3 PRESIDENT OAKES: Good evening,  
4 everyone. And thank you for attending.  
5 Tonight will be the September 9, 2024 Regular  
6 Council Meeting.

7 Roll call, please.

8 MS. DENNE: Mr. Consolmagno?

1                   PRESIDENT OAKES:   Eight members  
2   present.

3                   Please stand for the Pledge of  
4   Allegiance.

6                   (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance  
7   was recited.)

8                   PRESIDENT OAKES:   Okay.   Moving on.  
9   Under Chair Announcements, there was an  
10   Executive Session of Council held today,  
11   September 9, 2024, to discuss legal issues.

12                   I'd like to turn now to Reports of  
13   Officials; and the Library Director.

14                   MS. McINTOSH:   Good evening.   My  
15   name's Christine.   I just have a few items  
16   tonight.

17                   September is Love Your Library Month.  
18   I have my shirt on.   So, all donations made  
19   during the month of September will be  
20   partially matched by a pool of funds,  
21   \$200,000, from the Jack Buncher Foundation.  
22   This is their seventh year of supporting  
23   libraries during Love Your Library Month.

24                   You can make donations in person or  
25   online through the Library's website.

1           Also in September, we're having a  
2 golf outing. It's the seventh annual Bethel  
3 Park Fantastic Four Charities Golf Outing,  
4 which will be held at Nemacolin Country Club  
5 on Monday, September 23rd.

6           We have a lot of golfers. But if  
7 you're not a golfer, you can come and enjoy  
8 dinner or you can support us by purchasing  
9 numbered golf balls for our Golf Ball Drop.  
10 Those can be purchased at Evey True Value  
11 Hardware, at the Library, or from the  
12 Library's web page.

13           And then this summer, the Library and  
14 the Recreation Department partnered to do  
15 Movies in the Park. So, we had three family  
16 movies in the park this summer. And the last  
17 one of this series is Grown-Up Movies in the  
18 Park.

19           So, on Friday, September 13th, at  
20 dusk, at Park Avenue Field, we will be showing  
21 the original 1981 version of Friday the 13th.  
22 So bring your blankets and your favorite movie  
23 snacks and join us.

24           The weather looks like it will  
25 cooperate. If it does rain, we will be

1       showing it in the Community Center auditorium.

2               And one other thing. Our Sunday  
3       hours resumed this past Sunday. So the  
4       Library is open Monday through Thursday,  
5       10:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.; Friday and  
6       Saturday, 10:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.; and  
7       Sundays now again through Memorial Day weekend  
8       we'll be open from noon until 4:00.

9               And that is all that I have.

10              PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very  
11       much, Christine.

12              MS. McINTOSH: Thank you.

13              PRESIDENT OAKES: Any other  
14       questions?

15              (No response.)

16              PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Could we  
17       now have the Police Chief's Report; and Chief  
18       Arnold.

19              CHIEF ARNOLD: Good evening,  
20       everyone.

21              I just want to start out and thank  
22       everyone that stopped by our booth yesterday  
23       -- or on Saturday at the Community Day. It  
24       was great to meet so many new people and talk  
25       with everyone and just get to know everybody.

1       So thanks for stopping and seeing us there.

2               With school back in session now, we  
3       just want to remind everybody to be alert and  
4       cautious whenever they're driving through  
5       school zones in the morning and the afternoon.  
6       And also to be aware of school buses dropping  
7       off kids and loading kids onto their buses.

8               Our officers are going to be very  
9       aggressively enforcing these violations.

10              So, please -- and, you know, it's for  
11       the kids. We want to make sure they're safe  
12       getting to and from school. So please be  
13       aware of these things.

14              Some upcoming events. On Saturday,  
15       September 28th, from 11:00 to 1:00 p.m.,  
16       there's going to be a Touch-A-Truck event at  
17       South Hills Village Mall. It's to benefit  
18       Jamie's Dream Team, which is a nonprofit that  
19       supports the needs of children suffering from  
20       serious medical conditions, traumas, and  
21       disabilities.

22              There will be large trucks and  
23       emergency vehicles on display, food trucks, a  
24       raffle, and a bounce house. The event will be  
25       held in the parking lot near of the old Sears

1 Auto building up at the mall.

2 The Bethel Park Police Duck Hunt,  
3 keep an eye out for the monthly BPPD Duck  
4 Hunt. We will hide a small police duck  
5 somewhere in Bethel Park and post clues on our  
6 social media for you -- anyone to go out and  
7 look for him.

8 Whoever finds him can bring him back  
9 to the Police Station for a prize. This  
10 month, the prize is a \$25 gift certificate in  
11 Buffalo Bucks, courtesy of South Park Shops,  
12 and a Pet Supplies Plus gift basket, courtesy  
13 of Pet Supplies Plus.

