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very excited to announce that the construction

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on our Adult Program room will begin tomorrow,

December 12th.

If you've been in the Library in the last few months you'll see up where our nonfiction is, we've taken out some of our stacks. We're creating another room to us to host classes and events. I'm saying the Children's can never use it because they always get the program room, but we'll see how that goes.

And also, an additional section with 22 lockers have been ordered for our pick-up lockers that are at the top of the ramp. They proved to be very, very popular, so we're adding an additional section. They will not be installed until early next year.

And the Library will be close on November -- December 24th and 25th for the Christmas holiday. And we will reopen on Tuesday, the 26th at noon.

And happy holidays. That's all I have.

don't think we have a Fire Chief's Report tonight. This is their yearly elections.

So, could we turn to the Manager's Report.

MS. DENNE: Yes. I just wanted -we got some good news today that we once again
have received the recognition as a Banner
Community with the Allegheny County Boroughs
Association.

That is awarded to communities that have met certain levels of criteria around financial stability, training, and community engagement. And Bethel Park was successful in retaining that designation again this year.

I wanted to let residents know that we are going to be switching to use 911 service coming this January for EMS calls only. If you are going to be calling for an ambulance through Tri-Community South, we ask that you call 911.

For all other inquiries, whether it be Police or Fire, you can continue to use the 831-2000 number, and you will receive a dispatcher. If something would happen that you call, you know, the wrong number, so to

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speak, there is no wrong number in this
situation, they will transfer you to the
appropriate authority.

This is done in order to streamline services and have all of our EMS services that are serviced in the South Hills on the same channel through 911. So it will help with efficiency in making sure that ambulance calls are being transferred in the appropriate manner and dealt with in a medical priority.

That's all, sir.

PRESIDENT MOURY: Thank you very much.

Can we now turn to the Mayor's Report; and Mayor Allen.

MAYOR ALLEN: Thank you very much, Mr. President.

I have a couple items this evening. The first one I wanted to talk about, Shop Local. Shop Local is a program that the foundation put together to try to help local businesses.

So, what they're doing is between now and November 22nd, they're awarding \$100 gift certificates each week. So, the first

one was Evey Hardware. The second one was for Bethel Bakery. Last week was the Pottery Place, and the \$100 certificate this week will be for Pasta Too.

So all you need to do for Shop Local is go to one of the local businesses, take your receipt, take a selfie and put it on the Municipal Facebook page, or you can also put it on Instagram or Twitter.

So, it's a good program. They've put a lot of work into it. And, hopefully, it will be very successful, which it has been already.

The second thing is our Light-Up -- or Christmas Light-Up Contest. We have a couple more weeks left. We need a few more judges.

If there's a house out there that you feel is worth voting for, please do. Call Janet at 412-831-6800, she's Extension 211. There's still a couple judges that we need. So, if you give her a call, if you're interested, please do that.

But what causes me also to remember -- and this is a little antidote maybe between Tim Moury and I that the general public probably isn't even aware of -- I had a particular aversion to a lot of the always evolving grant programs that exist in Pennsylvania. But to the extent they existed, I wanted to make sure that there was an opportunity to bring those moneys back home to people in Bethel Park.

And there was one day, and I think it was in, like, a February, Tim, if I'm not mistaken. So it was, like, snowy and sludgy, you know. And there was some program I discovered that had unallocated funds, but the application had to be in by 4:00 p.m. the next day.

Tim, who actually has a life outside of being Council President, dropped everything to crank out -- in conjunction with Bethel

Park Council staff -- crank out the
application, and he personally drove it in to
Harrisburg. And he got there, I think, about
three minutes before 4:00, if I remember
correctly, Tim, to some guy wearing a bow tie
whose name was Oliver. But we got the grant.

But my point is this: You never hear about this stuff. Bethel Park has done so well for so long. I think there's a danger when you take it for granted, like it was always this way. And it wasn't always this way.

Bethel Park was a mess before

Mr. O'Brien, Mr. Moury, and so many others got
together and said, "Hey, it doesn't matter

what party we're in. What matters is, are we
serving Bethel Park?"

And I was looking at some of the other comments, and they were well taken. Certainly, the fire company, the fire department, the library, the parks, the fields, the roads, the sewer. You can't turn your head driving around Bethel Park without seeing something that these gentlemen had their fingerprints on.

Mark O'Brien, that flood control
project, it made that entire community livable
again.
