4 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: I'll call the
5 August 10, 2026 Regular Council Meeting for
6 Bethel Park to order.

7 Can I have the roll call, please.

8 MR. BURNS: Ms. Ford?

9 MS. FORD: Here.

10 MR. BURNS: Ms. Kamenicky?

11 MS. KAMENICKY: Here.

12 MR. BURNS: Mr. Oakes?

23 with an excused absence.

1 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Showing eight
2 members.

3 Can we please stand for the Pledge of
4 Allegiance.

6 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance
7 was recited.)

8 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Okay. No Chair
9 Announcements this meeting.

10 I just hope everyone's enjoying their
11 summer. I know it's going very quickly.
12 We're already at August 10th, and we're less
13 than a month away from school starting again.
14 So, I just hope everyone is having a safe and
15 happy summer.

16 Moving on to Reports of the
17 Officials; and the Library Director.

18 MR. BURNS: She's not present today.

19 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Ms. McIntosh has
20 an excused absence.

21 Moving on to the Police Chief; and
22 Chief Arnold.

23 CHIEF ARNOLD: Good evening,
24 everyone.

25 I would like to start out tonight and

1 thank everyone for -- who participated in our
2 National Night Out event, which was last
3 Tuesday night. It was an incredible night.
4 There was a large -- a very large turnout. It
5 was really nice to spend our time with our
6 residents and get to know them and enjoy that
7 evening with them.

8 I want to give a special thank you to
9 Susie Dolinar and the Public Works team for
10 helping us get set up and for cleaning up the
11 event afterwards.

12 And to Officer Carruba, who planned
13 the evening and made it so special for
14 everyone.

15 So, like President Janosik said, it's
16 already August, and that means one thing, that
17 school is right around the corner. So we're
18 asking everyone to please drive safely around
19 our schools and our school zones. Please
20 watch out for kids standing on the side of the
21 road and waiting for the bus in the morning.

22 And a reminder to everyone that it's
23 illegal to pass a school bus when it has its
24 stop sign activated.

25 Our buses are equipped with cameras.

1 And if a car passes the bus while the stop
2 sign is activated, the camera will pick up
3 that car and their registration, and you will
4 get a citation in the mail and a phone call
5 from one of our Traffic Division officers.

6 There's a hefty fine that's
7 associated with it. And there's a 60-day
8 license suspension. So please do not pass a
9 school bus.

10 We are hiring. The Police Department
11 is now accepting applications for new police
12 officers. Interested applicants can find
13 information on how to apply on our website or
14 on our social media pages. If you or someone
15 you know wants to start a rewarding career,
16 please, I encourage everyone to apply and to
17 join our team.

18 Some upcoming events. The Police
19 Department is collecting school supplies for
20 SHIM and the Bethel Park School District's
21 Karen's Closet. Please consider making a
22 donation to help the kids out as they start
23 the school year.

24 There's a collection box located in
25 the Police Station lobby. And that would be

1 for school supplies, crayons, pencils, papers,
2 stuff like that.

3 There's an upcoming online webinar
4 called Protecting Seniors Online. It's going
5 to be on Wednesday, September 9th, at
6 1:00 p.m. It's designed for older adults,
7 caregivers, family members and anyone who
8 wants to learn how to prevent cyber crime
9 while online.

10 This webinar is free. And it's being
11 hosted by the Pennsylvania Office of Homeland
12 Security, the Pennsylvania Attorney General's
13 Office, and the Pennsylvania State Police.
14 You can also find information on our social
15 media pages on how to register for that.

16 There's another free event for our
17 older residents, which is the Senior Fair --
18 the Senior Resource Fair, which will be on
19 Thursday, August 13th, from 9:30 a.m. till
20 noon. It's going to be at the Bethel Park
21 Community Center. And it's hosted by LifeSpan
22 Bethel Park and Life Options Pittsburgh.

23 Our very own Officer Carruba along
24 with over 30 senior industry and community
25 providers will be on hand to help discuss how

1 their products and services can help
2 individuals as they age.

3 Lastly, as always, I encourage you
4 to follow us on our social media to keep up on
5 information that we're putting out and any
6 activities that we have coming up.

7 That's all I have for tonight.

8 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Thank you, Chief
9 Arnold.

10 CHIEF ARNOLD: Yep.

11 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Moving on to the
12 Fire Chief's Report.

13 And is it First Lieutenant Mark?

14 MR. MARK: First Captain.

15 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: First Captain
16 Mark. Sorry.

17 MR. MARK: Good evening, everyone.
18 Jon Mark, First Captain for the Bethel Park
19 Volunteer Fire Company. This is the Chief's
20 Report on behalf of Chief Russ Beeson.

