3 PRESIDENT OAKES: Good evening,  
4 everyone. I'd like to call to order the  
5 Regular Council Meeting of December 8, 2025.

6 Ms. Denne, would you please call the  
7 roll.

8 MS. DENNE: Yes.

9 Mr. Consolmagno?

10 (Not present.)

11 MS. DENNE: Ms. Kamenicky?

12 MS. KAMENICKY: Here.

13 MS. DENNE: Mr. Oakes?

14 PRESIDENT OAKES: Here.

15 MS. DENNE: Mr. Cenci?

16 MR. CENCI: Here.

17 MS. DENNE: Mr. Janosik?

18 MR. JANOSIK: Here.

19 MS. DENNE: Mr. Jenkins?

20 MR. JENKINS: Here.

21 MS. DENNE: Mr. Espinar?

22 MR. ESPINAR: Here.

23 MS. DENNE: Ms. Garis?

24 MS. GARIS: Here.

25 MS. DENNE: Ms. Flinn?

1 MS. FLINN: Here.

2 PRESIDENT OAKES: Eight members  
3 present.

4 Could we please now stand for the  
5 Pledge.

6 - - -

7 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance  
8 was recited.)

9 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Under Chair  
10 Announcements, we had an executive session  
11 November 24th between 6:30 and 6:45 to discuss  
12 personnel issues.

13 Now I'd like to move. I'm going to  
14 grab this microphone over there.

15 (Brief pause.)

16 PRESIDENT OAKES: So, we have a  
17 couple awards that usually the Mayor would do  
18 this. But this is a Councilmember, so I guess  
19 I get the opportunity to do this and the honor  
20 of doing this.

21 So, Ms. Flinn, could you please come  
22 up here so I can embarrass you in front of  
23 everyone.

24 (Applause.)

25 PRESIDENT OAKES: So, here is a

1 plaque. Lindsay -- or, Ms. Flinn, she's our  
2 Chair and liaison to Public Works -- Public  
3 Works and Maintenance. She, unfortunately,  
4 gets to spend all the cash most of the time  
5 because we have a lot of maintenance,  
6 equipment, etcetera, that goes in and out of  
7 every day.

8 She also is on our Parks and Rec in  
9 numerous liaison positions. So, she's always  
10 there. Any time you need anything, she  
11 answers the phone. There's about a million  
12 documents she has to go through before every  
13 Council meeting.

14 So, we're really sad to see you go.  
15 We've worked together. We stood at the poles  
16 together four years ago. So, it's very sad to  
17 see you go. But we appreciate all the time  
18 and professionalism that you put into this.

19 Would you like to say a few words?

20 MS. FLINN: I'll have a few more  
21 words to say later. But this is definitely a  
22 bittersweet evening for me.

23 Thank you so much, all of Council,  
24 Bethel Park, staff, and everybody.

25 And so I'll say more later. Thank

1       you.

2                   PRESIDENT OAKES:    Okay.    Thank you  
3       again, Lindsay.

4                               (Applause.)

5                   PRESIDENT OAKES:    Okay.    Now I'd like  
6       to bring up Mr. Espinar very quickly here.

7                   MR. ESPINAR:    Thanks, John.

8                   PRESIDENT OAKES:    Mr. Espinar is on  
9       our Legislative Committee, our ambulance  
10      service, and multiple other liaison positions.  
11      He is leaving.   And it's bittersweet as well.  
12      It's sad to see him go.

13                   Again, we talk all the time.   And,  
14      you know, he helps us with the day-to-day  
15      operations.   Always a good person to have, a  
16      good ear to have to give -- to really help the  
17      community, and the time he puts in for his  
18      residents.

19                   So, Mr. Espinar, would you like to  
20      say a few words?

21                   MR. ESPINAR:    I would like to say a  
22      lot right now.

23                   Thank you first and foremost to all  
24      members of Council.   It has been an incredible  
25      journey.   Thank you to the staff as well.

1 Thank you, Chief Arnold, Chief Gerber, and  
2 Chief Morris. Some of them are here tonight,  
3 some of them are not. But it has been an  
4 incredible journey.

5 After serving in the military for ten  
6 and a half years, I have never felt that same  
7 camaraderie as I have here being on Council.  
8 This has been an incredible journey.

