7 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. First under
8 Chair Announcements, we have Appointment of
9 Candidates to the Bethel Park Recreation
10 Board.

11 I would -- a motion to appoint
12 Kristen Normile to an unexpired term that ends
13 on 12/31/2026 on the Bethel Park Recreation
14 Board.

15 MR. JANOSIK: Second.

16 PRESIDENT OAKES: I have a motion
17 from myself and a second from Mr. Janosik to
18 appoint Kristen Normile for an unexpired term
19 that ends on 12/31/2026 for the Bethel Park
20 Recreation Board.

25 PRESIDENT OAKES: I have a motion

1 from myself and a second from Mr. Janosik to
2 appoint Tarian Boscia to a term that ends on
3 12/31/2026 on the Bethel Park Recreation
4 Board.

5 Any questions or comments on this
6 item?

7 (No response.)

8 PRESIDENT OAKES: This is to appoint
9 two members to move our Parks and Recs Board
10 to seven members.

11 Roll call, please.

12 MS. DENNE: Mr. Consolmagno?

13 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Yes.

17 PRESIDENT OAKES: Yes.

5 PRESIDENT OAKES: Motion carries 9
6 to 0.

7 Under an added Chair Announcement is
8 a B item. An executive session was held in
9 the caucus room tonight, October 14, 2024, to
10 discuss personnel items.

11 I'd like to now move to the Reports
12 of the Officials; and the Library Director.

13 No overdue books tonight.

14 MS. McINTOSH: No overdue books.

15 My name is Christine. I'm the
16 director of your Public Library, where we
17 provide opportunities to explore, learn,
18 create, and connect.

19 I just have a few things. First, a
20 big thank you to everyone who contributed
21 during Love Your Library Month which was in
22 September. We raised \$33,637.11. That total
23 will be eligible for a partial match from a
24 \$200,000 match pool from the Jack Buncher
25 Foundation.

1 So, we're waiting to see what all the
2 libraries in Allegheny County raised before we
3 see what our match is.

4 A little over 9,000 of that was
5 individuals contributing; about \$7,500 was
6 fundraising; and our Friends of the Library
7 donated \$16,811.11. We gave them a wish list,
8 and they purchased everything on the wish list
9 for us.

10 Speaking of the friends, the Friends
11 of the Library are hosting their annual Yinzer
12 Happy Hour on Friday, October 18th, at the
13 Library from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Tickets are
14 still available. They are \$30 each or two for
15 \$50.

16 I just wanted to remind everybody
17 that the Library will be close at 5 p.m. on
18 Thursday, October 31st so that everyone can be
19 off the roads for trick or treaters.

20 So, that's all I have.

21 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very
22 much.

23 Any questions or comments?

24 (No response.)

25 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Hearing

1 none, the Police Chief's Report; and Chief
2 Arnold.

3 CHIEF ARNOLD: Good evening,
4 everyone. I just have a few announcements
5 tonight.

6 We had our first Crime Watch meeting
7 of the year this past Monday. And we'll be
8 kicking off the rest of our Crime Watch
9 meetings for the rest of the year starting
10 next Monday -- or next month, November 4th, at
11 7:00 p.m., at the Community Center.

12 We hope to see lots of you there.
13 It's a good group to get involved with and
14 find out what's been going on with the Police
15 Department and things that are happening in
16 Bethel Park.

17 We have our Duck Hunt this month.
18 So keep an eye out for our monthly Bethel Park
19 Police Department Duck Hunt. We will hide a
20 small Police Duck somewhere in Bethel Park and
21 post clues on our social media pages to help
22 you find him.

23 He can be brought back to the Police
24 Station for a prize. And this month we'll be
25 giving away a \$25 Amazon gift card.

1 More information will be posted on
2 our social media pages the day before we hide
3 the duck. So pay attention to our social
4 media there.

5 South Hills Assembly of God is
6 hosting a Trunk or Treat event on Saturday,
7 October 19th, from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Our
8 Emergency vehicles will be there passing out
9 candy. So please stop by and visit with our
10 officers.

11 South Park Shops is hosting a Trick
12 or Treat Winter Fest event on Sunday, October
13 20th, from 12:30 to 3:00 p.m. And Police,
14 Fire, and EMS will all be there participating.
15 So stop by there and visit with our Police
16 Officers, Fire, and EMS, as well.

