And now, because the Fentanyl is so potent, one dose isn't reviving people. We're using it twice. One guy, we had to use four times.

They cost \$100 apiece. We'll use it ten times if we have to, because you can't put a price on human life.

So, what we're going to do on Monday, May the 2nd, at our Crime Watch meeting at the Community Center, if you want to turn out, we are going to introduce the new detective who is going to be our drug task force coordinator, Detective Poling. You can meet him.

And I'm going to give a talk on the opioid crisis, the heroin, Fentanyl, how it is affecting Bethel Park, and how it is affecting beyond Bethel Park. I consider myself, unfortunately, somewhat of an expert in this

So, it is almost that time, the weather's finally breaking, the grilling season is getting close. One thing we like to remind residents is, never leave a lit grill unattended. It's very dangerous. We've see many fires start when a grill's unattended.

So, please, whenever you start grilling, make sure someone's near that grill at all times. And that's with any time you're cooking, whether it's inside the kitchen or outside.

Always use long-handled grilling utensils and heat-resistant oven mitts to avoid exposure to burns from heat and flames. The grill itself gets pretty hot, so treat it very carefully.

Periodically remove grease that builds up in traps or in the grill itself.

Obviously, not while it's hot; wait until it cools down. And keep a garden hose nearby connected and ready to use in case of a fire. And if you do have a fire, call the fire department. That's what we're here for.

- He's a former Shade Tree committee
 member. And also Tim Moury. So, we thank
 you.
 - The Shade Tree Commission was started in 2017. In 2019, we did our first tree planting event of 20 maple trees over at Neil Armstrong Middle School. This was provided by a generous donation from a resident of Bethel Park, in coordination with Bethel Park School

District used as an educational system tool to teach kids about trees and how to beautify their community.

In 2020, we contracted out the Davey
Tree Expert Company to perform a tree
inventory of the trees on municipal property
and the parks. This tool is greatly needed
for the Tree City USA program, but also gives
us a chance to know exactly what we have in
our parks and on our municipal property.

Through it, we were able to make -we were recognize trees that needed to be
maintained. And in the past year or so,
Public Works has been going through and
removing some of the ones that needed to be
removed.

So, in 2021, we joined forces with Tree Pittsburgh. Tree Pittsburgh is an organization from the city that helps communities in the Allegheny County, Western PA area, enhancing the community by encouraging tree-planting programs.

Their one program, One Tree Per Child, we were able to institute here in Bethel Park. There again, working with the

school district, we were able to get students
involved, and we planted over 400 trees
saplings not only at Neil Armstrong Middle
School, but also at Memorial Elementary, up at
Independence Middle School, and then also at
Millennium Park.

We will again be celebrating Arbor

Day this year on April 29, Friday. We

encourage residents to join us at 10:00 a.m.,

to come down and help us plant our next batch

of trees that we want to put in.

This is through a generous grant from the Bethel Park/Upper Saint Clair Breakfast Rotary; is that correct?
