Keep an emergency kit both inside of your vehicle and inside of your home. Be prepared for vehicle breakdowns in cold weather and for power outages at your home. Keep your cellphones charged. Have a way to keep you and your family warm.

Be aware of weather alerts, and respond accordingly. Make sure your contact information is up-to-date with the Municipality by going to bethelparkpa.gov and clicking on the "Emergency Alerts" icon on the main page.

Winter can be a fun time for the kids, but make sure they are dressed appropriately when enjoying outdoor activities. Snow shoveling causes thousands

     of cardiac events and injuries each year.

     layers, and have a cell phone handy in case of

That's a total of 619 calls for 2024, which is a 3 percent increase from 2023.

Just a rundown here. We had 600 calls in 2023, 606 in 2002, and 535 in 2021. So the calls are always going up.

Little tips for the wintertime:

Clear snow from around your fire hydrants,

3 feet all the way around. That helps us get
to them and also see them. Also, clear out
snow from around your furnace and dryer vents.

Weather fluctuations with heavy snow can lead
to exterior vents for gas-fired appliances
getting covered, blocked or buried. This
could lead to a rapid cause of buildup -rapid buildup of carbon monoxide in your home.

Ensure all exhaust vents or any gas-fired appliances, stove -- stoves,

     are free and clear of any ice or snow buildup.

The Bethel Park Historical Society was actually formed in 1991 as a 501(c)(3). And the goal from day one was to preserve the history in Bethel Park.

Back in 1996, the Municipality dealt with the School District on the Park Avenue site, and we were able to negotiate to get the site to build a Community Center for a dollar. And we, in turn, deeded off the corner lot for the Bethel Park Historical Society.

This group kind of got more involved about ten years ago. I'm happy to report that we have raised between fundraising, grants, in-kind contributions over 1.3 million dollars to preserve the history of our community at the Schoolhouse Arts and History Center.

So I just want to say thank you to everybody.

And there's a couple things we do.

The operating costs of the building are close to \$3,000 a month. So we're building a program through rentals, whether we have, you know, tenants within the building, we have the venue available if anybody is interested in having a place for a party, the Schoolhouse is available.

But our goal is to build enough money, A, to get the building complete, which will never be done, but B would be to be able to maintain and upgrade as we need to so the building doesn't fall in disrepair.

But some -- number one is, we actually promote the Historical Society through our Facebook page, the Bethel Park Historical Society. And we have turned into running a lot of different programs and lectures.

The Upper St. Clair-Bethel Park