17 And just as an end note, please
18 follow and like us on our social media pages.
19 There's lots of good information about these
20 events and other things that are going on with
21 the Police Department.

22 And we put out alerts on for traffic
23 advisories and stuff like that. So, follow
24 our social media so you can be advised of
25 these alerts.

1 That's all I have.

2 PRESIDENT OAKES: Any questions or
3 comments?

4 (No response.)

5 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very
6 much, Chief.

7 Okay. Moving on now, and the Fire
8 Chief's Report; Mr. Jonathan Mark.

9 MR. MARK: Good evening. My name is
10 Jon Mark, Second Captain of Bethel Park
11 Volunteer Fire Company.

12 For the month of September, we ran
13 one structure fire, one cooking fire, one
14 vehicle fire, one mulch fire, one equipment
15 fire, one elevator rescue, two gas leaks, two
16 electrical equipment issues, one water leak,
17 four good intent calls, six smoke
18 investigations, 20 fire alarms, and two CO
19 alarms; totaling 43 calls.

20 It's getting to be that time of year
21 when people are going to start using their
22 fireplaces. I'd like to remind everybody to
23 get their chimney inspected every year by a
24 certified professional. And that's not just,
25 you know, running a log though there and

1 saying, "Ah, I cleaned it."

2 I know multiple calls where we've had
3 the box of the fireplace break, getting into
4 the walls, and that's what caused the fire.

5 And the last thing is Halloween.
6 We'll be out and about again. So we try to
7 hit as many streets as we can. But Bethel
8 Park is a big area, there's only so many of us
9 and so much time, so, try to look out for us.

10 That's it.

11 PRESIDENT OAKES: Any questions or
12 comments?

13 (No response.)

14 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very
15 much, Captain.

16 All right. Moving on now, and we're
17 going to hear from the Manager's Report;
18 Ms. Denne.

19 MS. DENNE: Yes. I just wanted to
20 remind everybody that the Tri-Community South
21 Ambulance Service has started their annual
22 membership drive. This year, they are
23 enhancing their services by allowing for
24 electronic drive, that you can vote to have
25 yourself renewed automatically every year.

1 So please help in supporting the
2 Tri-Community South Ambulance.

3 We will have upcoming budget meetings
4 on the 15th, 21st, and 28th of this month, all
5 starting at 6:00 p.m.

6 There have been several recreation
7 events that have been rescheduled this month.
8 Please look at their Facebook page for the
9 most up-to-date.

10 One of them is the rescheduled Star
11 Party. And they have the Fall Festival
12 tomorrow at the Recreation Center, where they
13 will have the No Cook Tuesday Food Truck
14 Festival, and also indoor vendors inside the
15 Community Center. So, if you have a chance,
16 that is from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. tomorrow.

17 PRESIDENT OAKES: Any questions or
18 comments?

19 (No response.)

20 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Thank you,
21 Ms. Denne.

22 I'd now like to turn to the Mayor's
23 Report; and Mayor Allen.

24 MAYOR ALLEN: Good evening, everyone.

25 So, judging by the crowd, this is

1 exactly why we do this. When I got -- was
2 elected Mayor eleven years ago, the one thing
3 I wanted to do was recognize people who make
4 Bethel Park a special place to live.

5 Well, we got a roomful of them
6 tonight. So, that's great. So thanks for
7 coming.

8 Just a few things to go over. I
9 wanted to mention that this Friday,
10 October 18th, is our 90-Plus Luncheon. So
11 that's our residents that 90 years or older.
12 Putting out one more, you know, hoorah to get
13 it up to 100.

14 And I wanted to, you know, thank
15 Council, because we've been doing this for 20
16 years now. It was started by Mayor Morton.
17 And they're the ones that fund it. So,
18 without you, we wouldn't have a 90-Plus Club.

19 If anyone knows of anyone that may
20 not be going or might want to go, call Janet
21 here at 412-831-6800, Extension 211. You do
22 need a reservation. But that's just to make
23 sure we have you on our list.

24 And in the club itself, we send out
25 birthday cards. We do a lot of things. So,

1 we certainly respect our 90-Plus Club.

2 And we probably have four or five
3 people that are 100. Our oldest person this
4 year will be 106, so...

5 I also wanted to mention that the
6 Halloween decorating party, it's like Bethel
7 Park has followed Disney World. They started
8 decorating in August. So, keep on decorating.

9 The judging will be done October 21st
10 to the 31st. Now, we get one from each ward.
11 And then we'll recognize the winners at our
12 November Council Meeting.