21 The month of July, we ran a total of
22 91 calls. Those were 37 fire or CO alarms,
23 seven service calls, 23 electrical hazards,
24 five gas leaks, two outside fires, 10
25 structure fires, one vehicle fire, five

1 vehicle accidents, and one damage assessment.

2 Hours for the month of July:

3 Response man hours, 277; 675 event man hours;
4 training man hours, 288, for a total of 1,240.

5 The top five responders for the month
6 that does not include the Chief Officers:

7 Fire police, Joe Heyl and Al Wright;
8 firefighters Flume, Landing (phonetic), Lynch,
9 Jr., Captain Innocenti, and Lieutenant
10 McGough.

11 As I said, 1,240 man hours for the
12 month of July is very high. Currently through
13 the month of July, we had responded to 532
14 calls since January 1st of 2026; averaging 76
15 calls for service a month. So, roughly, two
16 and a half calls a day for seven days a week.

17 We are currently up to 106 calls in
18 the same time span of last year. The
19 Department is well in pace to reach over 800
20 calls for service in 2026, which is
21 unprecedented for all-volunteer Fire
22 Department.

23 Mark your calendars now.

24 October 4th, we will be holding our Annual
25 Open House at the Brightwood Station, the main

1 station. This is a great time to come tour
2 the station, see our equipment, and get to
3 know your firefighters. We will have several
4 educational sessions throughout the day. Stay
5 tuned for further information.

6 We still have availability for our
7 Citizens Fire Academy. If you want to
8 register, I believe Deputy Chief Uselman said
9 that the cutoff was August 23rd. But if you
10 missed that, he said, if we have room, we'll
11 still take more people. I think, right now,
12 we have like seven signed up right now. So,
13 we're looking for more.

14 And, as always, thank you for your
15 support of our fundraiser and your donation.
16 If you have not had the chance, please
17 consider supporting your Fire Company.

18 That's it.

19 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Thank you, First
20 Captain Mark. Appreciate it.

21 Next up is the Manager's Report.

22 Ms. Denne has an excused absence
23 tonight.

24 And in her place, Assistant Manager
25 Jhad Burns.

1 MR. BURNS: So, I just have a few
2 things to discuss.

3 So, we do have the Bethel Park
4 Farmers Market. It's continuing every Tuesday
5 rain or shine through the end of September on
6 Corrigan Drive, by the skating rink in South
7 Park.

8 So, tomorrow may not be the official
9 birthday of the market, but we're using it to
10 celebrate the 20 years of our award-winning
11 Farmers Market.

12 We'll have additional activities
13 alongside your regular vendor lineup,
14 including free face painting, a community
15 craft station, collective memory board, and
16 other raffles and limited edition market
17 merchandise.

18 And the upcoming Farmers Markets over
19 the month will also include a School Supply
20 Drive on August 18th, a Dog Day at the Market
21 on August 25th, Back-to-School Week on
22 September 1st, and Harvest Flavors of the Week
23 on September 8th.

24 So if you haven't had a chance to
25 come down to the market at all, make sure you

1 stop by before the season's over.

2 We also had a very successful
3 hazardous waste event on August 1st. We had
4 131 vehicles showing up to dispose of
5 hazardous materials such as paint,
6 Freon-containing devices, propane tanks,
7 batteries and bulbs, and other waste.

8 We were aiming for at least 100
9 drop-offs. And we had 131. So we exceeded
10 our expectations with the number of people who
11 dropped items off. This helps not only
12 protect our environment by properly disposing
13 of hazardous materials, but also helps the
14 safety of Waste Management Services disposing
15 of things that shouldn't be in the trash.

16 Also, on Saturday, September 5th and
17 Sunday, September 6th, you can turn in your
18 clutter for cash during the Community Yard
19 Sale weekend. You can set up right at your
20 home. There's no need to haul your items
21 anywhere.

22 You can register on our website. And
23 you can get registered, and you'll receive a
24 yard sign to let neighbors know that you're
25 open for business. All registered homes will

1 be featured on a community yard sale map. And
2 that will be shared with others who are
3 interested. You can place your sign in your
4 yard on the days you choose to participate and
5 get ready for the weekend.

6 If you register by August 28th,
7 you'll be able to do so and get all those
8 additional things included. And, again, you
9 go to our Recreation website to sign up.

10 And that's all I got.

11 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Thank you,
12 Mr. Burns.

13 Next up is the Mayor's Report; and
14 Mayor Allen.

15 MAYOR ALLEN: Thank you,
16 Mr. President.

17 I want to thank Mr. Burns, because I
18 didn't have to look at my list and cross
19 things off because he said it. So I
20 appreciate that.

21 MR. BURNS: I got your back.

22 MAYOR ALLEN: I have a few items for
23 tonight. The first one is our Splash Park.
24 We have our Splash Park Cinema Movie, which is
25 this Thursday at 8:30. So, I'm sure that will

1 probably be the last one of the year since
2 it's August 15th.

