               MS. McINTOSH: Okay. Good evening,

     everyone. Christine here. I have three items
     I wanted to share with you that are happening
21

     at the Library.

               The first is our baby bags. So this
24
     is a partnership with the Jefferson Regional
```

Foundation and the Allegheny County Library

Association. We created baby bags that are available to new and expectant parents. The goal is to create awareness of public library services and to educate parents about the importance of reading to your child.

And each bag comes in a Bethel Park
Library tote bag, and includes a board book, a
shaker egg, baby flashcards, fist-size
crayons, and a scarf, as well as resources and
tips for the parents. And each of these items
correspond to the five early literacy areas of
talk, sing, read, play, write.

The second item is the Student
Library Card Initiative. The Library is
partnered with the Bethel Park School District
to improve access to educational and
recreational materials for the Student Library
Card Initiative.

So the main part of this is that every student in grade seven through 12 get a full access public library card. And library cards will be distributed through those buildings in mid-March.

Parents were given the opportunity to opt out for their child. And this is not in

competition with the school libraries. This is just a supplement so that students can come here after school hours and use our resources.

And there are 15 other public libraries in Allegheny County that are also participating in this initiative with their school districts in an effort to reduce barriers to public service in the county.

And then finally, the Allegheny

County Regional Asset District included in

their 2023 budget a one-time supplementary

county library support payment of 3 million

dollars. So the Bethel Park Library will

receive a little over \$85,000 of these funds.

And projects that we are working on are: Patron pickup lockers, so that you can pick up materials at any time at your convenience, 24-hours a day; self-check kiosk within the library, so if you're in a hurry or you just simply don't want to talk to us that day, you can check out your own materials.

And then we're working on hoping to be able to create an additional programming space within the library. So I'll keep you

Tonight, we are going to recognize our Merit Award winners -- Merit Award winners. And every year, the department officers and staff, they take a vote and who is deserving, who is the most deserving and hard working over the past year, and they

would pick three out. And of the three, we get a finalist who's the winner, and then we have a second and third place awards.

So first, before we get started calling people up, I would like to thank the Merit Award board, which consists of Council President Moury, our Mayor, Jack Allen, America's mayor, and Andy A, Andy Amrhein, Attorney Flynn, and Mr. Bailey from Brentwood Bank.

So I would like to thank them because they meet every year and we calculate the votes, and they do a lot of work behind the scenes.

And I would also like to thank people out in the community who contributed toward this event for the year. So thanks to all of them.

So without further -- oh, I want to call up Detective Sean Gorman.

(Applause.)

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Detective Gorman is our third place winner.

So why is he here? Because he is a hard-working detective. In fact, he -- he

- 1 wears many hats throughout the department.
- 2 He's my crime prevention detective. He also
- 3 runs our Facebook page, and serves as a
- 4 representative to the Bethel Park Community
- 5 Foundation.
- As the most important thing, though,
- 7 | is that he works cases. And this guy is a
- 8 modern-day Sherlock Holmes. He has personally
- 9 | solved many crimes, many difficult crimes that
- 10 have occurred. And I thank him for that.
- 11 And he puts in a lot of -- a lot of
- 12 | time and a lot of work. When our people have
- 13 technical questions and stuff, they go to him,
- 14 one of the detectives that they go to.
- So he is our third place award winner
- 16 for tonight.
- 17 And I thank you.
- 18 (Applause.)
- 19 CHIEF O'CONNOR: Where you going?
- 20 No, stay over there. We want to take a group
- 21 picture. You know, you're disrupting the form
- 22 of it.
- 23 PRESIDENT MOURY: He didn't recognize
- 24 you in your suit.
- 25 CHIEF O'CONNOR: A lot of people

1 | don't. I ought to start wearing it.

2 MR. O'BRIEN: I didn't, either.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Next, in second place, is Sergeant Sean McGrail. I'm going to call him up.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Sergeant McGrail is here. He is our daylight patrol sergeant. So he not only runs the shift, he does a lot of administrative tasks that the other sergeants on the other shifts don't get tasked with because the world's not open at midnight.

