4 PRESIDENT OAKES: Good evening. I'd
5 like to call to order the May 13th, 2024
6 Regular Public Council Meeting for Bethel
7 Park.

8 Before we start and before we take
9 roll call, I'd like to let everyone know the
10 Pledge of Allegiance will be started today by
11 the Girl Scout Troop 28005.

12 And our very own Ms. Flinn had a
13 chance to talk with them about local
14 government. And we'd like to reward them for
15 getting their Democracy Badge.

16 So, roll call, please.

17 MS. DENNE: Mr. Consolmagno?

18 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Here.

19 MS. DENNE: Ms. Kamenicky?

20 MS. KAMENICKY: Here.

21 MS. DENNE: Mr. Oakes?

22 PRESIDENT OAKES: Here.

23 MS. DENNE: Mr. Cenci?

24 MR. CENCI: (No response.)

25 MS. DENNE: Mr. Janosik?

1 MR. JANOSIK: Here.

2 MS. DENNE: Mr. Jenkins?

3 MR. JENKINS: Here.

4 MS. DENNE: Mr. Espinar?

5 MR. ESPINAR: Here.

6 MS. DENNE: Ms. Garis?

7 MS. GARIS: Here.

8 MS. DENNE: Ms. Flinn?

9 MS. FLINN: Here.

10 PRESIDENT OAKES: Eight members
11 present.

12 Could we now please stand for the
13 Pledge of Allegiance.

14 Do you guys want to come up to the
15 microphone?

16 - - -

17 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance
18 was recited, and lead by Girl Scout Troop
19 28005.)

20 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very
21 much.

22 Okay. Now we're going to move to
23 our Chair Announcements.

24 And I have a few -- before we
25 actually get the meeting started, first,

1 Mr. Cenci, our Chair of Health, Safety and
2 Welfare, wanted me to bring up two items.

3 Prayers and thoughts, and our hearts
4 go out to the Bethel Park Police Department
5 and retired officer, Ronald Evans.

6 Second, we'd like to also recognize
7 the Police Department for National Police
8 Enforcement Week and National Law Enforcement
9 Week. And we're very proud of our Police
10 Department.

11 And last, we give kudos to our
12 Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Department with
13 assisting Finleyville with the tornado over
14 the weekend. And our hearts and thoughts and
15 prayers go out to those victims from the
16 tornado.

17 I'd like to move next to appoint
18 Economic Development Steering Committee
19 member, Frank Corrado.

20 MR. JANOSIK: Second.

21 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. I have a
22 motion from myself and a second from
23 Mr. Jenkins -- or, Mr. Janosik that we move
24 the following candidate for the vacancy on
25 the Economic Development Steering Committee,

1 Frank Corrado.

2 Roll call, please.

3 MS. DENNE: Mr. Consolmagno?

4 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Yes.

5 MS. DENNE: Ms. Kamenicky?

6 MS. KAMENICKY: Yes.

7 MS. DENNE: Mr. Oakes?

8 PRESIDENT OAKES: Yes.

9 MS. DENNE: Mr. Janosik?

10 MR. JANOSIK: Yes.

11 MS. DENNE: Mr. Jenkins?

12 MS. JENKINS: Yes.

13 MS. DENNE: Mr. Espinar?

14 MR. ESPINAR: Yes.

15 MS. DENNE: Ms. Garis?

16 MS. GARIS: Yes.

17 MS. DENNE: Ms. Flinn?

18 MS. FLINN: Yes.

19 PRESIDENT OAKES: Motion passes 8 to
20 0.

21 Now I'd like to turn to the Reports
22 of Officials; and the Library Director.

23 MS. MCINTOSH: Good evening. My
24 name is Christine, and I'm the Director of
25 your Public Library, where we provide

1 opportunities to explore, learn, create, and
2 connect.

3 If you've been in the Library in the
4 last few days, you'll see we have all new
5 computers. So, I wanted to take a moment to
6 thank the Allegheny Regional Asset District
7 Board. RAD provided a 3.1 million dollar
8 grant for the purchase of 2,400 new PCs for
9 all libraries in Allegheny County.

