If you've been in the Library in the last few days, you'll see we have all new computers. So, I wanted to take a moment to thank the Allegheny Regional Asset District Board. RAD provided a 3.1 million dollar grant for the purchase of 2,400 new PCs for all libraries in Allegheny County.

So, thank you to the RAD Board.

That's your extra 1 cent sales tax in Allegheny County. Part of that comes to libraries.

Next big fundraiser coming up, we have Party in the Park on Saturday, May 25th, from 4:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the South Park Theatre grounds. Tickets are \$40 for adults, kids 12 and under are free.

We have a lot of activities going on that day. We'll have vintage cars on the grounds, including a vintage racing car. We have a preview performance of the Children's Theatre 2024 Season on the outdoor stage.

We have a Miss Cass Cabaret inside at 6:00 p.m. We have, of course, raffle

baskets, 50/50.

The Penn State Master Gardeners will be there demonstrating some gardening tips, and also are available for you to ask questions.

And this year, we also have four local artists that will be displaying their fine art. It's also for sale.

And new this year, we have what we're calling Spring Bulb Drop. It's a chance for you to win \$1,000 cash. It's \$10 per chance. When you purchase a chance, you purchase a number between 1 and 1,000.

So, at 7:00 p.m. that evening, Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Department will have their lift truck there, their ladder truck, and they'll drop all of the bulbs, which are actually foam golf balls. But they'll be dropping all of the numbered bulbs into the garden. And the number that lands closest to the garden stake will win the \$1,000.

As President Oakes mentioned, this is Police Memorial Week. We ask that you please remember those officers who paid the ultimate sacrifice and died in the line of duty. In 2023, there were 118 officers that passed in the line of duty.

I want to mention that the registration for the No Knock List for solicitors has been added to the Municipal website home page. This is for people who do not commercial solicitors coming to their home.

When solicitors are granted a permit, they are given a list of addresses where they are not permitted to solicit. Only one member from your household needs to register your home.

The Crime Watch meeting for this month is going to be on Thursday, May 16th at 10:00 a.m. at the Target store at South Hills Village Mall.

We are partnering with our neighbors, the USC Police Department, to have a

Lastly, I'd like to acknowledge the job that our detectives and officers did with the Jaime Feden case in Las Vegas this past month. It involved the unfortunate death of one of our residents that was taken here from Bethel Park.

Our officers traveled to Las Vegas and attended and testified in the case, which ultimately ended in a guilty verdict.

And we are very proud of our officers. They were able to bring justice to Jaime and her family. And we're very proud of them. I think the Municipality should be equally as proud.

And that's all I have tonight.

Now the Fire Chief's Report.

MR. MARK: Good evening. My name is John Mark. I'm the Second Captain for the

Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company.

For the month of April, we ran seven structure fire, one cooking fire, one Port-A-John fire, two brush fires, assisted the EMS three times, four gas leaks, nine water conditions, one dog sprayed by a skunk, assisted police twice, eleven good intent calls, 13 fire alarms, one CO alarm, and two flood assessments; totaling 57 calls.

Through the end of April, we have
211 calls for the year. So, just to give you
an idea, there's other departments in the
South Hills that run about that many calls an
entire year. So, we do stay very busy.

The donation letters, I'm sure you guys have seen them, gone out. We just want to remind you the tax money goes towards the buildings and the maintenance and upkeep of the buildings, not the equipment.

We basically say, if you turn the buildings upside down and everything that falls out, we have to pay for.

We have a new vehicle -- a new engine that we're replacing that cost \$870,000. So, the original cost was a million. But we cut

it back to try to save some money. We know

it's tough times now. So, we did our best to

get everything that we need for it, but still

qet a nice apparatus.

And the last thing the Chief wanted me to remind you about was the open burn laws, when everybody wants to -- you know, the weather's breaking and everybody wants to get out and clean up their yards and stuff.

But you have to keep it within reason: 15 feet from a structure, not allowed to burn leaves and other materials like that, yard brush.

The law is 3 feet wide by 3 feet long by 2 feet high is the max that you're allowed to have for a recreational fire.

So, other rules and regulations are on the Department of Health -- Allegheny County Department of Health website, if you don't know them.

And the last thing, this is Kristin Fonda. She is a seventh grade math and --