14 More information will be posted on  
15 our social media pages the day before we hide  
16 the ducks. So follow along on social media.

17 For our Crime Watch, the monthly  
18 Crime Watch meetings will start up again in  
19 early October. We haven't set the exact date  
20 and time yet. But we will be putting that out  
21 for everyone, so pay attention for that.

22 We're excited to get that back up and running.

23 Coffee With a Cop. We will be  
24 hosting a Coffee With a Cop event on  
25 Wednesday, October 2. The details will be

1 posted on our social media pages in regard to  
2 the time and location. So, again, follow us  
3 on social media to keep up with all these  
4 things.

5 And lastly, Wednesday marks the 23rd  
6 anniversary of September 11th. We just ask  
7 that you please keep the memories of the  
8 fallen first responders and innocent victims  
9 that lost their lives that day in your  
10 thoughts and prayers.

11 Thank you.

12 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you, Chief.

13 Any questions?

14 (No response.)

15 PRESIDENT OAKES: Hearing none, could  
16 we have the Fire Chief's Report, please.

17 MR. USELMAN: Good evening, Council,  
18 residents of Bethel Park. My name's Rob  
19 Uselman, Assistant Chief with the Bethel Park  
20 Volunteer Fire Company.

21 And tonight I will give you the  
22 Chief's Report for August of 2024.

23 The rundown of incidents is we had a  
24 total of 45 incidents for the month of August:  
25 Six structure fires, one cooking fire, one



1 heavy equipment fire, one brush fire, three  
2 gas leaks, three CO alarms, three electrical  
3 conditions, one vehicle accident, one water  
4 main break, one assist the police, seven good  
5 intent calls, two smoke investigations, and 15  
6 fire alarms, for a total of 45 incidents.

7 A busy month. Not quite as busy as  
8 we have been. We're averaging about 53 calls  
9 per month. And at that rate, we will have  
10 633 calls for 2024, which is a near record for  
11 us. I think our highest so far in the last  
12 five years has been around 650.

13 So, keep in mind we are all  
14 volunteers. We love what we do, otherwise we  
15 wouldn't do it. But, you know, we do spend a  
16 lot of time answering calls. So please be  
17 careful out there.

18 Sentiments to the Chief about school  
19 zones and other things. So just be aware of  
20 what you're doing. And as we go into cooler  
21 months, it's important to make sure you  
22 maintain things.

23 We were at Community Day as well,  
24 right beside the Chief police booth. It was  
25 great to see everybody. I recommend -- we

1 appreciate seeing everybody from the  
2 community.

3 If you didn't get a chance to stop  
4 by and see us, though, there's a big day  
5 coming up Sunday, October 6, from 11:00 a.m.  
6 to 3:00 p.m., at our main station on  
7 Brightwood Road, right beside Bethel Bakery.  
8 That is our annual Open House event.

9 And we love that day because we open  
10 our doors for the community to come and visit  
11 us and see our station -- our great station  
12 that we have. We have a lot of pride in that  
13 station.

14 And also talk to us about fire  
15 prevention, all kinds of -- all kinds of  
16 things about the fire department in the  
17 community.

18 The theme for this year is "Smoke  
19 Alarms, Make Them Work For You." We can't  
20 emphasize enough the importance of smoke  
21 detectors in people's houses, as well as CO  
22 alarms in people's houses.

23 So, October 6, Sunday, mark your  
24 calendars. Come down and visit us. If  
25 there's a Steeler game, we normally have it on

1        somewhere so everybody can watch it. We know  
2        how important that is as well.

3                Another big thing that will be coming  
4        out in the mail soon, and we ask residents to  
5        check your mail. We do have our second  
6        fundraising mailing that will be coming out  
7        within a week or two. I believe they're being  
8        printed this week.

9                So, we rely a lot on the funds that  
10       are provided from the residents that are  
11       donated to us to purchase a lot of our  
12       equipment. And it's really important. And we  
13       appreciate everything that the community does  
14       for us, as well as Council, and all the  
15       support they give us.

16               So we just recommend that when you  
17       see something come from the Bethel Park  
18       Volunteer Fire Company, don't throw it away.  
19       It's not junk mail.

20               So, that's all I have. Thank you.

21               PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very  
22       much. And thanks again for all the volunteers  
23       and all their service.

24               Any other questions?

25               (No response.)

1           PRESIDENT OAKES:   Okay.   Hearing  
2   none, could we move to the Manager's Report;  
3   and Ms. Denne.

4           MS. DENNE:    Sure.   I hope I'm not  
5   stepping on any of the Mayor's events.   We  
6   didn't coordinate today.