13 Also, on the 26th, we have our
14 Halloween Parade -- our annual Halloween
15 Parade. That's from 9:00 to 11:00. We do two
16 routes; one in the north and one in the south.
17 So, decorate, go out, have a little tailgate
18 party or whatever.

19 The last thing I wanted to mention
20 was, this Wednesday, the 16th, is flu shot
21 day. So, if anyone is looking for a flu shot,
22 you can just show up at the Community Center
23 between 10:00 and 2:00 and get your free flu
24 shot.

25 I look forward to it every year. I

1 look forward to it after I get out of there,
2 but...

3 Okay. Now for the fun part. We have
4 a group of people here from the Interact Club.
5 The Interact Club is two -- three years?

6 AUDIENCE MEMBER: We're on year five.

7 MAYOR ALLEN: We're five. Five
8 years. Pam, that would be my next guess.

9 And one thing about the Interact Club
10 is, they're always there for us. Any time we
11 need something, I could just call Pam.

12 They did a garden out on the trolley
13 line, part of the trolley beautification. I
14 said, "We have one person that didn't come
15 back, we need help." She was there.

16 They do the -- they were in the
17 Homecoming Parade, Bethel Bounty, and they
18 also participated in Community Day.

19 What I wanted to do tonight was
20 recognize five of their members. And I
21 understand they have well over 100. But I
22 want to recognize five of the members for what
23 they did for the Job Fair. They volunteered
24 over there.

25 So, I may get the pronunciation

1 wrong, but I'll give it a shot.

2 Aleskseh Cook, Alexis King, Charlize
3 Richards, Diane Neel, and Will Neel.

4 Okay. So if you want to come on up
5 here. And also Kelsey Chapin.

6 And Rachel here, too? Or no?

7 (Applause.)

8 AUDIENCE MEMBER: This is our
9 president.

10 MAYOR ALLEN: Oh, okay. Okay.

11 AUDIENCE MEMBER: Rachel is held up
12 at another meeting.

13 MAYOR ALLEN: That's fine. That's
14 fine. I just don't want to miss everybody.

15 AUDIENCE MEMBER: Yeah.

16 MAYOR ALLEN: What we have here is
17 the recognition for the work that they do,
18 especially in this event. But we can go on
19 and on with all the events. And we'll try to
20 get them all recognized over a period of time.

21 But the recognition is, this one is
22 presented to Alekseh Cook for your willingness
23 to support the Municipality of Bethel Park,
24 the Bethel Park Job Fair, awarded this 14th
25 day of October, 2024.

1 So, I'll give you that.

2 (Applause.)

3 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. And Alexis
4 (handling). Thank you.

5 (Applause.)

6 MAYOR ALLEN: Charlize (handling).

7 (Applause.)

8 Did I say that right?

9 MS. RICHARDS: (Nods head.)

10 MAYOR ALLEN: And I also have one for
11 Diana.

12 (Applause.)

13 MAYOR ALLEN: And last but not least,
14 I have one for Will.

15 (Applause.)

16 MAYOR ALLEN: Don't sit down. I need
17 you to come back up. Come on back up. I have
18 a little something else for you.

19 So, we have -- we have these pins,
20 and it says "Volunteering to make our
21 community special." So I want to give each
22 one of you a pin also.

23 (Applause.)

24 MAYOR ALLEN: And who wants to say a
25 few words? Someone does. You're never shy

1 for words.

2 MS. GOLDBERG: Hi. Thank so much for
3 having us here. We really appreciate it. We
4 never do any of this expecting to get any
5 recognition for it. But it really means a
6 lot. So, thank you.

7 MAYOR ALLEN: Thank you very much.
8 Keep up the good work.

9 Did you want to say something else?
10 No?

11 AUDIENCE MEMBER: I'm good. Thank
12 you very much.

13 (Applause.)

14 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. And I can't
15 believe I actually -- I don't know if I forgot
16 this over the years or not.

17 But the next person I want to
18 recognize is Diane Ford.

19 (Applause.)

20 MAYOR ALLEN: I've known Diane for
21 quite a few years. And whereas, the Interact
22 Club, I call Pam and say, "Can you help us?"
23 Diane calls me and says, "Can you do this?"
24 Darn speed dial.

25 So, Diane is the executive director

1 of the Melting Pot Ministries, and certainly a
2 leader in the community.

