PRESIDENT OAKES: Hearing none, could we have the Fire Chief's Report, please.

MR. USELMAN: Good evening, Council, residents of Bethel Park. My name's Rob
Uselman, Assistant Chief with the Bethel Park
Volunteer Fire Company.

And tonight I will give you the Chief's Report for August of 2024.

The rundown of incidents is we had a total of 45 incidents for the month of August: Six structure fires, one cooking fire, one

heavy equipment fire, one brush fire, three gas leaks, three CO alarms, three electrical conditions, one vehicle accident, one water main break, one assist the police, seven good intent calls, two smoke investigations, and 15 fire alarms, for a total of 45 incidents.

A busy month. Not quite as busy as we have been. We're averaging about 53 calls per month. And at that rate, we will have 633 calls for 2024, which is a near record for us. I think our highest so far in the last five years has been around 650.

So, keep in mind we are all volunteers. We love what we do, otherwise we wouldn't do it. But, you know, we do spend a lot of time answering calls. So please be careful out there.

Sentiments to the Chief about school zones and other things. So just be aware of what you're doing. And as we go into cooler months, it's important to make sure you maintain things.

We were at Community Day as well, right beside the Chief police booth. It was great to see everybody. I recommend -- we

- appreciate seeing everybody from the community.
- If you didn't get a chance to stop

 by and see us, though, there's a big day

 coming up Sunday, October 6, from 11:00 a.m.

 to 3:00 p.m., at our main station on

 Brightwood Road, right beside Bethel Bakery.

That is our annual Open House event.

And we love that day because we open our doors for the community to come and visit us and see our station -- our great station that we have. We have a lot of pride in that station.

And also talk to us about fire prevention, all kinds of -- all kinds of things about the fire department in the community.

The theme for this year is "Smoke Alarms, Make Them Work For You." We can't emphasize enough the importance of smoke detectors in people's houses, as well as CO alarms in people's houses.

So, October 6, Sunday, mark your calendars. Come down and visit us. If there's a Steeler game, we normally have it on

somewhere so everybody can watch it. We know how important that is as well.

Another big thing that will be coming out in the mail soon, and we ask residents to check your mail. We do have our second fundraising mailing that will be coming out within a week or two. I believe they're being printed this week.

So, we rely a lot on the funds that are provided from the residents that are donated to us to purchase a lot of our equipment. And it's really important. And we appreciate everything that the community does for us, as well as Council, and all the support they give us.

So we just recommend that when you see something come from the Bethel Park
Volunteer Fire Company, don't throw it away.
It's not junk mail.

So, that's all I have. Thank you.

PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very much. And thanks again for all the volunteers and all their service.

So, in any event, this weekend we have a Job Fair at our Community Center from 11:00 to 2:00. This is the third Job Fair that we have had in the last year -- actually, last year. There will be over 500 jobs available, everything from part-time to full-time and seasonal.

We also have some people that will be doing on-site interviews. And there will be hospitals that will be providing for medical training for any individuals that wish to work at the hospital. So there's some really great opportunities there.

This past weekend, as mentioned, we had our Community Day. And I would like to thank the Recreation staff for arranging and preparing for this event. Our Public Works, our Police, our Fire, and also all the groups that participated from our School District.

It was a wonderful day showing all of the good things that we have going on in Bethel Park.

This weekend, we do have the Community Yard Sale going on. Please, you know, come out. And contact our Recreation Department for maps on what properties will be participating.

Our last Farmer's Market on Corrigan

Drive will be on September 24. We will once a

month be having an indoor market. And we will

Christine had already mentioned about the spooky movie night. So, we're already going there.

And, also, in addition, there is a little bit of a competition right now going on between the Police and Public Works. The Police have chosen the duck as their motto -- or spirit animal, I guess I should call it. And Public Works has chosen the Salty, the 9-foot skeleton.
