Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company.

1 For the month of February, we ran two structure fires, one chimney fire, one 2 3 Dumpster fire, assisted the EMS one time, one 4 elevator rescue, one gas leak, one chemical 5 leak, six electrical problems, one water condition, one public service call, ten good 6 7 intent calls, one Hazmat call, nine fire alarms, and three CO alarms, totaling 39 8 9 calls. 10 This past weekend we changed the clock back for Daylight Saving Time. We just 11 12 want to remind everybody this is your time to 13 change your batteries. They should be tested 14 once a month. And every seven years, replace 15 your CO detectors. And every ten years, 16 replace your smoke detectors. 17 I like to recommend just doing them, you know, the dual, smoke and CO alarms, that 18 19

way just do it all at one time.