3 Did you ever get one of those before?

4 MS. FORD: No.

5 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. Well, Tiffany
6 mentioned -- Tiffany got ahold of Kim and
7 said, "Does your dad recognize people?" She
8 said, "That's -- that's what he loves to do."
9 It's like, how did I miss you?

10 So, I've known, again, Diane for a
11 long time. She does a turkey drop. She does
12 collecting toys. She's involved in the
13 Chamber.

14 And one thing -- and I don't you if
15 you remember this. Years ago, when you and I
16 were passing out turkeys. So, we looked in my
17 back seat of my truck and it's like, "There's
18 one turkey left. So what are we going to do
19 with the turkey?"

20 She said, "Oh, I have the address."

21 So we went to Charleroi. And then we
22 got to the house, and it was like, "Diane, do
23 you --

24 MS. FORD: I was scared.

25 MAYOR ALLEN: -- want to take that

1 up?" She said, "No, you take it up." I said,
2 "Well, make sure you dial my number just in
3 case something happens."

4 So, she does a lot for the community.
5 It's been a long time, and, you know, finally
6 getting recognized tonight.

7 So, thank you.

8 (Applause.)

9 MAYOR ALLEN: This is presented to
10 Diane Ford for your tireless, and support for
11 the love of Bethel Park community.

12 I mean, that sums it all up. And --

13 (Applause.)

14 MAYOR ALLEN: We do have a
15 three-minute time limit. But we're going to
16 take Bill Ruhl's time. She can talk for five.

17 MS. FORD: Wow. Thank you very much.
18 This is an honor. I really appreciate being
19 here.

20 And for most of you guys, you
21 probably know my family has been in Bethel
22 Park since 1927. And the opportunity that we
23 have gotten to serve over all these years and
24 to be part of a great community is phenomenal.

25 We have a whole lot of work to do in

1 Bethel Park. There's a lot of need that a lot
2 of people don't recognize because that's not
3 their lived experiences.

4 But it's important for me that when
5 we see something, we do something. And so we
6 don't wait around for somebody to give us a
7 rubber stamp or to say it's okay to do --

8 MAYOR ALLEN: Well you call me.

9 MS. FORD: I call Jack and we make
10 some things happen.

11 And so, like, I appreciate the
12 recognition. But, more importantly, I
13 appreciate the people who also get up and
14 stand up and do something when they see
15 something is going on. So, all right.

16 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay.

17 (Applause.)

18 MAYOR ALLEN: All right. She's quite
19 a woman.

20 The third one we're going to
21 recognize tonight, and we actually waited
22 until most of the kids would be in bed, but
23 Bill Ruhl.

24 Bill Ruhl served on Municipal Council
25 from 1988 to '95. And I worked with Bill with

1 the State Treasury for many, many years. And
2 I thought he'd come up in his slippers. But
3 he has regular shoes on tonight, so that's
4 good.

5 If I could bring John up, please.

6 (Applause.)

7 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. Just like Diane,
8 I've known Bill for an awful long time also.

9 So we have a certificate, Bill
10 Ruhl -- or William Ruhl --

11 MR. RUHL: Yes.

12 MAYOR ALLEN: -- former Bethel Park
13 Council and Municipal Authority member,
14 presented to Bill Ruhl for distinguished
15 service to the Municipality of Bethel Park.
16 Your dedication to the residents of Bethel
17 Park is in keeping with the finest traditions
18 of public service. There's no greater service
19 to your fellow man than to be a public
20 servant.

21 So, Bill, thank you very much.

22 (Applause.)

23 PRESIDENT OAKES: Real quick,
24 Mr. Ruhl, when everyone first gets on
25 Municipal Authority, everyone loves Mr. Ruhl

1 because he's the first guy to adjourn the
2 meeting. He always motions for it. He's the
3 first one to end the meeting, so...

4 But, really, it's just -- Mrs. Ruhl,
5 Mr. Ruhl, they're really servants to the
6 community and ambassadors for Bethel Park. So
7 we want to just thank you very much from
8 Municipal Council.

9 MR. RUHL: Jack didn't -- Jack didn't
10 say much either. I'm shocked. I came here
11 expecting to have my ears burned.

12 But I got to tell you the one thing,
13 Jack and I have one major day that will always
14 go down in history.

15 MAYOR ALLEN: I know what you're
16 going to say.

17 MR. RUHL: We were going to the
18 Somerset Township. And the date you should
19 know, 9/11. We're sitting at Ann's having our
20 coffee in the morning, as we always did. And
21 Mark yelled up and said, "Turn the light --
22 turn the TV on. Somebody just ran a plane
23 into the Trade Center."