9 Having students of mine in the past  
10 as well in here in the room, it just  
11 highlights the special evening like this  
12 tonight.

13 I wanted to say first, thank you to  
14 my three wonderful children, Christiano,  
15 Audriana, and Santino (all phonetic). They  
16 have sacrificed a lot for -- of my time.  
17 With- -- without them -- they're my -- they're  
18 my all. So, they have been here for the last  
19 four years.

20 It has been a true honor to be able  
21 to represent the citizens of Bethel Park, a  
22 community that has given me so much since  
23 1987. I graduated from Bethel Park, served in  
24 the military. Never thought I'd come back,  
25 and here we are.

1           Thank you to former President Moury.  
2           Thank you to President Oakes. It has been a  
3           wonderful opportunity, and something that I  
4           don't take too lightly.

5           Mayor, I can't say enough. Thank you  
6           for all your support, your guidance. Your  
7           years of experience have been incredible. So,  
8           thank you. Thank you. Thank you.

9           To the residents, thank you for  
10          believing in me, trusting me, communicating  
11          with me, sharing your vision with me, and  
12          allowing me to advocate for you. It is not a  
13          responsibility that I've taken lightly.

14          So, I know Bethel Park is heading in  
15          the right way. Thank you to staff, the amount  
16          of support and...

17          I'm really upset at you right now,  
18          John, just because you didn't give me any  
19          preview that this was happening. So this is  
20          off the cuff right here.

21          But thank you, honesty, to staff. It  
22          has been -- the amount of people that have the  
23          willingness to want to do something good for  
24          our community and working together and sharing  
25          their knowledge and their passion.

1           Man, I couldn't be happier for the  
2       decision to come back to Bethel Park and to  
3       serve our community and to just be surrounded  
4       with some incredible, just incredible,  
5       incredible people, incredible people.

6           This decision is not a decision that  
7       has come lightly. This is a decision that has  
8       only kind of fueled me to be more active and  
9       power more of our wonderful youth.

10          Love you, guys. You guys are why I'm  
11       here.

12          And making sure that we continue to  
13       make Bethel Park a wonderful place to raise a  
14       family and to live and to grow old.

15          So, thank you all. Thank you from  
16       the bottom of my heart. It means a lot. Love  
17       you all. And we'll miss you guys.

18          But I will not go away. I will still  
19       somehow find my way in, hopefully, serving in  
20       another capacity to our Municipality and our  
21       community and really giving that meaning of  
22       what a community really and truly is.

23          So, thank you, thank you, thank you,  
24       thank you, it has been a true honor.

25                               (Applause.)



1                   PRESIDENT OAKES:   Thank you,  
2   Mr. Espinar.

3                   Fortunately, for me, I get to say a  
4   few things.   Unfortunately for you guys.

5                   But I would like to start with,  
6   first, I'm wearing this suit coat.   Amanda  
7   bought it for me.   But, also, my mom is tuning  
8   in on YouTube because she wanted to see me  
9   wear this.   And now she gets to see  
10   Mr. Jenkins as well wear his holiday spirit.  
11   So, that's pretty good.

12                  Mr. Espinar hit a good note.   I'd  
13   like to thank Amanda and my three kids.   That  
14   the time I spend away doing this, and the time  
15   we all spend away doing this, is -- just the  
16   time we put in is crazy.   We love the  
17   community.   We love what we do.   So -- so, you  
18   know, I have to thank you them.

19                  I'd like to go down and just spend  
20   some time and thank everyone.

21                  We'll start with Ms. Flinn, and her  
22   taking a huge liaison committee position.   It  
23   takes a lot of time.

24                  Ms. Garis, she's on a ton of things.  
25   She's on the Library Board, the School

1 District liaison committee, the community  
2 organizations.

3 Just the time everybody puts in is  
4 really great. So, I want to appreciate -- or  
5 I want to thank you, Ms. Garis.

6 Mr. Espinar, for all the above  
7 things.

8 And I have to turn to Mr. McTiernan.  
9 I believe once you're not on Council, the  
10 three-minute rule does apply. I wanted to  
11 state that.

