A few items from the Library. I want to say thank you to the Bethel Park Woman's Club for their donation to the Library of over \$1,600. The club is dissolving, and made the Library the beneficiary of a significant portion of their liquid assets.

And also thank you to the Jack
Buncher Foundation for their year-end gift of
\$5,000 that they gave to each library in
Allegheny County.

And this is in addition to their annual \$200,000 match pool that they have provided for Love Your Library Month in September of which Bethel Park Library received about a little over \$3,500.

So, with all those nice year-end donations, we are adding two additional towers for our pick-up lockers that are at the top of the ramp. The pick-up lockers have become a very, very popular service that we offer. And it's very hard -- we're going to double.

We're going to about double the lockers that are available for you to come pick up items.

     The past members have done great for us, and

it's really supported us. So we really look

forward to that.

I'm here with the Fire Chief's Report for December of 2023. We had a total of 51 incidents for the month of December; seven structure fires, one vehicle fire, two vehicle accidents, one person stuck in an elevator, 11 hazardous conditions, which are gas leaks and CO incidents, one public service -- or, 15 good intent calls, one illegal burn, two smoke investigations, nine fire alarms, and two CO alarms, for a total of 51 calls.

For the year of 2023, we ran a total of 600 incidents, which is -- our average over the last five years is about 567. So we're up from that.

But just to put that in perspective, in 20- -- in 2014, we ran a total of 440 incidents. So that's a 36 percent increase over the last ten years.

So, please -- we ask the residents, please be mindful. Honestly, if we didn't run any calls, that would be fantastic. As a firefighter, you know, that would give me a lot of time back, because we are 100 percent volunteer.

So, you know, we're off to an

arousing start this year. I think we had a couple today already, a couple yesterday. So, anyways, you know, just be careful as you're out there.

Our safety tip for the week.

Obviously -- or, for the month. Obviously,

it's cold outside. If you're using space

heaters to heat your house, please purchase

space heaters that shut off automatically when

they fall over.

You know, we've had incidents where animals will knock a space heater over. The next thing you know clothes -- clothes or a piece of drapery is on fire. So please be careful. And, please, if you purchase one, purchase one that turns off automatically if it falls over.

Never leave a space heater or fireplace unattended. The same with candles as well. And make sure to turn off all space heaters if you leave the room. And keep flammable objects at least 3 feet away from space heaters or fireplaces.

I'd like to speak briefly about the EMS transition to Allegheny County 911 and hopefully provide some clarification on that.

As of January 3rd, Tri-Community EMS is no longer being dispatched by Bethel Park Emergency Dispatch Center. Any resident requiring medical assistance should call 911.

That being said, anyone who calls the Bethel Park Emergency Dispatch Center for medical assistance will be transferred to Allegheny County. It is just preferred that residents call 911 directly to expedite the process.

Residents in need of police or fire should continue to call the Bethel Park

Emergency Dispatch Center at 412-833-2000. A lot of work went into making this transition as smooth as possible. And I'm pleased to report that it has.