24 We turned the thing on, and we
25 couldn't leave our seats. But good, because

1 we didn't know then that that other plane was
2 coming from Cleveland, and where it did end
3 up? Somerset.

4 So, Jack and I had us some wild times
5 together during those years. And I'll never
6 forget some of the other ones. And I'm not
7 going to talk about them either.

8 And John came on our -- on the
9 Authority, and I thought, "Gee, I had to put a
10 man on Council here one time, and he was
11 chastised for being a plumber. And now I had
12 a plumber working where I might need one
13 because I can't do anything anymore."

14 So, and Diane Ford, we go back a long
15 way, Diane, and the Richardson family. And
16 I -- junior played football for me and
17 baseball, both. And I had a few others that
18 went to school with the Densons (phonetic).

19 So, I had -- I've had very little
20 time up there. But guess what? It was always
21 good times. The food was always great. All
22 right?

23 And these young people here, I'd just
24 like to say thanks. As a member of this
25 Township since 1947, and it was June 1st, by

1 the way. Everybody moved on the first of
2 June. I moved into Bethel, rented a house.
3 My dad and mother rented a house. And I have
4 never, never regretted it.

5 When I came out the Army, we came
6 back. We are in Bethel. My wife and I have
7 been here ever since. And I don't want to say
8 anything, but I hope to stay the rest of mine.
9 And 86 good years, I am ready to go.

10 And thanks, everybody.

11 Council, I know some of these
12 characters back here.

13 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Thank you.

14 MR. RUHL: That one, that's the
15 trouble one.

16 And I'm not going to say anything
17 about you. Because, after all, it was great
18 times, and your dad and I had a good time,
19 too. But he was worried about you all the
20 time. No, you weren't, really.

21 Dave Arnold, I don't know you
22 personally. But you see the shirt?

23 CHIEF ARNOLD: I saw it.

24 MR. RUHL: Two of your police
25 officers here were friends of mine. And one

1 was Lenny Zankle (phonetic), who's now passed.
2 And Lenny -- I walked in for coffee on
3 Wednesday mornings. And I walked in and he
4 had a shirt ready. He throws it at me and
5 says, "Give me the \$25." I loved the Bethel
6 Park Police ever since.

7 CHIEF ARNOLD: That's a throw-back.
8 It's been a long time since I've seen that
9 sweatshirt.

10 MR. RUHL: Oh, yeah. I bet you this
11 is 19- --

12 MAYOR ALLEN: He paid \$25 for that,
13 he got robbed.

14 MR. RUHL: But I knew Lenny when he
15 was at -- worked in the grocery store. So, we
16 went back a long way, too. And it was a great
17 time.

18 The Police Department was one of my
19 favorites. And it's why we're still able to
20 live here, and I don't worry about it. Now
21 I'm at that age where I couldn't do anything
22 about it anyhow.

23 Thank you, everybody. And thanks,
24 Bethel Park, for being a great home.

25 (Applause.)

1 MR. RUHL: You got to make room for
2 mine.

3 MAYOR ALLEN: Bill, just keep in
4 mind, you're only four years away from the
5 90-Plus Club.

6 MR. RUHL: If I'm able to make it,
7 Jack, I'll tell you what --

8 MAYOR ALLEN: You'll be there.

9 MR. RUHL: -- I'll be there. Okay.
10 Thank you.

11 MAYOR ALLEN: All right. Thank you.

12 I just had one last thing. I mean,
13 like doing this. I wanted to put a plug in
14 for my BPTV show "Jack-Of-All-Trades." Right
15 now, we're running -- I interviewed Kim Gable,
16 which she's a terrific person.

17 And next -- this week, actually,
18 we're going to do a show on graveyards in
19 Bethel Park, which I'm looking forward to that
20 one, too.

21 So, thank you all for coming. And
22 thank you for everyone that got something.
23 Thank you.

24 (Applause.)

25 PRESIDENT OAKES: Any questions or

15 I have a motion to approve the Bill List
16 20241014 in the amount of \$5,158,743.32.

17 MR. JENKINS: Second.

18 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. We have a
19 motion from Mr. Consolmagno and a second from
20 Mr. Jenkins to approve Bill List 20241014 in
21 the amount of \$5,158,743.32.