10 So, thank you to the RAD Board.

11 That's your extra 1 cent sales tax
12 in Allegheny County. Part of that comes to
13 libraries.

14 Next big fundraiser coming up, we
15 have Party in the Park on Saturday, May 25th,
16 from 4:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the South Park
17 Theatre grounds. Tickets are \$40 for adults,
18 kids 12 and under are free.

19 We have a lot of activities going on
20 that day. We'll have vintage cars on the
21 grounds, including a vintage racing car. We
22 have a preview performance of the Children's
23 Theatre 2024 Season on the outdoor stage.

24 We have a Miss Cass Cabaret inside
25 at 6:00 p.m. We have, of course, raffle

1 baskets, 50/50.

2 The Penn State Master Gardeners will
3 be there demonstrating some gardening tips,
4 and also are available for you to ask
5 questions.

6 And this year, we also have four
7 local artists that will be displaying their
8 fine art. It's also for sale.

9 And new this year, we have what we're
10 calling Spring Bulb Drop. It's a chance for
11 you to win \$1,000 cash. It's \$10 per chance.
12 When you purchase a chance, you purchase a
13 number between 1 and 1,000.

14 So, at 7:00 p.m. that evening, Bethel
15 Park Volunteer Fire Department will have their
16 lift truck there, their ladder truck, and
17 they'll drop all of the bulbs, which are
18 actually foam golf balls. But they'll be
19 dropping all of the numbered bulbs into the
20 garden. And the number that lands closest to
21 the garden stake will win the \$1,000.

22 So, if you can't attend, you can buy
23 one of these bulbs. It's a great way to
24 support the organizations, which are the South
25 Park Theatre, the Bethel Park Community

1 Foundation, the Education Foundation, the
2 Historical Society, and the Library.

3 So, we hope to see you there.

4 And just an announcement. The
5 Library will be closed on Sunday, May 26th
6 and Monday, May 27th for the Memorial Day
7 holiday. And then the Library will be closed
8 on Sundays from Memorial Day weekend through
9 Labor Day weekend. But we're still open 54
10 hours a week, so come on in and see us.

11 And that's all I have.

12 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very
13 much.

14 MS. McINTOSH: Thank you.

15 PRESIDENT OAKES: Any questions?
16 Comments?

17 (No response.)

18 PRESIDENT OAKES: I would like to
19 also thank you. The tea party this week was
20 a big hit. The Board and the Library did a
21 great job.

22 MS. McINTOSH: Thank you.

23 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you.

24 The Police Chief's Report; and Chief
25 Arnold.

1 CHIEF ARNOLD: Good evening,
2 everybody.

3 As President Oakes mentioned, this
4 is Police Memorial Week. We ask that you
5 please remember those officers who paid the
6 ultimate sacrifice and died in the line of
7 duty. In 2023, there were 118 officers that
8 passed in the line of duty.

9 I want to mention that the
10 registration for the No Knock List for
11 solicitors has been added to the Municipal
12 website home page. This is for people who do
13 not commercial solicitors coming to their
14 home.

15 When solicitors are granted a permit,
16 they are given a list of addresses where they
17 are not permitted to solicit. Only one member
18 from your household needs to register your
19 home.

20 The Crime Watch meeting for this
21 month is going to be on Thursday, May 16th at
22 10:00 a.m. at the Target store at South Hills
23 Village Mall.

24 We are partnering with our neighbors,
25 the USC Police Department, to have a

1 discussion on shoppers' safety. We will meet
2 in the Starbucks area right inside the
3 entrance.

4 Lastly, I'd like to acknowledge the
5 job that our detectives and officers did with
6 the Jaime Feden case in Las Vegas this past
7 month. It involved the unfortunate death of
8 one of our residents that was taken here from
9 Bethel Park.

10 Our officers traveled to Las Vegas
11 and attended and testified in the case, which
12 ultimately ended in a guilty verdict.

