Can we turn to the Fire Chief's Report.

MR. McGOUGH: Mr. Mayor, Council, residents. My name's Steve McGough. I'm the Lieutenant with the Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company. I'm here with our report for the month of July.

So, in the month of July, we had six building fires, one cooking accident, one vehicle fire, two brush fires, we assisted the EMS one time, we did have two gas leaks, two carbon monoxide incidents, seven electrical conditions, one vehicle accident, we assisted the police on one instance, we had five good intent calls, one smoke investigation, ten fire alarms, two carbon monoxide alarms, and two storm calls, for a total of 44 calls for the month of July.

Our Open House, which always coincides with Fire Prevention Week, is going to be on Sunday, October 8th, from 12:00 to 3:00. We'll have lots of activities. Bring the kids out. Bring the whole family out. Come take a look at our fire station and get

an idea of what the 100 percent volunteer fire company does for the community.

This -- this month's -- or this year's Fire Prevention Week will be focusing on cooking safety. Just a few tips: If you're ever frying, boiling, grilling, or doing anything with food and heat, just make sure you stay with the food as it's being cooked. Keep all combustible materials away from the stove, obviously.

And just to continue to harp on this very important point. Please be safe with the kids going back to school. Just to add on something a little bit different. Leave a little bit earlier. There's going to be more traffic. Add a little more of that patience.

And I'm the father of a young driver.

Maybe drive home the point, if you do have a

newer driver or younger driver, drive home the

point of how being a little bit careless for a

short time can have major consequences.

I'm going to go off script here a little bit. But I felt like saying a little bit of something about the incident that happened in Plum a few days ago, the tragic

incident. Of course, it's devastating. I have no more information than anybody else does. But there are assumptions made.

I'll just say that if you have ever have an odor of gas in your home, feel free to call the fire company. If you call the gas company, they're going to tell you to call the fire company right away.

We have tools we can at least zero in on odors. If we can find it, we have some experience digging through. But we will get the gas company there as well.

So, don't hesitate. We're happy to come and respond and assist you and give you peace of mind if you're concerned.

And finally, we did order a new fire engine in July from Pierce Manufacturing and Glick Fire Equipment. The engine that we're -- that we purchased is the smallest engine in our fleet. It will be housed down on Milford Station.

It's replacing a 30-year-old engine -- a 1992 Pierce engine. It's expected to be finished out in 2025 -- March of 2025.

There's a long delay because of just parts and

everything are difficult to come by.

The cost was \$870,000. That's what we paid five years ago for the massive rescue truck. And this is having made many decisions. The initial quote came in 1.1 million dollars. So we made a lot of decisions to make sure that we still had something that was functional, but we tried to be as responsible as possible.

And just as a reminder, the levy that's placed on homeowners does not pay for this equipment. It's the donations that you give.

The levy takes care of putting a roof over the fire company's head and taking care of anything. If you turn -- for the most part, if you turn the fire station upside down, whatever falls out your donations pay for.

And I believe we are the last

100 percent volunteer fire company on the

19 corridor from the City clear down to

Washington County -- the City of Washington.

So that's something we're very proud of.

Nobody has paid a dime to do what we do.

So, thank you very much.

Summer Bash, which was down at Simmons field

-- Simmons Park. So we want to thank the Rec

Department for doing that.

Last month was Light Out Night up at Park Avenue. So I want to thank the Chief and all the staff. All his officers were there.

And last but not least, I recognized years ago a person that got a Kindness Award. And the Kindness Awards was what we did last week at the -- or last Saturday at Simmons Park.

This person got one of our awards a few years ago. But we thought -- and Mrs. Gillium (phonetic) actually mentioned it -- that she deserves a lot -- a little bit more than that because of the work that she

I'll start with this one. I think we've been talking about this for the last several months when this bid came out. And, unfortunately, all the bad news we thought was coming did.

We're looking at the length of this contract. The first year rates are going to go up roughly 48 percent. What it's going to basically do -- it's estimated in 2023, our contract for waste disposal and recycling was about 2.4 million.

Under the new contract, and this was bid out from SHACOG, it's a number of our neighboring communities have already awarded, is roughly going to be about 3.5 million. An increase of roughly 1.2 million.

To put it in perspective, the new contract, if we take the 3.5 and divide it by almost 12,000 homes in Bethel Park, it comes

out to almost \$300 per home. Understand, this is all included in your property tax. There is no separate garbage fee. When you pay your municipal property tax this is one of the things that it goes for.

2.3

If you look at some of the new stories in recent weeks, what other people are awarding this contract, you may -- you might see a smaller increase.

Our neighboring communities, five years ago when we went to the automated recycling, opted to build a cost of the new toter into the garbage fee that they were paying Waste Management.

We opted to pay for it separately. We paid for that out of our General Fund to the tune of 700-plus-thousand-dollars. We saved over well \$100,000 over the length of the contract.

So, our starting 2023 fee is lower than some of our neighboring communities because we got a better rate because we ended up purchasing the cans themselves.

Even though the price has gone up, service level is going to change. It's going

to be a limit of two cans per pickup per
resident. The bulk items, instead of two per
week are going to be two per month.

2.3

And all this information that we're going to -- we're talking about tonight that I'm covering will all be communicated with the community once we finalize the agreement before the new contract starts.

But we want -- we had to award it.

Because the end of -- I think the third week

of August was the deadline to award the

contracts.

So it's going to be two bulk items per month. Recycling, it is now going to include glass. That's the good news.

Everything up to what we're doing this year, but there's a new market for glass recycling.

So it will be included in 2024.