22 Any questions or comments on this
23 item?

24 (No response.)

25 PRESIDENT OAKES: Real quick, our

1 Bill List is so high this month because we had
2 some debt service payments for multiple
3 things. Our waste water treatment plant, I
4 think it was bond 20/20 A and B. So that's
5 why our Bill List is so high this month.

6 Hearing no other questions, roll
7 call, please.

8 MS. DENNE: Mr. Consolmagno?

9 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: Yes.

10 MS. DENNE: Ms. Kamenicky?

11 MS. KAMENICKY: Yes.

12 MS. DENNE: Mr. Oakes?

13 PRESIDENT OAKES: Yes.

3 Mr. Consolmagno?

4 MR. CONSOLMAGNO: That's it.

5 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Moving now
6 to the Residents' Comments section for
7 non-agenda items.

8 And I'd like to -- right now, we have
9 signed up Brandon McCarthy.

10 Please state your name and address
11 for the record. And there's a three-minute
12 time limit.

13 MR. MCCARTHY: Brandon McCarthy, 101
14 Jordan Street.

15 You guys probably all know why I'm
16 here. Jordan Street has been the subject of
17 emails that I've sent to all of you.

18 It's not safe. In talking to the
19 police, there's only so much they can do.
20 They're not allowed to police speed on our
21 street because of the state laws.

22 They can only -- they can only get so
23 many of the people making the illegal left
24 turn. They were actually there the last
25 couple days last week.

1 And for every car they pull over
2 making an illegal left turn, there's two or
3 three more cars that drive by. You can ask
4 the officers. They'll tell you the same
5 thing.

6 So, that tells me it's up to you guys
7 to do something. Something needs to be done
8 about the speeding. It's -- it's -- I -- I
9 don't have a speedometer on me. I don't clock
10 them. But if they're going 25, I'd be
11 shocked.

12 There's studies around the country
13 about traffic-calming measures that can be
14 used, things that are cheaper than more police
15 officers.

16 And I'm calling on this Council to
17 start enacting those things on my street.
18 Probably, you could do it across Bethel Park.
19 But right now, I'm focused on Jordan Street.

20 It's a cut-through for the entirety
21 of the South Hills. It's not just a
22 cut-through for people that live in Bethel
23 Park. There's people that are coming from
24 Brentwood, Baldwin, Whitehall, West Mifflin,
25 they're cutting on our street. There's people

1 coming from Upper St. Clair, Peters Township,
2 they're cutting across on our street.

3 So, something -- something -- I'm
4 calling on our Council to protect the citizens
5 of Bethel Park and get something on our street
6 to end this because it's out of control.

7 Thank you.

8 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you.

9 Okay. Signed up second, we have
10 Mr. Macioce. If he could please come up. And
11 please state your name and address for the
12 record. And there's a three-minute time
13 limit.

14 MR. MACIOCE: My name's Tony Macioce.
15 My address is 5147 Brightwood Road. Just
16 following up and just coming up here to
17 address Council.

18 I recently received a fine from code
19 enforcement, Mr. Rudolph, for a \$1,000 fine in
20 regards to a Dumpster screening. And I feel
21 like I'm just getting singled out here.

22 I got a fine for \$1,000 that I had to
23 screen my Dumpster in and move my Dumpster
24 that's been there for years. And the Bethel
25 Park School District doesn't have -- on South

1 Park Road doesn't have their Dumpsters
2 screened in. But they're enforcing rules --
3 you know, codes on me and I got a fine.

4 Mr. Oakes, your Dumpster -- I'm not
5 trying to single you out -- I mean, yours is
6 not screened in. But I got -- you know what I
7 mean, I get fined \$1,000 plus I got to screen
8 it in?

9 Like, I feel like I'm getting singled
10 out. I can't get no answers. So, I just want
11 to, you now what I mean, address counsel and
12 see what we can do here. I don't know why.
13 You know what I mean? So...

14 PRESIDENT OAKES: All right. Thank
15 you very much.

16 MR. MACIOCE: All right. Thanks.

17 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Now I'd like
18 to turn to General Policy and Finance; and
19 Ms. Kamenicky.

22 Mr. Espinar that we motion to honor a request
23 from the Bethel Park School District to
24 contribute \$100,000 towards the construction
25 of a bathroom facility at the Bethel Park High

1 School campus from American Rescue Plan Act
2 Funds.




