3 PRESIDENT OAKES: Good evening. I'd
4 like to call to order the March 11, 2024
5 Regular Council Meeting.

6 Roll call, please.

7 MS. DENNE: Mr. Consolmagno?

8 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Here.

9 MS. DENNE: Ms. Kamenicky?

25 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Please stand

1 for the Pledge of Allegiance.

2 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance
3 was recited.)

4 PRESIDENT OAKES: First, I'd like to
5 start tonight's meeting by, last Tuesday we
6 had a flood. And Mr. Cenci reminded me to
7 make sure that we commend everyone that helped
8 out in the flood.

9 Our first respond- -- our first
10 responders and Chief Arnold's team, Mr. Hicks
11 and his team, all administration, Public
12 Works, members of Council that reached out to
13 residents, and everyone involved, firemen,
14 Tri-Community South, everyone that was totally
15 involved, dispatch, we really appreciate it.

16 Every resident was at least tended
17 to or someone got to their flooding that
18 night. Although, all the things couldn't be
19 fixed right away, we at least started the
20 process.

21 So I want to make sure we thank
22 everyone. All of our staff, they went above
23 and beyond the call of duty.

24 I would like to, under President
25 Announcements -- President Announcements, an

1 Executive of Session of Council was held on
2 March 11, 2024 for legal issues.

3 Now I'd like to move to motion for
4 Timothy J. Moury to be appointed to the Bethel
5 Park Municipal Authority.

6 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Second.

7 PRESIDENT OAKES: We have a motion
8 from myself and a second from Mr. Consolmagno
9 to appoint Timothy Moury to be appointed to
10 the Bethel Park Municipal Authority.

11 Roll call, please.

12 MS. DENNE: Mr. Consolmagno?

13 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Yes.

5 PRESIDENT OAKES: Vote carries 9 to
6 0.

7 Now I'd like to turn to the Reports
8 of Officials; and our Library Director.

9 MS. MCINTOSH: Good evening,
10 everyone. My name is Christine. I'm the
11 Director of your Public Library, where we
12 provide opportunities to explore, learn,
13 create, and connect.

14 I just have a few things this
15 evening. I wanted to talk about a class that
16 we have coming up on solar observing and the
17 2024 total solar eclipse. This will be on
18 Saturday, March 23rd, from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m.

19 This will be presented by Larry
20 McHenry. He is a South Hills resident and
21 been an amateur astronomer for over 40 years.
22 He will be here to introduce us to solar
23 features visible on the sun, safe solar
24 observing techniques, and where is the best
25 place for you to observe the upcoming April

1 8th total solar eclipse.

2 And then afterwards, weather
3 permitting, the author will set up outdoors a
4 small solar telescope so that the audience can
5 safely observe the sun and any solar features
6 visible that day.

7 I just wanted to let everyone know
8 that the Library has a limited number of
9 solar-observing classes approved,
10 solar-observing classes on sale for a dollar.
11 It's just cost recovery. We're not making
12 anything on it.

13 And the Library has embarked on an
14 important initiative to shine a light on
15 period poverty. Menstruating is a basic fact
16 of human existence. And menstrual hygiene
17 products are necessities, not luxuries, and
18 should be treated as such.

19 But, unfortunately, food stamps and
20 subsidies under the Women, Infants, and
21 Children Program that help with groceries do
22 not cover menstrual products.

23 So, during the month of March,
24 Women's History Month, the Library's
25 collecting menstrual products to be donated to

1 SHIM. There's a collection box near the front
2 desk in the Library, or we have a link to an
3 Amazon wish list on our Facebook page. So,
4 come help us make a dent in period poverty
5 issues.

6 And, finally, just one announcement.
7 The Library will be closed on Sunday, March
8 31st in celebration of the Easter holiday.

9 That is all.

10 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very
11 much.

12 MS. MCINTOSH: Thank you.

13 PRESIDENT OAKES: Any comments?

14 (No response.)

15 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Moving on
16 to the Police Chief's Report; and Chief
17 Arnold.