12 Mr. Jenkins -- Mr. Jenkins, he took  
13 on the role as Planning and Zoning. That's  
14 one of our four big liaison committees. And  
15 he has to attend a bunch of meetings, Zoning  
16 Hearing Board, Planning and Zoning. And the  
17 time he puts in is just really great. So,  
18 away from his family as well.

19 So, we'd like to thank him. He's on  
20 a number of other committees as well. But  
21 that's -- that's the one that really puts in  
22 so much time and really helps our future of  
23 Bethel Park with zoning, with planning, with  
24 new building.

25 So, thank you very much, Mr. Jenkins.

1 I'd like to thank my Vice President,  
2 Mr. Consolmagno, who couldn't be here tonight.  
3 Always lending an ear and always available by  
4 phone for calling, and helping out all year  
5 long. He was my right-hand guy through the  
6 years. So I'd like to really thank him.

7 I'd like to thank Ms. Denne, our  
8 Manager. Her experience is second to none.  
9 She has to hear -- I have to hear from her.  
10 But she has to hear from me daily. And it's  
11 not always the best phone call.

12 So, she's so professional, puts in a  
13 lot of time, more than all of us. But we  
14 really want to thank Ms. Denne as well.

15 Mr. Janosik, he also serves on a  
16 bunch of boards and committees, the Library  
17 Board, the School District Board, pension --  
18 both of our pension committees, Police and  
19 non-police, which would be our regular union  
20 employee.

21 So, Mr. Janosik, thank you very much  
22 for that.

23 Health, Safety and Welfare, and  
24 Mr. Cenci. He deals with the Police  
25 Department, first and foremost. But the

1 ambulance service and everything with first  
2 responders, and really just does a great job,  
3 keeps everything sound. That's one the things  
4 we never have to really worry about.

5 So, thank you very much, Mr. Cenci.

6 Ms. Kamenicky, probably one of the  
7 most time-consuming was General Policy and  
8 Finance, budget meetings. Everything on how  
9 we move forward in Bethel Park starts with our  
10 General Policy and Finance.

11 So I wanted to make sure I thank you,  
12 and thank you for your time. I really  
13 appreciate it.

14 Last, I'd like to thank -- last but  
15 not least, I'd like to thank Mayor Allen.  
16 Whenever we have some really tough situations  
17 or, you know, we don't know where to turn, I  
18 can always call Mayor Allen, our senior  
19 statesman. He is just a grand person.

20 So, I want to thank him very much as  
21 well.

22 So, I'd like to thank our Police  
23 Department. I'd like to thank everyone. I'd  
24 like to thank Public Works, our Parks and  
25 Recreation, our Administration staff, Planning

1 and Zoning, Community Services.

2 I don't -- I don't -- I'm going to  
3 forget so many. But, you know, those are --  
4 those are the ones that are just coming to  
5 mind. But everyone day-to-day as part of our  
6 staff that really helps out.

7 Probably most important, I'd like to  
8 thank the residents, the volunteers. We have  
9 so many volunteers. That's one of the things  
10 that I was so impressed when I moved here was  
11 the volunteerism and, you know, how everyone  
12 acts as a group. I've never seen that before.

13 So, I want to thank the community,  
14 the volunteers, all the groups, and the  
15 non-profits. We wouldn't be Bethel Park  
16 without them.

17 So, without further ado, that's all I  
18 have.

19 I want to now move on to the  
20 resignation of Pam Dobos; and Mr. Janosik.

21 MR. JANOSIK: One Chair Announcement  
22 tonight, President Oakes, the resignation of  
23 Pam Dobos from the Shade Tree Commission.

24 I move to accept the resignation of  
25 Pam Dobos from the Shade Tree effective 11/30

1 of '25.

2 MR. JENKINS: Second.

3 PRESIDENT OAKES: I have a motion  
4 from Mr. Janosik, a second from Mr. Jenkins  
5 that we accept the resignation of Pam Dobos  
6 from the Shade Tree Commission effective  
7 11/30/2025.

8 And, Ms. Denne, would you please call  
9 the roll.

10 MR. JANOSIK: Hold on.

11 PRESIDENT OAKES: Oh.

12 MR. JANOSIK: One comment. I just  
13 want to give a shout out to Pam. Many people  
14 know her here. She's a -- I'm not going to  
15 say what year, but she's a Bethel Park  
16 graduate. She served on the School Board for  
17 at least a decade, maybe two. After that, she  
18 moved over to the Shade Tree Commission to  
19 help us here.

