the Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company. And

I'm going to get into the Incident Report for February 2023.

We had 24 incidents for the month;
two CO alarms, 13 fire alarms, three
electrical conditions, two elevator rescues,
and three structure fires.

So, luckily, it was a relatively quiet month for us. You think 24 incidents isn't that much. Which is good, we like it quiet, as the fire service would say.

If everybody didn't, please spring forward with your clocks. But, also, our favorite time of year is we like to remind everybody to change your batteries in your smoke detectors and CO detectors. It's a great reminder. We recommend you do it every six months.

Also, while you have your fire alarms and CO detectors down, there should be a manufacturer date on there. Most manufacturers recommend replacing those CO detectors and fire alarms every seven to ten years. So check that while you're changing your batteries.

Also, our Annual Report is out for

2022. It is available online at our website at Bethelparkvfc.com. If you go to that website and you look in the top right corner, you'll see a button that says "statistics" on it. Click on that and you'll be able to see our Annual Report for the last couple years and see some of the trends and some of the things we've been up to as far as our incidents goes.

Finally, the last thing I have is -well, you wouldn't think by the weather
today -- but spring is right around the
corner. If you're outside doing spring
cleaning, make sure you trim any trees or
bushes that are close to your home. We like
to keep all vegetation a safe distance from
your home, if possible.

Also, when you break out your grills, once it gets warm and we start grilling, check your gas grill for rust, worn parts, grease, and other debris before use. Make sure it's cleaned well. If you're going to start grilling, please move it 10 to 15 feet away from your home before you turn that grill on.