18 CHIEF ARNOLD: Good evening,
19 everyone.

20 Just a few things for everybody. I
21 want to bring to everyone's attention, this
22 coming weekend is St. Patrick's Day weekend.
23 And we are asking everyone to please celebrate
24 responsibly.

25 We are going to have increased DUI

1 patrols all weekend, starting on Friday. We
2 hope that if you're going to imbibe, you use
3 public transportation or utilize ride sharing
4 services like Uber and Lift.

5 Moving on to Crime Watch. We were
6 looking to revamp the Crime Watch Program.
7 Detective Gorman will be sending out a survey
8 to all the Crime Watch members so we can get
9 some feedback on some possible changes that
10 we're looking to do there.

11 Anyone looking to join the Crime
12 Watch can do so by going to the Police
13 Department page on the Municipal website and
14 submitting their information there, and we
15 will get to you through Detective Gorman.

16 That's all I have. Thank you.

17 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very
18 much, Chief.

19 Any comments?

20 (No response.)

21 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Moving on
22 now to the Fire Chief's Report.

23 MR. MARK: Good evening. My name's
24 John Mark. I'm the Second Captain for the
25 Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company.

1 For the month of February, we ran
2 two structure fires, one chimney fire, one
3 Dumpster fire, assisted the EMS one time, one
4 elevator rescue, one gas leak, one chemical
5 leak, six electrical problems, one water
6 condition, one public service call, ten good
7 intent calls, one Hazmat call, nine fire
8 alarms, and three CO alarms, totaling 39
9 calls.

10 This past weekend we changed the
11 clock back for Daylight Saving Time. We just
12 want to remind everybody this is your time to
13 change your batteries. They should be tested
14 once a month. And every seven years, replace
15 your CO detectors. And every ten years,
16 replace your smoke detectors.

17 I like to recommend just doing them,
18 you know, the dual, smoke and CO alarms, that
19 way just do it all at one time.

20 That's it.

21 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very
22 much, Captain Mark.

23 Any comments?

24 (No response.)

25 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very

1 much.

2 Next, we're going to roll the Mayor's
3 Report and the Manager's Report into one.
4 Mayor Allen could not be here tonight.

5 So, with that being said, Ms. Denne.

6 MS. DENNE: Yes. Mayor Allen had
7 asked for me to give a report on a couple
8 things going on.

9 April 20th is Spring Clean-Up Day.
10 And any individual or organization that wants
11 to volunteer should contact Haya Eason here
12 at the Municipal Building at 412-831-6800,
13 and her extension is 204. Or you can reach
14 her directly at heason@bethelparkpa.gov.

15 The other thing the Mayor wanted me
16 to mention is that Bethel Park was recently
17 ranked in an article seventh of over 400
18 suburbs for the best place to retire.

19 So, there was a report based on the
20 financial well-being, quality of life, and
21 amenities through the U.S. Census American
22 Community Survey, as well as Tax Foundation,
23 and others. So, Bethel Park received a
24 glowing mark of 96.6 out of 100 possible
25 score.

1 The other thing that I wanted to
2 bring up was, this weekend we do have a lucky
3 St. Patrick's Day bingo that will benefit the
4 Bethel Park Historical Society. Tickets for
5 that is \$20 for ten games.

6 There will also be a silent auction
7 for baskets and door prizes. There are
8 tickets available at the Recreation Center, if
9 anybody still hasn't received their tickets.

10 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very

3 I've never done this before. I'm
4 an old lady. And I've about had it. I read
5 in the local paper that our taxes are going
6 up. Now, it read that the illustrious
7 Dr. Campbell, I believe his name was, said the
8 price of paper clips, grass seed, and tar for
9 the streets has gone up.

10 Well, guess what? Has he priced eggs
11 recently or bread recently? Has he priced
12 cereal that the young parents that are moving
13 in have to pay for their cereal for their
14 children? And the elderly live on a fixed
15 income.

16 How dare he tell me that he has --
17 the increase of paper clips. Go to the Dollar
18 Store, first of all, you'll get paper clips a
19 dollar and a quarter a box.

20 I have about had it. We have built
21 schools, swimming pools, fire houses, all to
22 our taxes going up. Now they've decided --
23 you've decided you're going to build another