20 And I just thank her from the bottom  
21 our heart. She did a great job, and we're  
22 going to miss her.

23 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very  
24 much.

25 Any other comments?

1 (No response.)

2 PRESIDENT OAKES: Ms. Denne, would  
3 you please call the roll.

4 MS. DENNE: Ms. Kamenicky?

5 MS. KAMENICKY: Yes.

6 MS. DENNE: Mr. Oakes?

7 PRESIDENT OAKES: Yes.

8 MS. DENNE: Mr. Cenci?

9 MR. CENCI: Yes.

10 MS. DENNE: Mr. Janosik?

11 MR. JANOSIK: Yes.

12 MS. DENNE: Mr. Jenkins?

13 MR. JENKINS: Yes.

14 MS. DENNE: Mr. Espinar?

15 MR. ESPINAR: Yes.

16 MS. DENNE: Ms. Garis?

17 MS. GARIS: Yes.

18 MS. DENNE: Ms. Flinn?

19 MS. FLINN: Yes.

20 PRESIDENT OAKES: Motion carries 8  
21 to 0.

22 Thank you very much, Ms. Dobos.

23 Now we'd like to turn to the Reports  
24 of the Officials; and the Library Director,  
25 Christine.

1 MS. McINTOSH: Good evening. My name  
2 is Christine. I'm the Director of your Public  
3 Library, where we provide opportunities to  
4 explore, learn, create, and connect.

5 November statistics. We had 7,713  
6 visitors to the Library. That is an average  
7 of 257 visitors per operating day. Those  
8 patrons borrowed just over 19,000 physical  
9 items and 8,000 electronic e-book, e-audio or  
10 e-video items. That represents a cost savings  
11 of \$718,000 for the month of November based on  
12 a retail cost of a book at \$26.

13 The Library hosted 58 onsite and 54  
14 outreach programs for youth and adults, with  
15 1,916 people in attendance.

16 In addition to our regular Story  
17 Time, which we host weekdays Monday through  
18 Friday at 10:30 a.m., the Library has a few  
19 special programs this month.

20 On Saturday, December 13th, at  
21 10:30 a.m., we are hosting Sensory Explorers.  
22 This is for ages two to five, with a  
23 caregiver, where children will experience  
24 sensory exploration and learning while  
25 reading, creating, playing, and socializing.



1       This program will include multiple themed  
2       sensory stations to explore.

3               And then Sunday, December 22nd, this  
4       is usually from noon until 4, we have  
5       old-school adult Dungeons and Dragons at the  
6       Library. It's very popular. But we invite  
7       new or experienced players to come.

8               And just a few, quick announcements.  
9       The Library will be closed Wednesday, December  
10      24th and Thursday, December 25th for the  
11      Christmas holiday. And we'll open at noon on  
12      Friday, the 26th.

13              And then we will also be closed  
14      Wednesday, December 31st, Thursday, January  
15      1st for the New Year holiday. And the Library  
16      will open at noon on Friday, January 2nd.

17              And that is all I have this evening.

18              PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very  
19      much, Christine.

20              We'd like to now turn to the Police  
21      Chief's Report; and Chief Arnold.

22              CHIEF ARNOLD: Good evening,  
23      everyone.

24              Tonight is a very bittersweet night  
25      for the Police Department. We have a very

1 special recognition to make tonight.

2 K9 Officer Drew Jacobs and K9 Jeez,  
3 could you please step forward.

4 Tonight, it's my honor to recognize  
5 Jeez -- K9 Jeez and Officer Jacobs for their  
6 partnership as a K9 team.

7 You wouldn't know it, but this past  
8 weekend Jeez turned 11 years old. He's still  
9 very puppy-like. But he's had an amazing  
10 nine-year career here with the Police  
11 Department. And he is set to due -- he is set  
12 to retire at the end of the month.

13 At this time, we would like to  
14 present him with a citation and a medal for  
15 his distinguished service with Bethel Park.

