Public Library, where we provide opportunities

to explore, learn, create, and connect.

This is my favorite month of the year because I like data. And we finally have our 2024 numbers in, so I'd like to present a library year in review.

One in three Bethel Park residents have an active library card. So that means that they've used it in the last year. We had just over 99,000 visitors actually come into the Library in 2024. And those visitors checked out 334,000 items.

That represents a cost savings of

7.3 million dollars if users would have

purchased these materials on their own, at an

average price of \$26 for an adult material and

18 for a juvenile.

The Library hosted 1,740 programs. And we had just under 29,000 residents attend.

7,539 patrons used the Library pickup lockers, which are located at the top of the ramp.

And our professional librarians answered 19,634 reference questions. So

that's not, you know, "What time is story
time" or "where's the restroom?" That is --
well, here's a few.

"What was Dudley Do-Right's horse's name," was one of them, and the answer is Steed.

How about "Here's a photo that my cat killed. Can you identify what bird it is?"

It was a sparrow.

And my all-time favorite this year "There is a lot of traffic on Route 70. Can you tell me why?" So, I looked on AAA, and they had the answer, so...

But what's difficult to determine are the intangible outcomes. So, like our influence on early literacy through story times or our Family Place play area, outcomes on referrals services. We often refer people for social services. And we don't really get to hear back what has happened to them. Or how to -- how to quantify connections that are made through our book groups or conversation salon.

The Library operates 58 hours a week, seven days a week, September through May, and

     be celebrating either at home or out at local

     events. According to the National Highway

Traffic Safety Administration, St. Patrick's

Day is the deadliest day on our roads due to the spike and impaired driving-related accidents.

Here are some tips to keep everyone safe. Always plan on a safe way home.

Designated drivers are not always 100 percent reliable, so have a backup plan to utilize ride shares or public transportation such as the trolley.

Remember, even one drink can be enough to impair your ability to drive safely. Never get into a vehicle with someone who is under the influence. And immediately contact the police if you suspect someone to be driving impaired.

If you are heading out to a party, the parade downtown or the bars after, stay with a group of friends whom you trust to make a good decision and prioritize everyone's safety.

Bars and restaurants are notoriously busy on and around St. Patrick's Day, so make sure to never leave drinks or other belongings unattended. Also, have a plan of where and how to evacuate crowded areas in case of an

emergency.

Make sure that if you are drinking alcohol that you pace yourself appropriately, eat regular meals and snacks, and stay hydrated.

Lastly, the cost of a DUI can be upwards of \$10,000 in legal fees, not to mention the impact it can have on your family, your job, and your license status. Ride shares are plentiful and reasonably priced compared to the alternative. Your life and the lives of others traveling the roads depend on you making the decision to not drink and drive.

So, everybody, we just want you to go out and have -- celebrate and -- but just do it responsibly, please.

MR. USELMAN: Thank you.

Good evening, Council, Mr. Mayor, residents of Bethel Park. My name's Rob
Uselman. I am the Assistant Chief with the Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company, and I am here to give you the Chief's Report for February.

Total number of incidents for

February were 36. We had two structure fires,

two motor vehicle accidents, five natural gas

leaks, five electric conditions and power

lines down, one tree on a house, one water

line break inside a structure, three smoke

investigations, two good intent calls, eleven

fire alarms, and four carbon monoxide alarms,

for a total of 36 calls for the month.

So, a relatively quiet month. We like it that way. Please be responsible when you're doing things.

One of the things to be responsible

about, if you notice the weather has gotten nicer, finally, hopefully it stays this way, but people will be out doing yardwork and stuff, burning, potentially, leaves and dried old yard materials, please follow the local ordinances and laws when you do that.

I would, first of all, not want to see anybody get in trouble with the police.

But I would also not like to see any fires get out of control and cause some major damage.

Again, we don't like fire. I don't want to see any residents, if possible.

The other thing is, obviously, everybody lost an hour of sleep this weekend. One good reminder that we have with the Fire Department is, any time there's a clock change, it's a good time to change your batteries and your carbon monoxide alarms and smoke detectors.

So we highly recommend that everybody goes home and does that. It's important to make sure those things are working properly in the event that you should have an incident.
