               So here's our report for the month.
20
     For the month of August, we had five structure
21
     fires, one rail vehicle fire, one Dumpster
22
     fire -- a literal one, not a figurative one --
2.3
     a motor vehicle accident with injuries, one of
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monoxide incidents, two reports of power lines

those, we had five gas leaks, three carbon

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down, five good intent calls, two smoke investigations, we had 20 fire alarms, six carbon monoxide conditions, and one lightening strike, for a total of 52 calls for the month of August.

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So just as a reminder, we are 100 percent volunteer organization. And every one of those calls were responded to by community members here in Bethel Park, taken out of their own time.

Any and time we get a chance, we'd like to make an appeal to anybody that's interested in volunteering, you should really consider it. It seems like a young man's sport, but -- and woman's sport, but, truthfully, a lot of the most successful volunteers that we've had have been somewhere in their middle age. It's like a beneficial productive mid life crisis for some of us. So I'm certainly one of those folks.

So it is something that really does contribute a lot to your own well-being, sense of purpose. And if you don't volunteer in any capacity, certainly reach out. There's many wonderful opportunities in this great

community of Bethel Park to do so. But, of course, I'm partial to the Bethel Park

Volunteer Fire Company, so please consider that.

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A great opportunity to see what we're all about is if you come out to our Open House coming up on Sunday, October 2nd. It will be from 11:00 p.m. -- I'm sorry -- 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Of course, we always offer free hot dogs and drinks to anybody that attends. The fire trucks are there to take a look at.

Lots of equipment the kids would be interested in. We'll have demos. We'll have some of our crews do some demonstrations, some fire rescue or, you know, doing some ladder operations or engine ops.

We also have some of our wonderful vendors in-house there. Bethel Bakery will have some cookies. Evey's Hardware will have some home safety items on display. State Farm Insurance will also have some fire safety information to distribute.

And, also, come on out, of course, to see Sparky the Fire Dog and Pluggie the

Talking Fire Hydrant. You can't miss that.

Finally, we do have -- we did have our second donation letter. We do put out two mailings per year. If you didn't donate the first time around, we sent out a second plea.

And, of course, we're grateful for the wonderful relationship we have with the Municipality that puts a roof over our heads. We don't have to do fish fries or patch holes in the roof or anything like that.

Every minute of time that's donated as volunteers is spent responding to fires rather than just scrambling, trying to keep the lights on. So we're greatly appreciative of that.

But, essentially, anything in the firehouse that you turn upside down, we're responsible for. Anything that would fall out if you turn it upside down, I should say.

               We'll start off with the Strategic
25
     Plan.
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Next side, sir.

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What is the Strategic Plan? Well, simply put, the Strategic Plan at Bethel Park, which started in 2021 and now continues to 2022, it is the connected tissue between the Comprehensive Plan, Blueprint Bethel Park, and our own internal operating budget, and our capital improvements park budget -- or capital improvement budget.

It really truly defines -- you can see on the screen, it defines who we are, what we want, and how we're going to get there.

There's some things that we're going to look forward to in the coming months. And we'll talk about some things that are already complete.

Next slide, sir.

And, truly, here is what the Strategic Plan is. It encompasses several different things. Early on, when I got here, the Council went through a visioning process and allowed them to figure out where they want to go with the community, the Municipality.

And where they struck a nice balance between Blueprint Bethel Park and really --

and what you can see up here is the Vision

Statement of Council, the Municipality Mission

Statement, which was derived from the

Council's Mission Statement, and some values

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that we hold dear.

How do we get from point A to point B? And when you get to a crossroad, what drives your decision matrix? Those values right there (indicating).

And they mean a lot to me, because I reference them all the time. Simply put:

Trust, dependability, innovate, integrity, respect, efficiency, effectiveness. All things that mean something to me.

Next slide, sir.

These are what I call the buckets.

These are the big priorities for Bethel Park
as we've defined. And these were from the
feedback from Council.

We talk about our infrastructure.

We talk about our quality of life, our Bethel

Park identity, who we are as a community, how

we are represented, Economic vitality, and

Municipal excellence. All areas where it's

easy to identify key components.

We talk about our infrastructure, what we strive for and provide exceptional infrastructure systems that can meet current and future needs.

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Quality of life, the provision of capital improvements and public facilities.

We establish that connectivity with more safe and viable transportation alternatives.

The Bethel Park identity, cultivation of a sense of community through connections and civic pride.

That economic vitality, creating a strong and diverse local economy, cultivating redevelopment for healthy businesses and strong neighborhoods.

And municipal excellence, continued innovation of organizational operations alongside strong accountability, involvement and communication with residents.

Next slide, sir.

We'll start off with infrastructure. Here are just several capital improvement projects and, really, what the status are as we move forward. As you can see, we're still working on some of our weight limit studies.

We'll talk about the storm sewer,

CCTV. That right there, we intend to be

complete by the end of the year. And that is

a big project. We have not in recent years

done a lot of our CCTV of our storm sewer.

But this is a new initiative that
we're trying to do to really get an
understanding of our storm sewer and what
shape it is. So that's a wonderful thing that
we're trying to do right there.

