There will be more than 80 artists

selling a variety of one-of-a-kind treasures.

They'll be located in both the Community

Center and the Schoolhouse.

Park Avenue, with several tented areas available for dining. And in the Schoolhouse parking lot, we will have live music on the main stage, with seating available. But you feel free to bring your own lawn chair, if you'd like.

Actors from South Park Theater
Children's Theatre Program, will be providing
musical interludes between bands at the main
stage. There will also be live music on the
Community Center stage and in the lobby, as
well as inside the Schoolhouse.

Near the Splash Park and on the field, there will be children's activities, with face painting, lawns games, craft activity, in addition to the playground

We also have over a dozen businesses and organizations who will be hosting information booths at the event. And there will be many, many, many, many basket raffles, and two 50/50 raffle drawings during the event.

Parking is at a premium. Park Avenue will be closed off from Mesta to South Park Road. So we ask that you park at Lytle Station Park and Ride, here at the Municipal Building, or, best, at the high school.

We'll have shuttle buses, and they'll be available from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., leaving the high school every 15 minutes, with stops at the Lytle Park and Ride, at the Municipal Building parking lot, and they'll drop you off at the festival at the Community Center. You'll want to look for the shuttle bus stop signs at one of these locations.

     There's been a lot of complaints regarding

     e-bikes, not only in Bethel Park but in our

     surrounding communities as well.

               Many of the reports involve kids
24
     riding these bikes erratically, dangerously
```

on our roadways and on the Montour Trail.

hope is that the parents hear this and they speak with their kids about the dangers of riding their bikes in an unsafe manner, erratically on our streets and roadways.

The last thing anybody wants is to see somebody get hit by a car or in some type of crash on their bike, regardless if it's an e-bike or a regular bicycle.

So, I'd like to share some information regarding what the characteristics of an e-bike is. They are a pedi-cycle with electric assist. They weigh less than 100 pounds. The motor cannot be more than 750 watts. They have operable pedals.

They're not capable of going faster than 20 miles per hour on a level surface when powered by the motor only. Lighting must be used when operating between sunset and sunrise. You must be 16 years of age, but do not need a license.

Lastly, e-bikes may be operated on the roadway, but the operators must follow the Vehicle Code the same as any operator on the roadway.

President Oakes mentioned the Texas

flood victims. I'd like to let everybody

know, if you haven't heard already, that the

Police Department is partnering with the

Brother's Brother Foundation to collect

hygiene supplies for the Texas flood victims.

to three structure fires, one vehicle extrication, one elevator rescue, two gas leaks, four electrical conditions, one residential lockout, assisted the police one time, six good intent calls, two smoke investigations, 16 fire alarms, and three CO alarms; totaling 40 calls for the month of June. For the year, so far, we are up to 351 calls, which is about on par.