13 And we are very proud of our
14 officers. They were able to bring justice to
15 Jaime and her family. And we're very proud of
16 them. I think the Municipality should be
17 equally as proud.

18 And that's all I have tonight.

19 PRESIDENT OAKES: Any questions? Any
20 comments?

21 (No response.)

22 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you, Chief.
23 Now the Fire Chief's Report.

24 MR. MARK: Good evening. My name is
25 John Mark. I'm the Second Captain for the

1 Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company.

2 For the month of April, we ran seven
3 structure fire, one cooking fire, one
4 Port-A-John fire, two brush fires, assisted
5 the EMS three times, four gas leaks, nine
6 water conditions, one dog sprayed by a skunk,
7 assisted police twice, eleven good intent
8 calls, 13 fire alarms, one CO alarm, and two
9 flood assessments; totaling 57 calls.

10 Through the end of April, we have
11 211 calls for the year. So, just to give you
12 an idea, there's other departments in the
13 South Hills that run about that many calls an
14 entire year. So, we do stay very busy.

15 The donation letters, I'm sure you
16 guys have seen them, gone out. We just want
17 to remind you the tax money goes towards the
18 buildings and the maintenance and upkeep of
19 the buildings, not the equipment.

20 We basically say, if you turn the
21 buildings upside down and everything that
22 falls out, we have to pay for.

23 We have a new vehicle -- a new engine
24 that we're replacing that cost \$870,000. So,
25 the original cost was a million. But we cut

1 it back to try to save some money. We know
2 it's tough times now. So, we did our best to
3 get everything that we need for it, but still
4 get a nice apparatus.

5 And the last thing the Chief wanted
6 me to remind you about was the open burn laws,
7 when everybody wants to -- you know, the
8 weather's breaking and everybody wants to get
9 out and clean up their yards and stuff.

10 But you have to keep it within
11 reason: 15 feet from a structure, not allowed
12 to burn leaves and other materials like that,
13 yard brush.

14 The law is 3 feet wide by 3 feet long
15 by 2 feet high is the max that you're allowed
16 to have for a recreational fire.

17 So, other rules and regulations are
18 on the Department of Health -- Allegheny
19 County Department of Health website, if you
20 don't know them.

21 And the last thing, this is Kristin
22 Fonda. She is a seventh grade math and --

23 MS. FONDA: Learning support.

24 MR. MARK: -- learning support
25 teacher at IMS. And she has a group called Be

1 Kind Kids from IMS.

2 And over the past several months,
3 they were very kind to us. Every month, we
4 have a monthly meeting, and they have provided
5 dinner for us for --

6 What is it?

7 MS. FONDA: In September.

8 MR. MARK: September.

9 So, we are very thankful. We just
10 wanted to come up here and acknowledge her and
11 her group. They've done a fantastic job. And
12 we appreciate everything that they've done for
13 us.

14 (Applause.)

15 MR. MARK: That's all I have.

16 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very
17 much.

18 Okay. Now we'd like to move to the
19 Manager's Report; and Ms. Denne.

20 MS. DENNE: Yes. I had a request
21 that we provide -- and I work with the
22 Mayor -- that we were going to provide a
23 Proclamation for EMS Week, which is next week,
24 May 19th through 25th. And this is the 50th
25 anniversary of recognizing EMS.

1 This Sunday, we have the
2 Touch-A-Truck event, which will be at the
3 Public Works facility. There will be mascots
4 from local baseball teams, Public Works, Fire,
5 Police, EMS trucks. That will be from 12:00
6 to 3:00 p.m. at the DPW garage here on Slater
7 Road.

8 Splash park passes are for sale. We
9 will be opening Memorial Day Weekend. So,
10 please, if you need to beat the crowd, get
11 your splash park passes ahead of time. They
12 are for sale at the Community Center.

13 We still have a couple positions
14 open here at the Municipality. We have a
15 full-time assistant finance director. And we
16 have part-time positions in our Code
17 Enforcement Office and also at the splash
18 park. Please look on our website under "Human
19 Resources" or "Careers" for any of those
20 positions.