If you notice the next one down is Thunderwood. That is a huge million dollar project that was just completed in Ward 9.

And we're in the last vestiges. We're going to get down there and we're going to make sure that terrain has good grass on it.

We're down there -- I was just down there with the director of engineering -- actually, Isis (phonetic) not too long ago.

So we're trying to see what's going on. And then we're going to make sure that that gets reseeded and finalized.

We talked about broadcast equipment, our own BPTV, Dave Cable and his wonderful team right there had some system upgrades this

past year that are already complete and already being utilized as we speak.

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We talk about our batteries for the data center. We just moved our full server room data center downstairs. We identified that there was a key component, the batteries that we needed to upgrade. And so we pushed off that one to this year. So we're bidding those out as we speak.

DQE fiber optic. Our own IT administer in the back there had wonderful success for DQE while she was at the county. Which, by the way, we stole her from the county to come work for us. But she had fantastic results in DQE. And they have brought nothing but wonderful success to us so far.

Our cloud migration project phase 2.

We as a municipal government have taken those steps to transition from what I would say a mostly antiquated system to -- not state-of-the-art, but we're pretty close to it. We transitioned to Microsoft Office Teams 365, SharePoint.

And we will continue to enhance our

system capabilities. And through the generous foresight of Council, we are in that process.

We are moving forward with that one. And because they understand the need to move this forward. And that was one of their key initiatives.

Next slide, sir.

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We talk about quality of life.

Here's the key components. If you notice the ADA transition plan on there. Right now, we have an architectural engineering firm going down assessing all municipal properties to provide an estimate for full ADA compliance.

If you're in a wheelchair, if you have limited capability, that's important.

And we identify that some of our own facilities are not fully compliant with that one. So we need to understand that one and be able to move forward with that one in the coming years.

The sidewalk study. Ongoing ward analysis after -- because Council adopted in 2022 the Sidewalk Program. In 2021, they adopted a Sidewalk Ordinance.

This right here is going to be a

1 joint effort to identify areas of collaboration between the Municipality and residents and businesses to make Bethel Park a 3 more walkable community. 4

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- Right now, the staff is providing key analysis of every ward, every sidewalk that has been -- that has been identified in Bethel Park and what that objective metrics status is. That right there will tell us where we need to focus our efforts ward by ward, street by street.
- We talked about Park Avenue Phase 1. This is an interesting concept, because we all have talked about the splash pad at one time. We're pretty close to being, hopefully, starting Phase 1 of this one pretty soon. Fingers crossed we'll get -- we'll make some more progress.

We talked about the pickleball courts right there. We did not get that grant. We were hoping on to get that grant. We didn't get it. So what that did is Council, in their wise decision, moved the money from '22 to '23, so we'll be able to move that project forward.

And we're -- again, as you'll see later on in the agenda, we're applying for another grant. So this is an ongoing effort that we will continue to do time and time again to make sure we are viable for future projects.

Next slide, sir.

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We talked about quality of life. We talked about Pine Tree Park. This is a project currently on track for fall/spring completion. We have a playground estimate ship date for October 13th. And then we'll finalize stormwater and path installation and other park upgrades set for spring 2023 completion.

This is just another initiative for Council to get into the neighborhoods, identify those parks that need some upgrades, engage with the residents, get that resident feedback, and that provides the type of quality of the playgrounds and components that will be renovated and upgraded.

This is, I believe, the sixth one
Mr. President? Fifth one or sixth one of the
parks that --

- 4 I think it was a fantastic success.
- 5 The first one was at Ward 1 with
- 6 Mr. Consolmagno. And I think that really kind
- 7 of set the bar and the standard as we move

- 9 One of the other things that we're
- 10 talking about is for the Strategic Plan,
- 11 Simmons Park Trail. This project currently is
- 12 the concept with key stakeholders.
- Right down over there we're going to
- 14 have Ms. Flinn, we're going to have
- Dr. Campbell, and a few other key components
- 16 down there walking the ground.
- 17 What is this particular piece of
- 18 terrain capable of? What is it -- what can we
- 19 do down there?
- 20 And so when you move from concept to
- 21 design, then you take that project from the
- 22 next stage. And that's where we want to be
- 23 | next year. Where do we want to go for Simmons
- 24 Park?
- 25 Peter Page stormwater. This is a

very large stormwater project over there. In believe this is on the border of Ward 8 and Ward 7. What this is going to do is it's going to hold back a lot of water for the downhill stream residents.

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This will really help a lot, I believe, and make sure that these large floods, these 50-year and these 100-year floods aren't going to impact our downwater neighbors.

This is designed permitting with DEP and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. And we have an estimated permit completion date of May of 2023. Once we do that one, we can move forward with the PENNVEST loan, and we can move forward for bidding and potentially construction.

So this -- there's a lot of great things that we are currently doing that we're also planning for the next iteration in 2023.

Next slide, sir.

A lot to read, gentlemen -- ladies and gentlemen. I'm just going to want to give this update. This is very important.

VICE PRESIDENT O'BRIEN: Take your

time. You're good.