7           So, in any event, this weekend we  
8   have a Job Fair at our Community Center from  
9   11:00 to 2:00.   This is the third Job Fair  
10   that we have had in the last year -- actually,  
11   last year.   There will be over 500 jobs  
12   available, everything from part-time to  
13   full-time and seasonal.

14          We also have some people that will be  
15   doing on-site interviews.   And there will be  
16   hospitals that will be providing for medical  
17   training for any individuals that wish to work  
18   at the hospital.   So there's some really great  
19   opportunities there.

20          This past weekend, as mentioned, we  
21   had our Community Day.   And I would like to  
22   thank the Recreation staff for arranging and  
23   preparing for this event.   Our Public Works,  
24   our Police, our Fire, and also all the groups  
25   that participated from our School District.

1           It was a wonderful day showing all of  
2           the good things that we have going on in  
3           Bethel Park.

4           This weekend, we do have the  
5           Community Yard Sale going on. Please, you  
6           know, come out. And contact our Recreation  
7           Department for maps on what properties will be  
8           participating.

9           Our last Farmer's Market on Corrigan  
10          Drive will be on September 24. We will once a  
11          month be having an indoor market. And we will  
12          be continuing with the No Cook Tuesdays.

13          Christine had already mentioned about  
14          the spooky movie night. So, we're already  
15          going there.

16          And, also, in addition, there is a  
17          little bit of a competition right now going on  
18          between the Police and Public Works. The  
19          Police have chosen the duck as their motto --  
20          or spirit animal, I guess I should call it.  
21          And Public Works has chosen the Salty, the  
22          9-foot skeleton.

23          So we're also going to have a little  
24          competition going on between the two, where if  
25          you see Salty, please take a picture of him

1 and -- or a picture with him, excuse me. And  
2 we'll be working to also ramp that up between  
3 the Police Department and Public Works in the  
4 competition.

5 And that's all for this month.

6 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very  
7 much.

8 Any questions?

9 (No response.)

10 PRESIDENT OAKES: All right. Hearing  
11 none, the Mayor's Report; and Mayor Allen.

12 MAYOR ALLEN: So you set the rule  
13 straight, you pick the duck up and bring it  
14 in?

15 CHIEF ARNOLD: That's right.

16 MAYOR ALLEN: Don't bring Salty in.

17 Good evening --

18 MS. DENNE: Don't --

19 MAYOR ALLEN: -- everyone.

20 MS. DENNE: -- least.

21 (Simultaneous speakers/inaudible.)

22 MAYOR ALLEN: Yeah, well.

23 Just a few things tonight. I wanted  
24 to also piggyback on Community Day. The staff  
25 did a terrific job.

1           Last month, I had Billy Knox here.  
2       He was going to sell lemonade. And he did.  
3       He came and sold lemonade at the American  
4       Legion booth and made over \$450, donating it  
5       to the Pennsylvania Wounded Warriors.

6           So thanks, Billy.

7           The Chief mentioned about 9/11.  
8       There's a ceremony that South Park does every  
9       year. They're doing it at Sunny Slopes. It's  
10      this -- on 9/11. The South Park Board of  
11      Commissioners do it rain or shine. And that's  
12      at 6:00 on 9/11.

13           Kristen had also mentioned the  
14      Community Yard Sale. If someone out there  
15      wants to participate, they just need to go on  
16      the website, bethelpark.recdesk.com. It's  
17      \$15. And they'll register your house on their  
18      map so people know exactly where to go.

19           And that's hand-in-hand with Garage  
20      Sale in the Park, which is up on Industrial  
21      Boulevard at the same time.

22           People are already getting excited  
23      about the Halloween season because people are  
24      already putting up their decorations. So,  
25      keep that in mind. The judging will start the

1 end of October, and we'll recognize the  
2 winners in November.

3 And, finally, I wanted to bring up  
4 Lisa Jenkins. Lisa is in charge of the  
5 Wreaths Across America.

6 Lisa, is this the third year?

7 MS. JENKINS: Fourth.

8 MAYOR ALLEN: Fourth year?

9 And I just wanted her to let  
10 everybody know the project that we have.

11 So, if you want to join us.

12 MS. JENKINS: Thank you, Mayor.

13 MAYOR ALLEN: You walk like I do.

14 MS. JENKINS: I know. I need a hip  
15 replacement, like you.

16 Hi. So, I'm Lisa Jenkins. I'm one  
17 on the board of the Bethel Park Historical  
18 Society. And I'm also the location  
19 coordinator for the local Bethel Park Wreaths  
20 Across America.

21 We decided to bring the Wreaths  
22 Across America program that's held at the  
23 National Cemeteries. We decided to bring it  
24 here locally so that people didn't have to  
25 drive as far, have trouble parking, or walk as



1 far.