21 PRESIDENT OAKES: Is there any
22 questions or comments?

23 (No response.)

24 PRESIDENT OAKES: That's it?

25 MS. DENNE: That's it.

1 PRESIDENT OAKES: All right.

2 Moving on now to the Mayor's Report;
3 and Mayor Allen.

4 MAYOR ALLEN: Thank you,
5 Mr. President.

6 I always have information to give the
7 community. But it's always special when we
8 have something to give back to some of the
9 people that make a difference here in Bethel
10 Park.

11 So, I would like to bring up -- well,
12 Ms. Flinn, if you could come up.

13 And also Girl Scout Troop 28005, if
14 you could all come up. And their troop
15 leaders, Amy Agostoni and Des Wynan
16 (phonetic). All right.

17 I want to see. Do you have the
18 Democracy Badge? Are they on? I'd like to
19 see what they look like. You earned it.
20 Okay.

21 All right. I'll turn this over to
22 Ms. Flinn because you were involved, so you
23 can tell them a little about what you did.

24 MS. FLINN: Thank you so much for
25 coming, girls. We're so excited to have you

1 here with us.

2 So, I am so proud of these girls.
3 They've been working so hard on their
4 Democracy Badge for quite a few months now.
5 And so they've been learning about all levels
6 of government from federal to state to local.

7 And I had the honor and privilege
8 and opportunity to speak at one of their Troop
9 meetings and to share a little bit about my
10 experience on Council and what we do up here
11 and the work that we do in Bethel Park.

12 And I was just so blown away and
13 impressed with their knowledge, with the
14 questions that they asked me, and, quite
15 honestly, their excitement and enthusiasm for
16 local government.

17 Whenever I was speaking -- I said hi
18 to the girls whenever they walked in. One of
19 them said that this is, like, the best day of
20 their life and a dream come true to come to
21 one of our Council meetings.

22 And so I -- I mean, it's not always
23 a party. But, I mean, we love it.

24 So, I just want to say, I'm so proud
25 of you guys. And keep -- keep asking the hard

1 questions. You know, keep the excitement and
2 the enthusiasm to serve your community. And
3 keep -- keep us accountable as your leaders.

4 You're looking at future leaders
5 right here, future Council members, I think,
6 and state reps, senators, congresswomen, maybe
7 even a president some day.

8 So, again, just keep working hard,
9 and just keep serving your community. There's
10 no action too small. You can start right now.
11 Start on your student government. Get
12 involved in your schools.

13 So, I'm so proud of you guys. Thank
14 you so much.

15 (Applause.)

16 MAYOR ALLEN: All right. Thank you.

17 And who was it that's going to be
18 president? Right.

19 And what did we say, you're going to
20 start at Mayor and work your way up?

21 Oh, ambassador, and work your way
22 up? Okay. Well, you can skip the Mayor part,
23 so...

24 So, if I can bring you two up. I
25 have a certificate for you.

1 And what I'm going to do, girls, is
2 get one of these certificates to each and
3 every one of you so you'll have it to put on
4 your wall at home or whatever you'd like to do
5 with it.

6 But this is presented to Girl Scout
7 Troop 28005 for the completion of the
8 Democracy Badge and participation in the
9 May 13, 2024 Council meeting, awarded this
10 day, the 13th day of May 2024. And I signed
11 it, Mayor Jack Allen.

12 So, thank you very much.

13 Anybody want to say a word before I
14 turn it over to your leaders?

15 (No response.)

16 MAYOR ALLEN: No?

17 Ms. President?

18 Actually, if you could introduce
19 them.

20 - - -

21 (Whereupon, at this juncture the
22 Troop Leader, Ms. Agostoni, introduces all of
23 the Girl Scouts present.)

24 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. Did you want to
25 say anything, or no? You good?

1 MS. AGOSTONI: Thank you.

2 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay.

3 MS. AGOSTONI: Thank you. The girls
4 are excited. This is an honor.

5 MAYOR ALLEN: I'll give you this.
6 And if you give me the list, we'll take care
7 of that too.

8 MS. AGOSTONI: Okay.

9 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. Thank you very
10 much.