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MR. CHRISTIAN: I want to talk about Brightwood and Highland intersection improvements. I think that most people have seen, if you travel down Brightwood, there is new signs, there is new pavement markings down there.

And I think this brings a lot more visibility and leaves a lot more understanding of what's -- what that particular intersection provides, and sometimes the dangers that it imposes. So I hope -- we're hoping that those visibility markings and upgrades help our residents stay safer in that area.

We got the engineer firms, the primary and the secondary, reviewing the data to look at a walking loop within the industrial loop. We need to be more pedestrian friendly. And this -- and connectivity is so important.

We talked about the Patterson and Irishtown and Logan in this plan. Initial concept plans are wrapping up. And this will ease the traffic burden in this very difficult intersection.

I think we can all agree this section

-- intersection needs some help. We've had

submitted multiple grants to help relieve this

cost burden to us.

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And finally, we'll wrap up with the next slide, sir, for the Strategic Plan update with municipal excellence.

And as you can all see, we've upgraded the building a lot. We have gotten away from the coax cable and the cat 4/cat 5 cable that has been in the building for at least two decades. And this is the last room, along with the one behind us, to get some upgrades.

So Council, in their vision, have noticed that the reverb and the sound here definitely doesn't quite meet for resident experience and understanding. So this is what we're going to try and look at next.

And so we'll present a lot of options to Council about getting this room a little more echo friendly and user friendly for our residents and for our community.

So, ladies and gentlemen, pending your questions or issues or comments, that's

1 | the Strategic Plan update.

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And I would like to move into the September Monthly Review, unless you have any questions.

VICE PRESIDENT O'BRIEN: It's all yours, Mr. Christian.

MR. CHRISTIAN: Thanks a lot, sir.

And this is our September Month In Review. It's really a month in review, but we're going to go all the way back to January and talk about a few things and kind of bring it forward. So, this won't take but a minute or two.

The next slide, sir.

So, truly, what was the month in review? And, like I said, we're going to start with a year-to-date review, and then each month we do Council -- this will be much smarter -- much smaller and much shorter. So I promise I won't be speaking this much in the coming months.

So we will cover various statistics,

results, and projects to give insight into
the work the Municipality does every single
day.

Next side, sir.

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So this is just some of the work that your small municipal staff does. And just in the small permitting section: 317 building, 16 outdoor activity, 16 demolition, we had 22 certificates of occupancy, and 144 zoning permits, year-to-date from January to September, totaling 515 permits.

That is a lot of work for just a staff of just a couple. And so what that does is it allows our residents to move forward with upgrading their homes, you know, demolition. There's a lot of things that's --certificate of occupancy, those are businesses moving into Bethel Park.

Let's talk about municipal budget used. To date, 54 percent of the general operating fund has been expended, totaling about \$17,651,000.00. Revenue collections are right at 59 percent. Overall revenue collection is about 13.8.

That's a little down from last year.

But if you think about it, most of our revenue from last year happens in the coming months.

So I think we're going to be right on target with that one. I'm very confident with that.

been expended, 11.5 million. We are to date -- that largest expenditure have occurred already because we've just paid our debt service for the sewage -- sewage bonds. So that's why that money looks a little bit -- or that percentage looks a little higher than the rest of them.

With the revenue collections, as you can see, the real estate make up the remaining 34 percent. And Act 511 Enabling Taxes make up 54 percent. Enabling Taxes consist of the earned income tax, local service tax, and sales tax.

And so that's where we're at for the year-to-date for the budget. More information to come for next month as we move forward.

Month end date, let's talk about street sweeper. I know we've all seen it out there. Look at the numbers on that screen right there. About 272 miles for each sweep

of the community. That is a huge, huge amount. And, on average, about 42 to 47 miles a day.

We've already swept the -- we swept the community four times just in this sweeping season. So that name right up there, Jeff Donaldson, he's out there every day 4:00 a.m. to 12:00. He's trying to clean everything up.

Because, one, that keeps us on multiple buckets. I would say excellence, vitality. It shows our sense of pride. But it also helps us stay clean, sustainability, environmental considerations. We have MS4 considerations with making sure that particular truck stays moving on our roads.

If you notice, there's a small, little project up there. The Public Works in concert with the Recreation Department upgraded those backboards at Simmons Field and painted it. That's our standard paint scheme right now; you see the blue and the gray.

All of the basketball courts across

Bethel will have that same color scheme. It

will show unification. It will show a unified

presence across all of our parks. It will

show our pride. It will show our sense of ownership for all of our parks.

And finally, here is where we land for the roads paved, 3.6 miles, 22 different road segments. As you can tell on the right-hand side of the screen there, you can see just the underdrain on the size of the roads, 600- -- over 690 feet installed.

A big one -- everybody seen one in Irishtown. That road is dry. And that was because of Council's decision to make sure those side drains get put in. And I think it was a well -- a decision very well done.

As you can see, the remaining 15-inch pipe, over 1,000 feet installed for those two separate contracts.

And the inlets, I mean, that's a combination of road contract, storm contract, and our very own Public Works team getting out there and getting after those inlets, repairing them, replacing them, and just really doing work on a daily basis.
