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is Christine. I'm the Director of your Public

Library, where we provide opportunities to explore, learn, create, and connect.

Summer Learning for Children, as well as the Adult Summer Reading Club are in full swing. So stop by and register yourself and your child for a summer of learning, reading, and fun. And we also have prizes for everybody.

The Youth Services Department has many summer classes and events for all age groups of youth from birth up through 18. And they're filling up very quickly. So if you're interested in any of them, we ask that you register right away.

Tonight they were doing an adopt a pet class, where they had, oh, stuffed animal pets, and teaching you how to take care of them. And that filled so quickly, they're going to do another session on Thursday. But we can't do it for everyone. So if you're interested, please register.

Library's pick-up lockers have been installed. And they are functional. We're very excited. So if you place a hold on an item, you will see that in addition to it

saying "Bethel Park Library," you can choose 1 "Bethel Park Pick-Up Lockers" as a location.

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So if you can't make it to the Library during our 58 hours that we're open and you can come at midnight for whatever reason, all you do is scan your library card and the items that you have on hold will show on the screen, it will check out, the appropriate locker will pop open, and you take your items.

Our two new self-check kiosks have also been installed. They're slow going. But if you've ever used -- not slow going as in they don't work quickly. Just that people are still getting used to them. And not many people are using them yet. But we've only had them up for a week.

If you've used a self-checkout at Walmart or at any grocery store, it's just as simple. You scan your library card and you scan your items, and then you'll get a receipt. It's just another additional method of service that we're offering.

Please don't worry that any of our front desk workers are going to lose their

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jobs. They will not. It's just some people
don't want to talk to us or they don't want us
to see what they're checking out. So it's
just another method of delivering service to

Uselman. I'm the Assistant Chief with the
Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company. And I'm going to give you a rundown of incidents for

So, for the total month of May, we ran 46 incidents. We had one structure fire, one cooking accident, five motor vehicle accidents, one assist police with a missing person, four gas leaks, one hazmat leak, one faulty electrical equipment, one water condition, eleven good intent calls, one smoke investigation, eleven fire alarms, two CO alarms, and six brush fires.

So with the brush fires, obviously, it's been pretty dry except for today, and coming up these next few days. But we ask residents to be please careful when you're

discarding cigarette butts. Make sure you put them in the proper containers.

Also, if you do have an outside recreation fire, please use -- have a water source available to put out any stray embers that may come out of the fire pit or the container you're using.

And, also, we're coming up on one of my favorite holidays, the Fourth of July.

Please be careful when you're using fireworks.

We do not want to catch any of our neighbors' houses on fire, our own houses on fire, or start brush fires or anything like that.

So please use caution with those.

properties that are reassessed or properties
that applied to have their property
reassessed. It's going to be a new
established value.

Currently, in 2021, it was you're assessed -- they would set a price and your assessment was based on 81.1 percent of that assessed price.

They have ruled -- there's been a court case, and the -- I'll get this name real quick here -- the STEB, which is the State Tax Equalization Board, they're the ones that establish this rate.

They have ruled, based on their court case, that number is going from 81.1 in 2022 to 63.5 in 2023, and 54.1 in 2024.

So where you would pay 81.1 cents per dollar in 2022, now you're going to pay 63.5. And then in 2024, you're going to pay 54. A significant decline in what the rates are for these properties.

And how does it affect you, the

taxpayer? We're currently in litigation with South Hills Village. It's a major. Initially it was around 200 million dollars in assessed value. It's probably going to be reduced to 150 this year.

It's still in court. But that's what the preliminary settlement may be. And then instead of paying 81 percent of that, they're only going to pay 54- -- excuse me -- 63 percent.

So it's going to hurt us on the revenue side. It's something we need to continue to monitor. I know us and the District have budgeted for some of these rebates. But look for in future years, it's going to have an impact on our tax collection on property taxes.

The second thing is the garbage contract. We just bid it out with SHACOG.

The bids were due in last week. We had two bidders. We haven't got the results back yet.

But we estimated based on last year's numbers and bids. We can see it's between a 30 and a 50 percent increase. I hope not. But based on the bids that were out last year,

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we could see a substantial increase in our
garbage collection.
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As everybody knows, in Bethel Park for the residential, it's included in your property tax. So, hopefully, over the next few weeks we're going to get a better handle. The service may change slightly, depending.

But under full disclosure, we just wanted to be very transparent on everything that's going on with the contract. And we will keep you apprised when we get the winning bidder back and the tabulations.

And Mr. Espinar is a member -- is an employee. But he's a member of a 300-plus-member professional bargaining unit, and clearly excluded under the subclass provisions of the Ethics Act from any kind of a conflict of interest.

So they're both free to vote. And I appreciate the fact that they brought the issue to me so I could clarify that.

And I would ask that my opinion be a matter of record so it's clear they're relying on the legal opinion.