11 MS. AGOSTONI: Thank you.

12 MAYOR ALLEN: And thank you, girls,
13 for doing that.

14 (Applause.)

15 MAYOR ALLEN: The next thing I wanted
16 to mention was our Memorial Day activities.
17 Memorial Day, at 7:55 -- between 7:55 and
18 8:00, the ceremony will start out here on the
19 patio, the Veterans Memorial, followed at 9:00
20 by the parade, and 10:00 we have our ceremony
21 down at the cemetery.

22 Also, this Saturday, the 18th, we're
23 putting flags up in the cemetery. So, if
24 there's anybody that would like to help us, we
25 put up typically between 7- and 800 flags on

1 all the gravesites.

2 So, if anybody can help us, that
3 will be at 10:00 this Saturday, the 18th. And
4 if for some reason it rains, we'll just delay
5 it one week.

6 Okay. I want to mention the Farmer's
7 Market. It started last week at the ice rink
8 in South Park, and that's open between 3:00
9 and 7:00.

10 One question we've been getting is
11 on the recycle bins. Old recycle bins,
12 whether they're the black ones and the orange
13 ones or you have your own, you can bring them
14 to Public Works on Saturday -- this Saturday,
15 May 18th, and they will take care of that for
16 you.

17 Just throw it in and you'll get rid
18 of your old recycle. We're going to recycle
19 your recycle bins. And that's between 8:00
20 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

21 And finally, girls, the splash park
22 is going to open in a couple weeks, on
23 May 25th at 11:00. We're going to open at
24 11:00. And you can check out our website for
25 details.

1 We mentioned that the passes are for
2 sale. I think we're over 60 passes sold
3 already. So, they are going. And, also, the
4 first -- and I don't know how many. The first
5 people there will get little rubber duckies as
6 a commemorative of the splash park.

7 And finally, look for your edition
8 of the Bethel Park Chronicles. It should be
9 out this week. So look for it towards the end
10 of this week.

11 So, that's all I had. So, thank you
12 very much.

13 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you, Mayor.

14 Any questions or comments?

15 (No response.)

16 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Hearing

6 MR. JANOSIK: Second.

7 PRESIDENT OAKES: I have a motion by
8 Mr. Consolmagno and a second by Mr. Janosik
9 that we approve the Bill List 05132024 in the
10 amount of \$2,255,704.42.

11 Any questions or comments on this
12 item?

13 (No response.)

14 PRESIDENT OAKES: Roll call, please.

15 MS. DENNE: Mr. Consolmagno?

19 Safety and Welfare; or Planning and Zoning.

20 So we will move on to Public Works
21 and Maintenance; and Ms. Flinn.

22 MS. FLINN: Thank you, President
23 Oakes.

24 There is one item under Public Works
25 and Maintenance tonight; the WinCan software

1 purchase.

2 I move to approve the purchase of
3 the WinCan software for data storage of sewer
4 inspections and to improve workflows for the
5 camera truck for the yearly cost of \$19,330.

6 MR. ESPINAR: Second.

7 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. We have a
8 motion from Ms. Flinn and a second from
9 Mr. Espinar that we move to approve the
10 purchase of WinCan software for data storage
11 of sewer inspections and to improve workflows
12 for the camera truck for the yearly cost of

17 PRESIDENT OAKES: Oh, sorry.

18 MS. FLINN: Just one extra thing I
19 wanted to mention, that May 19th through 25th
20 is Public Works Week. And I'd just like to
21 recognize Susie Dolinar and our Public Works
22 crew.

23 They just make our community an
24 incredi- -- they make it work and run
25 smoothly. And they're a backbone of our town.

1 And I just want to thank them for all their
2 hard work and their commitment to our
3 residents.

4 And don't forget, join everyone at
5 the annual Public Works Touch-A-Truck on
6 Sunday from 12:00 to 3:00 at our beautiful
7 Public Works facility.

8 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: I'll second that.


