. They may be under the sidewalks, where the other ones are sticking up.

Please continue to hold Rolling

Lambert's entire bond and require them to move

the shutoff valves and fix the sidewalks.