16 The citation reads: The Bethel Park  
17 Police Department hereby recognizes and  
18 commends K9 Jeez and his handler Officer  
19 Jacobs for their exemplary dedication,  
20 courage, and unwavering service to Bethel  
21 Park.

22 Throughout his distinguished  
23 nine-year career, K9 Jeez has demonstrated  
24 exceptional skill, loyalty, and bravery in the  
25 line of duty. His contributions to public

1 safety, including assisting in searches,  
2 apprehensions, and community outreach have  
3 made a lasting impact on Bethel Park and its  
4 residents.

5 K9 Jeez was revered by his fellow  
6 officers for his unrelenting drive to do his  
7 job, feared by criminals who encountered, and  
8 loved by so many for his playful and friendly  
9 demeanor. The partnership and mutual trust he  
10 developed with Officer Jacobs is a bond that  
11 will last a lifetime.

12 On behalf of the Bethel Park Police  
13 Department and the Bethel Park community, we  
14 extend our heartfelt gratitude for your  
15 steadfast devotion, and wish K9 Jeez a  
16 well-deserved and happy retirement.

17 Presented this day, December 8, 2025,  
18 with deep appreciation and respect for a  
19 distinguished career.

20 (Applause.)

21 CHIEF ARNOLD: We're going to try and  
22 put the medal on him.

23 (Brief pause to take pictures.)

24 CHIEF ARNOLD: Drew just has a couple  
25 things he'd like to say really quick.

1                   OFFICER JACOBS:   Thank you, Chief.

2                   Members of Council, Mayor Allen,  
3                   Chief Arnold, fellow officers, friends, and  
4                   neighbors, I want to not just celebrate Jeez's  
5                   retirement, but his legacy as well, the legacy  
6                   of K9 Jeez, my faithful K9 partner, the  
7                   service and the commitment that we've given to  
8                   the department and the community throughout  
9                   our time.

10                  Obviously, Jeez has assisted the  
11                  department and the community with narcotics  
12                  detention, search, patrols at community  
13                  events. Jeez has answered every call with  
14                  discipline, heart, and honor. Beyond every  
15                  deployment, every suspect located, every  
16                  community member protected stood Jeez, alert,  
17                  determined, and unwavering.

18                  That dog, he's been through the  
19                  gauntlet: Running through a pane glass door  
20                  downstairs; he's been hit by a car; and he  
21                  survived a violent attack with gunfire. What  
22                  matters is Jeez never hesitated. He trusted  
23                  me and I trusted him.

24                  Again, I'd like to thank Council, the  
25                  Bethel Park command staff, Chief Arnold,

1 Lieutenant McGrail.

2 Lieutenant McGrail was very helpful  
3 with us. He maintained the car and always  
4 would make sure we would get to training. So  
5 he always helped us be up to par and helpful  
6 getting us everything we needed.

7 Any time the car needed detailed,  
8 when he was nice and bloody after going  
9 through the door or being sprayed by a skunk,  
10 which was terrible, he got that car right down  
11 to the detail shop and got us right back in  
12 service. So that was very much appreciated.

13 I'd really like to thank Andy Amrhein  
14 of the Community Foundation. He was vital in  
15 helping us raising thousands of dollars for  
16 the K9 fund. He also helped us set up a  
17 scholarship.

18 I'd like to thank everyone in the  
19 community, all the Council people, and anyone  
20 whoever supported the K9 program. That meant  
21 we had proper training, proper equipment,  
22 veterinary care, and the respect that Jeez  
23 needed to do his job was excellent.

24 Thank you to the citizens. Thank you  
25 for entrusting us with your safety and

1       welcoming Jeez into our community. In many  
2       ways Jeez is as much my dog as he was the  
3       community dog.

4               As Jeez retires from active duty, I'm  
5       really not sure what the next chapter holds.  
6       He's still very active. As you can see, he's  
7       a bit of a handful all the time.

8               A former K9 handler once told me,  
9       "When your dog retires, it's your turn to take  
10      care of him instead of him taking care of  
11      you."

12              So, we're hoping he has many more  
13      years of being at home embracing retirement.  
14      It's going to cause some headaches for me and  
15      my wife, but I wouldn't have it any other way.

