     I'm finally here in person.
22
              My name's Christine. I'm the
2.3
     director of your public library, where we
24
     provide opportunities to explore, learn,
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create, and connect.

This is the time of year where I have to submit an annual report to the Office of Commonwealth Libraries in Harrisburg on the state of the Library's finances and activities.

2.3

So there's just a few things I wanted to share with you. One in three Bethel Park residents have an active library card. An average of 29 people visited the library per operating hours. That's almost 300 people per day. Not quite back to pre-pandemic levels, but we're getting there.

The average library cardholder checked out 27 items in 2021. And the library hosted 745 classes and programs last year, with an average attendance of 14 people per class. However, if you came to any of our Storytimes in the Park last summer, we had 80, 90, 100 people at some time -- at some of them.

It is tax season. The library does have tax forms, but we have a limited number. We have the PA-40 individual tax form and instructions and the 1040, 1040-SR

federal forms and instructions. We do not have any schedules this year. They're just not sending them. But we will be able to help you navigate the appropriate website and print them, if you need them.

The library is not a site for tax preparation. It hasn't been for the last two or three years now. And nearby sites have limited, if any, appointments available. The closest to us is the Bible Chapel in McMurray.

And I'm happy to announce that, finally, the Allegheny County Library's mobile app will be launching on March 29. The library mobile app is compatible with Apple iOS and Android.

You can download the app from your Play Store. You'll be searching for "Allegheny County Libraries." And then once you download the app, you can choose "Bethel Park Public Library" as your home library, and attach your library card to the app or you can search the catalogue place holds.

You will have a digital library card, so you don't have to show us your

1 library card every time. You just pull out
2 your phone.

You'll have the opportunity to sign up for our monthly e-newsletter. And the best part, it has a self-checkout feature. So if you don't want to talk to any of our lovely staff, you can check out your items on your own.

And we are adding a new type of item to our collection. We will be having mobile hotspots beginning March 21. We have ten mobile hotspots available for you to borrow for three weeks.

A hotspot is just an easy-to-use wireless access point that connects your wifi enabled devices to the internet. So, your tablet, your laptop, if you don't have a data plan with them, which I don't on mine.

Borrowing and using the hotspots are free with your library card. You have unlimited data for the duration of your loan period. And up to ten devices can be connected simultaneously. The more devices you have, the slower it runs, though.

And the hotspot will work anywhere in the United States. It's covered by the T-Mobile network.

We have a fundraiser coming up,

Party in the Park, on Saturday, April 23,

from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. at South Park

Theater. There will be hors d'oeuvres,

beer, wine, soft drinks. We have live music

from a string quartet.

There will be a short performance by the Children's Theater performers, many raffle baskets, a 50/50. There will be children's activities that will be led by the library's youth services staff.

The event will culminate with a ribbon cutting ceremony for the theater's new patio that was funded through a grant from the Bethel Park Community Foundation.

Tickets are \$40. Children 12 and under are free. Tickets are available at the library, at the South Park Theater, Evey Hardware or from the library's website. Proceeds benefit the library, South Park Theater, and the Bethel Park Community Foundation.

Anyways, our incidents for February of 2022: We had five structure fires, four gas leaks, one CO incident, two electrical conditions, 11 good intent calls, one assist police, three odors of smoke, 18 fire alarms, and one CO alarm, for 46 total incidents. It was a rather busy month for us.

One thing I would like to bring up is, while we've out and about in the community running our incidents, a few of our apartment complexes that we visited on incidents, we've noticed some things like doors open to stairwells, doors open to laundry rooms.

We ask, if you see that and you live in an apartment complex, please close those doors. Those are fire-rated doors. They're there for a purpose. They're supposed to be closed.

The main purpose of that is, if that door's closed and there's an incident

there, it actually slows the spread of the fire and the smoke in these facilities.

So we ask all residents who live in these multi- -- multi-person dwellings, please, if you see one that's there, close it. If it's not working properly, notify your building manager or maintenance so they can repair that. And if need be, call us if you're having issues with them and we'll get it to the right authorities.

So, it's a big safety concern for us. We noticed it over the past few months. So we just ask that people watch out for things like that.

And, finally, it is -- if everybody didn't notice, we sprung forward this past weekend. So we ask all residents as a reminder, change your batteries in your smoke and CO detectors. It's a good way to do it. When we fall back in the fall, we say the same thing; change them again.

And one other thing I'd like to say since spring is hopefully here soon, knock on wood, we ask people to do some spring cleaning. And one thing we do by that is,

We're not sure. But we will keep everybody apprised. At this point in time, our goal would be to get this done and open, hopefully, if all goes well, in the summer of 2023.

The second thing is, you hear a lot about this on the news about redistricting.

Bethel Park is also, based on the census data, required to do a redistricting.

What we did is to set up a subcommittee of Council. Dr. Campbell's chairing it with Mr. Consolmagno and Ms. Flinn will be the Council representatives, and the Chairs of both the

Bethel Park Democratic Committee and the Republican Committee will also participate.

And based on the preliminary numbers, there
may be two wards -- one or two wards that

The only parameters Council gave