So he -- he works a lot on getting us our equipment, uniforms, taking care of our cars, and making sure that they are up to speed and running. And he has a thankless task, say, if somebody gets -- a prisoner gets sick in the car or worse, he gets it detailed and cleaned up the next day. How thankless of a job can that be?

But if we don't do these things, we don't get out on the road and serve you guys. So what he does behind the scenes is critical for us to be able to function.

So his peers have recognized him for

all of his hard work and all of his extra duties, and he is our second place winner.

(Applause.)

CHIEF O'CONNOR: All right. Finally, the Merit Award winner this year, Officer Craig Smeltz. Please come up.

(Applause.)

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Officer Craig Smeltz is a patrol officer. He works the a.m. shift. He's also a member of the SHACOG Cert Team. He goes in harm's way just about once a month.

So when he is here, he stepped up -as you know, we've hired a lot of new officers
over the past year. And he stepped up and
kind of been the point person for introducing
these new officers into the BPPD.

He's a field training officer. He's heavily involved in the field training program, which all of our people have successfully completed. And it's a lot of work. It's a lot of work. Again, it's behind the scenes.

He personally shepherds these people around and gets them out -- acclimated and out on the road with their field trainers. And

CHIEF O'CONNOR: Okay. On more serious matters, tonight Council will be voting on a contract -- a potential contract with Suburban Wildlife Management. These people would conduct an annual deer hunt in Bethel Park.

Why are we doing this? I would say we have increased -- substantial increased complaints from citizens about deer, the damage that they do to their property, accidents with cars, and also diseases that they bring.

I would say we've seen a significant increase in dead deer. Last year, 2022, our animal control picked up about 225 dead deer throughout Bethel Park. That's up 50 from about 175 in 2021. We're seeing a substantial increase in this. They're becoming a health hazard, a safety hazard.

And we do have an archery program that takes about 50 deer out of the community every year, which is not putting a dent in the

1 expanding population.

At this time, I would like to yield, if Dr. Campbell would want to make a few comments on the deer disease problem that we are experiencing.

DR. CAMPBELL: Sure. I'll be more than happy to, Chief.

You know, as Chief mentioned, we've had a substantial increase in the number of dead deer that are picked up -- dead, dying, diseased deer in Bethel Park. It's actually more than twice the number in any of our surrounding communities. Twice the number.

In fact, if you -- it's more than

Mt. Lebanon, Upper St. Clair, Dormont,

Whitehall, and Baldwin combined. Combined.

It's huge. And it's more than just -- those are just the reported cases. There's probably much more, many more than that.

They wreak havoc on our yards. They wreak havoc on our roads. And I personally know. I was on 79, I had a doe bolt in front of me going 55 miles an hour. I was anyway. The deer wasn't.

And when the deer hit the car, it

went over the hood, over the roof of the car.

If it would have come through the windshield

at that speed, my wife and I would have been

dead. I have no doubt about that. No doubt

about that.

So we know that there's a direct correlation between the deer density and the number of vehicle accidents that occur. But the problem really transcends. It really goes well, well, well beyond vehicular and yard damage.

PA has more confirmed cases of Lyme diease than any other state in the nation.

Any other state in the nation. And the data suggests that -- those are confirmed cases.

The data suggests that probably one out of ten diagnoses, we miss. Or, I'm sorry, nine out of ten diagnoses, we miss. So it's actually much, much higher.

Pennsylvania, in the last 10 years, has had 125,000 confirmed cases of Lyme disease. So it's been estimated that we have probably, really, on the order of 101.2 million true cases of Lyme diease over the last 10 years. 178 percent increase in the

- 1 last 10 years as well.
- 2 Late Lyme diease is a nasty disease.
- 3 It does horrible things to your brain. It
- 4 could cause cerebritis in the brain. It could
- 5 cause heart problems, all sorts of muscular
- 6 issues, rheumatological issues.
- 7 Do you want to hear something kind of
- 8 nasty, Chief?
- 9 There's a recent study that showed
- 10 that now 40 percent of all wild-caught ticks
- 11 have Lyme in them. And, you know, the
- 12 animals, the reservoirs, you know, we tend to
- 13 think about things like mice, chipmunks,
- 14 | squirrels. But, actually, deer are a
- 15 | significant reservoir of the Lyme virus as
- 16 well.