16              I will forever cherish the bond which  
17      was formed between the two of us. He's by far  
18      the best partner I've ever had. I hope the  
19      foundation that we've put in place will  
20      benefit the next K9 handler, if there is one.

21              I'd like to particularly thank my  
22      wife, who embraced them just dropping this dog  
23      off one day. It was -- we got a phone call  
24      one day, and he showed up the next day. I  
25      didn't know any commands or anything. So it

1       was quite the -- quite the endeavor. She's --  
2       she's put up with a lot. The dog has  
3       destroyed most of our house, which we have  
4       repaired.

5               I'd also like to thank our former  
6       Chief, Tim O'Connor, may he rest in peace, for  
7       entrusting me with the dog.

8               Also, now Chief of Police Ron  
9       Dziezgowski from Jefferson Hills, he kind of  
10      pushed me to put in for the K9 position when I  
11      wasn't really looking into that. So, the push  
12      by those two kind of opened up the most  
13      satisfying chapter, I think, of my career in  
14      the five years -- five and a half years with  
15      Jeez.

16              Thank you again to the members of  
17      Council for your time and honoring K9 Jeez.

18                      (Applause.)

19              CHIEF ARNOLD: We'll be sad to see  
20      him go. It's not going to be the same around  
21      the station and everything without him. But  
22      we're hoping that he has a long and enjoyable  
23      retirement.

24              So, moving on. We have some other  
25      announcements to make.

1           Last week, AAA recognized local  
2 police departments for their dedication to  
3 traffic safety. I'm proud to announce that  
4 the Bethel Park Police Department once again  
5 got the Platinum Award, which is their highest  
6 award.

7           It represents the hard work and  
8 dedication that our officers and training  
9 division -- or, traffic division put forth to  
10 ensure our streets are safe and our roadways  
11 are safe for our motorists.

12          We're wrapping up another successful  
13 Toy Drive. I would like to thank all the  
14 residents and groups who so generously donated  
15 toys to our Toy Drive, or money. Especially  
16 the Community Foundation, the Bethel Park/  
17 Upper St. Clair Rotary and the Blackhawk  
18 Family Relief Fund.

19          This will undoubtedly put smiles on  
20 so many kids' faces this Christmas. And we  
21 couldn't be happier to partake in that.

22          Lastly, on behalf of the Police  
23 Department, we would like to wish everyone a  
24 safe and happy holidays.

25          And that's all I have for tonight.



1 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you, Chief.

2 (Applause.)

3 PRESIDENT OAKES: Any comments at  
4 all?

5 (No response.)

6 PRESIDENT OAKES: Is there anyone  
7 here from the Fire Department?

8 (No response.)

9 PRESIDENT OAKES: Okay. Hearing  
10 none, I'd like to turn now to the Manager's  
11 Report; and Ms. Denne.

12 MS. DENNE: Yes, just real quickly.  
13 I wanted to give kudos for our Recreation  
14 Department, who had a wonderful event with our  
15 new holiday tree lighting. If you didn't have  
16 a chance to be there, it was amazing. There  
17 was everything from making reindeer treats to  
18 Santa to holiday market (phonetic), singing.  
19 They really outdid themselves.

20 But the most important thing that we  
21 do have to mention is the gingerbread house  
22 contest. There were many entries. There's  
23 one from AllPro, even though it didn't quite  
24 make muster for reasons with their sidewalks  
25 and ramps. But we're not going to get into

1       that.

2               PRESIDENT OAKES:   Thanks, Ms. Denne.

3               MS. DENNE:   Uh-huh.

4               But the winner was --

5               PRESIDENT OAKES:   Is that the end of  
6       the report?

7               MS. DENNE:   Yeah.   Anyways, is that  
8       your microphone doesn't work anymore?

9               Our winner this year was the Public  
10      Works Department.  If you did not get a chance  
11      to see the work that they have done, they did  
12      a scaled replica of the Public Works facility.  
13      It was a Taj Mahal of gingerbread houses.  It  
14      was quite impressive.

15              I'm a little bit scared for next year  
16      what this is going to entail.  But it was  
17      great.  And I think that there was a lot of  
18      fun had within all of our employees and with  
19      Council promoting that event.