We also will be giving -- we're going to an automated system for the recycling. So, once again, we're going to be distributing green toters for everybody for recycling.

They will take place -- or, we're going to get rid of those small crates you have.

And, once again, when we get to that

point, the recycling will not change until
first quarter -- sometime in first quarter

2024. And, once again, we will notify
everybody of when that recycling is going to

2.3

change.

- The lawn waste and leaf collection will not change. We'll still have one Saturday a month at Public Works during the summer. There will be eight leaf collections in the brown bags; four in the spring and four in the fall. That will not change.
 - Once again, it's going to be different. It's going to be, obviously, a lot more expensive. And we're going to have to look at the budget. 1.2 million to try to take out of the existing revenue is going to be a challenge. As you'll see tonight, we'll be ordering new a salt truck.
 - I don't want to steal Mr.

 Consolmagno's thunder. But it went from, a few years ago, 170,000 to \$270,000 for a new salt truck.
 - So our costs are going up pretty quickly. This will be dealt with when we do the budget. And the budget process is going

to be starting in the near future.

2.3

So, that's a general overview. Like I said, it will be first quarter when some of these things will go into effect. We're working now, once we finalize, putting a communication plan together prior to any changes being made, that everybody will understand what the new -- the new world will look like in 2024 with garbage collection.

MR. O'BRIEN: Mr. Moury?

PRESIDENT MOURY: Mr. O'Brien.

MR. O'BRIEN: You know, we knew there was going to be an increase. But when we finally received the information, I was really taken aback by it, and I was shocked, not just by the cost, but the change in the service. And part of that service was truly unfair to some of our residents, in my opinion.

So, after we -- the committee

meeting, I really thought about this, and I

was prepared tonight to vote "no" on this.

Did I have a plan to move forward? No. But I

was willing to take that risk. I didn't even

know what that risk would be, but that's how

passionate I was because of the unfairness of

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1 it.
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2.3

There's not much we can do about the cost. But through correspondence and conversations and Mr. Moury, he pulled another rabbit out of his hat. A very big rabbit. I think we should send him to Ukraine, and maybe he can end this war.

Because two weeks ago, this seemed like an impossible task. Because all these contracts -- they're just not SHACOG. That's the South Hills Area of Governments. They're all the same all the way around.

And things you think are etched in stone, Mr. Moury, with his experience and kindness, I want to thank him. He made this contract not less expensive, but fair.

Absolutely fair to all residents involved.

And I want to thank him for that.

So there's a lot of -- there's a lot of incredible moving parts in developing a budget.

My mother and my dad always taught me, they said, consistently over and over again, they said, "Tim, you know, if you're going to have wise spending, it really favors the prepared." And truly, that's -- that's true of budget, as well as it is with chance.

And in that spirit and in the spirit of really a lot of transparency, we would like to invite the citizens of Bethel Park, come, come to the new budget meetings. You know, there's just -- it's so much to learn. So much input that we can use, it's not even

funny, in developing this.

2.3

We have a reasonably pay schedule.

It's not -- it's not obtrusive. It's not nothing that's not doable. In fact, it's in bite-size reasonable parts across the board.

But, you know, your Council has consented to adding additional meetings, and committed to those additional meetings, and attending them as well in order to get and firmly establish a good -- a wise budget.

I have always kind of felt that this is -- you know, it's a mission critical one for all of us. I feel this is where the rubber really hits the road with the Municipality; how we spend your tax dollars, how we spend them, and if we spend them wisely, and in keeping with your desires and your wishes.

this coming Monday, a week from today. It will be here in the Municipal Building. It will be at 6:30. Please, if you have the opportunity, come attend. We'd love to hear your insights, your input. And I want you to, you know, really witness the process of what

goes -- what's involved with it.

A lot of costs that we have are fixed; things that we can't move. But the capital projects, you know, your desires, your wishes what to spend for the community, we can do. Big difference between wishes and wants. We want to do the -- you know, the absolute needs, the absolutely necessary things first. And what we can afterwards, do it.

But as President Moury mentioned, you know, we didn't anticipate this kind of an increase in taxes. This went out to bid for the garbage trucks, you know.

And then we have -- we're going to hear in a little bit also as far as, like, you know, some of the costs that we're spending for -- for -- you know, for our physical plants, for, you know, trucks for the Municipality as well. 100 grand, you know, completely unanticipated.

We want to go ahead and use these resources wisely and use them correctly and use them in keeping with our citizens' desires and wishes.

I wanted to thank Kelly McCann (phonetic) from the Parks and Rec Board. She really spearheaded it and brought it before us.

And it was -- it was just a really cool program. The one thing that they did is, just as an example for everyone here, they took a test with two groups of children, and no matter -- you know, no matter what they did, it was a real easy test.

And one of them, they said, "you're so smart." They congratulated them on how smart they were and how intelligent they were. The other one, they praised them on how hard they tried.

And they went through a series of tests. And by the end of it, the ones who they told were very smart ended up not wanting to take a harder test and not doing as well on the same test later. But the ones who they encouraged to keep trying harder and doing a good job trying, not only did they want to try the harder tests, but they scored better on those tests later.

So just a very small example of how something so tiny that a coach or a leader can do for a child that changes everything.

And so I just -- I want to encourage the community, anyone who's been thinking about it or wanting to do it, you know, I would encourage you go there. Because it was just a really nice experience. And I think it's a good thing we did.

PRESIDENT MOURY: I would have to agree.

Kelly brought it to our table. And we committed to do it at least two times per year. I know she made a presentation to the School District, and they jumped onboard.

And it's really about helping coaches