- 17 And this is the tip of the iceberg.
- 18 This is just the tip of the iceberg. There's
- 19 | a lot of other illnesses that most people
- 20 | haven't heard of; ehrlichiosis, or babesiosis,
- 21 or tularemia, Rocky Mountain spotted fever,
- 22 Powassan virus.
- These are all vectors that are caused
- 24 by ticks. And they're endemic. They're
- 25 endemic to Pennsylvania. We have many cases

of these. Not many, but a significant number of cases a year.

So there's a tremendous surge in the deer population, and it's had a significant impact on our community. I think it's more than annoyance, Chief. I think it's more of a public health concern.

And everybody I've talked to in the community -- everyone I've talked to in the community has mentioned that they deem it a problem. And if they gave the support that we could call (phonetic) these deer humanly, sustainably, and safely.

CHIEF O'CONNOR: I thank you for that.

And I want to assure the community that the group that we're going to use, they've got -- conducted several successful such hunts in neighboring communities safely. They have a track record.

And we'll see what happens when we go to the floor. But -- to the vote on the floor tonight. But that's just a brief update we wanted to let the community know.

having, it feels like spring. The ground hog apparently was wrong two weeks ago. Imagine that. We have some safety tips for what you're doing some spring cleaning. It will be here before we know it, which is a good thing.

For indoor spring cleaning fire safety tips, make sure you clean your gutters out from at your home, even after fall. You know, over winter, leaves billed up in there. Make sure you clean those out well.

Check all your smoke alarms, smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors. We recommend doing that once a month. Just use your test function. If you have any questions about how to do that, just call the fire department and someone will get back to you with that on how to check those.

Don't use electrical appliances or electric cords that are -- with frayed cords. And that's really a safety issue for not only the residents, but, also, it could be a fire hazard.

And, you know, it's a great time to clean your clothes dryer vent. We get a lot of -- about once a year we'll get a dryer fire

PRESIDENT MOURY: There's a motion by Mr. Oakes, second by Ms. Flinn that we award the Splash Pad Project general contract bid to Caliber Contracting Services in the amount of \$2,658,243 for the combined base bid; Alternate 1, Alternate 2, Alternate 3, Alternate 4, Alternate 6, Alternate 7, and Alternate 8.

I'll jump in here. This -- we've been working on the splash pad. It was initially identified in the long-range plan as an opportunity to grow the recreation for our community. We had been working on this project almost as long as the previous project at Peter J. Page Park.

But this is going to be located on the baseball field adjacent to the Schoolhouse Arts and History Center. We had to move fields around. We moved the soccer -- or, I guess, a field from Millennium to Village Green. We did a big rehabilitation of Village Green Park. We then moved the baseball field that was at Park Avenue, where this site of

this particular facility, the splash pad, we moved over to Millennium Park, which finally opened the door to do this.

2.3

It's been a long process. And we're going to be doing three additional -- four additional motions tonight. And just to give everybody a cost breakdown, the total cost is, roughly, going to be about 3.8 million dollars, which includes the splash pad.

We're also going to put a building at the edge of the parking lot. There's going to be bathrooms that are going to serve the football field, as well as additional bathrooms that will service the -- serve the splash pad. We're going to be redoing the parking lot. We're going to be putting in new lights. And as I mentioned, it's about 3.8 million.

State Representative Natalie Mihalek was able to get us some state grant funding for about 950,000. Over the last two years, we have received a little over 3 million dollars from the American Rescue Plan.

And we're going to be dedicating about 2 million of that dollars to the splash

```
pad in the Municipal Funds. And the money
we're going to take out of the General Fund is
going to be roughly $900,000.
```

So it took us a long time to get to this point. It's a little more than we anticipated. But, fortunately, with the grants we received from our State

Representative Natalie Mihalek and the American Rescue Funds, we're going to be able to do this project and fund it without going into any debt from the -- on the Municipality.

So stay tuned. I will tell you that our goal is to have it opened by Labor Day.

But based on construction availability,

there's a very good chance this will not open

until the spring of 2024. But we're going to

be signing the contracts in the near future,

and the construction is going to begin,

hopefully, within the next few months.