20              They still have many events that are  
21      coming yet this season, including my favorite,  
22      Reindeer Games, and also a Noon Year's event.  
23      So, please look at our Recreation page to see  
24      the events that are coming up for the rest of  
25      the month.

1           The one thing, mentioning our Public  
2 Works, that I do have to request. This time  
3 of year, we do get the snow and the bad  
4 weather starts coming in. We take for granted  
5 that, you know, our roads just kind of  
6 mysteriously end up clean.

7           Please, if you can, keep your cars  
8 off of the roads when there are winter events.  
9 That makes it much safer for our plow trucks  
10 to get through and helps them to be more  
11 expedient. Doing that is also keeping safer  
12 for all of our first responders, our Public  
13 Works, our Police, our Fire, our EMS. You  
14 know, think of them.

15           We're all cozy at home in our cuddle  
16 duds, but they're out doing the hard work.  
17 And, you know, that little bit of activity and  
18 kindness really makes their life a lot easier.

19           So, Merry Christmas to everybody.  
20 Thank you for another great year here at  
21 Bethel Park.

22           PRESIDENT OAKES: Is that all?

23           MS. DENNE: That's really all, yeah.

24           PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you for  
25 detailed report, Ms. Denne.

1 MS. DENNE: Yeah.

2 PRESIDENT OAKES: I'd like to turn  
3 now to the Mayor's Report; and Mayor Allen.

4 MAYOR ALLEN: Thank you very much.

5 Just to piggyback on the tree  
6 lighting. Normally, in the past, we've gotten  
7 between maybe 2- to 300 people. This year, it  
8 was 3:00 in the afternoon to 7:00, and we had  
9 well over 500 people there. It was amazing.

10 And for as good as the Public Works  
11 board was, which was great, they also built a  
12 table to put the Community Center on it, which  
13 was identical. So if you went outside and  
14 came inside, you were still with the Community  
15 Center.

16 I want to recognize, there's two  
17 girls -- or, two young ladies from the high  
18 school. And I know I'll screw the names up,  
19 at least the one, Kayla Weiss and Salome  
20 Ferreyra. They're with the DECA program. And  
21 they worked hand-in-hand with the Municipality  
22 to promote the tree lighting. So, a very  
23 special thanks to them. They'll be taking  
24 that project to states.

25 And also on the Christmas -- we have

1     our Christmas decorating contest, which will  
2     go through December 22. We already have a few  
3     nominations in. And if you'd like to nominate  
4     a house -- I think we have the judges. But if  
5     you'd like to nominate a house, call Janet at  
6     831-6800, Extension 211, so...

7             And finally, our last award for the  
8     year is for the Year of Community Involvement.  
9     We brought a group here today to recognize. I  
10    sent Pam Tiano a message saying, "Just give me  
11    something that I could say what they actually  
12    do." Well, she did, and I couldn't put it all  
13    on one sheet of paper. So I'll read a few of  
14    them, and then I'm conclude by saying "plus  
15    others."

16            They volunteer at the Bethel Park Art  
17    and Music Festival, Bethel Bounty, Ma and Pops  
18    Thanksgiving, all three Rotary Club  
19    fundraisers, South Park Shops holiday events,  
20    all Community Center events, and service  
21    projects, St. Clair Hospital Pink Out, Cards  
22    For Veterans, and Stockings for Deployed  
23    Military, plus numerous other things.

24            So, at this time, if the group can  
25    come up, and Pam.

1 (Applause.)

2 MAYOR ALLEN: As long as you can fit.

3 So, this is a project that -- or an  
4 award that we started at the beginning of the  
5 year for community involvement. And we've had  
6 quite a few. I'm going to say we saved the  
7 best to the last.

8 And it's for the 2025 Year of  
9 Community Involvement. In recognition of your  
10 contributions making a difference in Bethel  
11 Park, awarded for exemplary service and  
12 commitment to excellence to the Bethel Park  
13 Interact Club, December 8, 2025.

14 (Applause.)

15 MAYOR ALLEN: You're never lost for  
16 words.

17 MS. TIANO: No, never am.

18 Good evening, everybody. First of  
19 all, I want to say thank you to Mayor Allen  
20 for honoring us with this award. We couldn't  
21 be what we are without the community that we  
22 have here.