2 And also with this local event, a  
3 lot of the kids and the elderly are able to  
4 actually participate in this ceremony.

5 So, December 14, we really would love  
6 for everyone to come to our ceremony. It's at  
7 12 noon.

8 The Municipality, all of Council,  
9 Police, Fire, EMS, there's so many different  
10 organizations involved with this. It's great  
11 for kids. We gather the kids around the  
12 flagpole, say the Pledge of Allegiance. We  
13 have a teaching moment as far as children  
14 learning who veterans are and what they did  
15 for us.

16 And then, also, we're asking for  
17 sponsorships for wreaths. Wreaths are \$17  
18 each. And there will be forms in vari- -- in  
19 the lobby here, at the Schoolhouse, and at  
20 various other places.

21 We also have a Wreaths Across America  
22 Facebook page, Bethel Park Wreaths Across  
23 America, or the Bethel Park Historical Society  
24 Facebook page. You can write a check for \$17,  
25 and mail it to the Schoolhouse on South Park

1 Road, to the Historical Society. Or you can  
2 -- there's a QR code on the various posters.

3 And there's also forms and handouts  
4 that we will have. There will be some out in  
5 the lobby here by the Library and in various  
6 other stores across the Municipality.

7 So, we really would encourage  
8 everyone to please sponsor a wreath. But  
9 mainly to please come to the ceremony. We  
10 have at Bethel Cemetery 984 veterans. And so  
11 we need to place 984 wreaths on each grave and  
12 say that Veteran's name out loud so that they  
13 will be remembered forever every year. This  
14 is our fourth year.

15 We also do some graves down at Peters  
16 Creek Baptist Church on 88 and Church Hill  
17 Road. There's not as many there. There's not  
18 as big a ceremony there.

19 But please come and join us. I  
20 invite all of Council and every- -- I'll be in  
21 touch with everyone.

22 So, thank you.

23 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. Lisa and her  
24 group does a terrific job. It's their fourth  
25 year. And whatever support they get, whether

1       it's donations or help doing it, it's quite a  
2       ceremony.

3               So thank you, Lisa, for coming.

4               So, and that's my report.

5               PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you, Mayor.

6               Thank you, Ms. Jenkins.

7               Most of our Council actually attends  
8       and has a good time.

9               And we thank you for your volunteer  
10       and all your help.

11              Any questions on that?

12              (No response.)

13              PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Hearing  
14       none, if we could change to Approval of  
15       minutes; and Mr. Consolmagno.

20 coming up for non-agenda items only.

21 I'd like to move now for Citizens'  
22 Comments on General Policy and Finance Items.

23 We have one resident signed up to  
24 speak.

25 When you come forward, if you could

1 please state your name and address for the  
2 record.

3 MR. MACIOCE: Hello. My name's Tony  
4 Macioce, address is 5147 Brightwood Road.

5 And I come here tonight to address  
6 Council about the screening of Dumpsters and  
7 the code enforcement of that. I have received  
8 a fine for \$1,000 for not screening a Dumpster  
9 according to code.

10 And Bethel Park themselves, their  
11 schools and that are not screened in. And  
12 some of the other businesses in Bethel Park  
13 are not.

14 So I just come to see what the codes  
15 are and what we can do about it, if they were  
16 going to be addressed.

17 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. We are going  
18 -- we are in the middle of going over them.  
19 In our next committee meeting, we'll be  
20 discussing them. But, you know, tonight  
21 there's no action on the table for those  
22 items.

23 MR. MACIOCE: Okay.

24 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Thank you  
25 very much.



1 MR. MACIOCE: All right.

2 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Moving on  
3 now to General Policy and Finance; and  
4 Ms. Kamenicky.

5 MS. KAMENICKY: Thank you, President

7 I have one item tonight.

8 Proposed Ordinance Adoption, Amending  
9 Waste Hauler Ordinance.

10 I move to approve No. 9-9-24A, an  
11 Ordinance to update the Waste Hauler Ordinance  
12 amending the existing Municipal Code to  
13 reflect changes in refuse removal.

14 MR. JENKINS: Second.

15 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. I have a  
16 motion from Ms. Kamenicky and a second from  
17 Mr. Jenkins that we approve the Ordinance  
18 No. 9-9-24A, an ordinance to update the Waste  
19 Hauler Ordinance amending the existing  
20 Municipal Code to reflect changes in refuse  
21 removal.

22 Any questions or comments on this  
23 item?

24 (No response.)

25 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. This is

1 just to align our Ordinance with the actual  
2 trash hauler's policy so everything looks the  
3 same and everything is streamlined.


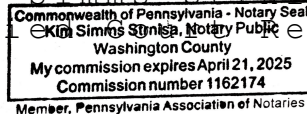