23 But I actually want to introduce our  
24 current club president, Parker Walton. And  
25 he's going to say a few words about Interact.

1                   MR. WALTON: Hello, everyone. I am  
2 Parker Walton. I'm a senior at Bethel Park  
3 High School. And I have no words to express  
4 how grateful I am for this award. So, thank  
5 you.

6                   These people, they have done  
7 phenomenal things. And I have watched them  
8 week in and week out. And please excuse the  
9 football references. Our win over the Rappers  
10 (phonetic) has me really excited. But they  
11 never sit on the sidelines. They always get  
12 in the game. Whenever they see stuff that  
13 needs done, they get in there. They just --  
14 they make me so proud day in and day out. So,  
15 we really appreciate it.

16                               (Applause.)

17                   MAYOR ALLEN: Well, we appreciate all  
18 that you do. I mean, we see your group  
19 everywhere, and which is because of Pam. But  
20 they do get out there and they do work in the  
21 community.

22                   So, thank you very much, and well  
23 deserved.

24                   MS. TIANO: Thank you so much.

25                   MAYOR ALLEN: And that's my report.

1           PRESIDENT OAKES:   Thank you, Mayor.

22 and honor to serve Bethel Park as your Ward 9  
23 Councilmember for four years.

24 Thank you Ward 9 residents and all of  
25 Bethel Park residents for trusting me to

1 represent you and advocate for you and your  
2 families. I did my best to ask the hard  
3 questions, challenge old ways of thinking, and  
4 give new perspectives and ideas. I may not  
5 have gotten everything right, but I've always  
6 had the best interest of our community in  
7 mind.

8 Thank you to my family for your  
9 support, especially my boys, Vinny and Dom.  
10 You have joined me in so many meetings and  
11 events. I hope I've shown you what it means  
12 to serve your community with compassion,  
13 curiosity and courage. You are the reason why  
14 I continue to speak up and get involved and  
15 fight for Bethel Park.

16 I knew I would get emotional, you  
17 guys.

18 My fellow Councilmembers, Mayor  
19 Allen, it's been a pleasure collaborating with  
20 you. I value your commitment to Bethel Park,  
21 and I am grateful for the friendships I've  
22 made along the way. The challenges we faced  
23 together have made me a better Councilperson.

24 Susie Dolinar and the Public Works  
25 Department, thank you for having me as your

1 Committee Chair. You are the backbone of this  
2 town, and you keep us safe every day. Bethel  
3 Park is lucky to have such a hardworking and  
4 dedicated Public Works team.

5 Recreation Board and Library Board,  
6 thank you for having me as one of your  
7 liaisons. The programming that both boards  
8 and departments provide enrich the lives of  
9 our citizens and make this community more  
10 accessible for all. I'm proud to have served  
11 alongside of you.

12 All of the Bethel Park directors and  
13 staff, thank you. Your hard work keeps Bethel  
14 Park running. And I've learned so much from  
15 your knowledge and experience.

16 Only five years ago, the former  
17 Ward 9 Councilwoman sat right here and  
18 encouraged women to run because she was the  
19 only woman on this Council for 20 years. I  
20 knew Bethel Park needed a woman's voice on  
21 Council, so I ran, hoping my perspective would  
22 add value.

23 And next month, for the first time in  
24 Bethel Park's history, we will have a woman  
25 majority Council.



1 (Applause.)

2 MS. FLINN: During the first half of  
3 my term I was the only woman in the room. And  
4 now women elected -- women in elected  
5 municipal leadership here will be so common  
6 that it's no longer news. Together, we're  
7 building a Council that better reflects the  
8 people of Bethel Park and redefines what's  
9 possible.

10 So, I am beyond excited for what  
11 comes next, and I hope you all will be a part  
12 of it. Your voice, your perspective and your  
13 experience matter. So make the public comment  
14 at the meeting, join the board and commission,  
15 or even run for office. There's a place for  
16 you in Bethel Park leadership.

17 Thank you for having me as your  
18 Councilwoman. I leave tonight inspired and  
19 humbled by my time here. It's truly been an  
20 honor to serve. Thank you.

21 (Applause.)

22 PRESIDENT OAKES: Thank you very

24 -- we will all miss you very much. Appreciate  
25 all the dedication and time you put into this.