3 Yard waste drop-off, we're having
4 that again on August 15th from 8:00 to
5 2:00 p.m. over at Public Works.

6 And I'm bringing it up now because
7 our Community Day is September 12th. So that
8 will be before our next Council meeting. The
9 parade starts at 9:00. And it's in the high
10 school parking lot. If anyone hasn't been
11 there before, please come. If you have been
12 there, I'm sure you'll be back.

13 One last plug for our 90-Plus Club.
14 If you have any residents, neighbor, family
15 member that's over 90 years old, we have a
16 club. We have one luncheon every year for
17 everyone that's over 90.

18 Last year, we had almost 100 people
19 there. We also send them birthday cards,
20 Christmas cards. So if you know anybody,
21 we're looking to increase that.

22 Also, Concert in the Park, at
23 Millennium Park on August 20, and that's from
24 6:00 to 8:00 p.m.

25 And my big thing tonight is, I met a

1 young lady -- well, it's probably maybe six,
2 eight months ago, and she's a Bethel Park --
3 or she was. She's graduated now. She's a
4 Bethel Park student. And we saw her article.
5 She's a weightlifter.

6 So, I said, "Well, you know, we need
7 to contact her." So, we did. And we put a
8 show together, the show that I do,
9 Jack-Of-All-Trades. Molly came in, and we
10 talked about everything that she's done, where
11 she was planning to go, and just her future.

12 So, she's here tonight with us.
13 She'll tell you that she went to the Special
14 Olympics USA up in Minnesota, and she came
15 back with a lot of medals.

16 So, at this time, I want to bring
17 Molly up, and her dad, Mike.

18 (Applause.)

19 MAYOR ALLEN: So, our own Bethel Park
20 Olympian.

21 Congratulations, first of all.

22 MOLLY MATHIAS: Thank you.

23 MAYOR ALLEN: Mike.

24 I'll read the Recognition. And then
25 we'll ask her a few questions, like what she's

1 doing now. And I know she deadlifts --

2 Is that what it's called? Deadlift?

3 MR. MATHIAS: (Nods head.)

4 MAYOR ALLEN: -- over 200 pounds.

5 So, I'm going to move over a little
6 bit.

7 But this is a Certificate of
8 Recognition, presented to Molly Mathias, while
9 representing Bethel Park, winning and
10 powerlifting medals at the 2026 Special
11 Olympics U.S. Games in Minnesota, awarded this
12 10th day of August 2026, with my signature on
13 it.

14 So, there's your certificate, Molly.

15 MOLLY MATHIAS: Okay.

16 (Applause.)

17 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. I know you have
18 a couple things written down there. So, tell
19 us what's going on.

20 MOLLY MATHIAS: I -- hello. I am
21 Molly. I had a great time at the USA Games.
22 This summer, I won three medals. One silver
23 for bench press, bronze medals for deadlift
24 and squat.

25 MR. MATHIAS: So, let me ask you,

1 Molly. What did you -- how much did you bench
2 press?

3 MOLLY MATHIAS: 2-0 --

4 MR. MATHIAS: No.

5 MOLLY MATHIAS: Oh. 206 pounds.

6 MR. MATHIAS: So, she benched pressed
7 106 pounds.

8 The deadlift was?

9 MOLLY MATHIAS: 208.

10 MR. MATHIAS: 208 pounds.

11 MOLLY MATHIAS: 208 pounds.

12 MR. MATHIAS: And then how much did
13 you squat?

14 MOLLY MATHIAS: 1,204 [sic].

15 MR. MATHIAS: 124. So, yeah, so
16 Molly won a silver medal in the deadlift for
17 her 208 pounds, a bronze medal -- I'm sorry.
18 A silver medal for her bench press of 106
19 pounds, a bronze medal for deadlifting 208,
20 and then a combination of all three lifts of
21 438 pounds won her a bronze medal. So she had
22 three medals at the games.

23 (Applause.)

24 MR. MATHIAS: And just a couple other
25 facts quickly.

1 So, the University of Minnesota
2 campus, back June 19th through June 27th,
3 there's teams from all 50 states, over 3,000
4 athletes, 10,000-plus volunteers to make it
5 all happen over the course of a week.

6 There's 90 athletes from
7 Pennsylvania. Molly was the one female
8 powerlifter. And, actually, she's the only --
9 she's the first female powerlifter to
10 represent Pennsylvania ever at the U.S. Games,
11 so...

12 (Applause.)

13 MR. MATHIAS: So we want to thank the
14 Special Olympics folks, both nationally, for
15 what they do with that event every four years.
16 But then, like, the Pennsylvania Leadership
17 Team, you can imagine getting 90 athletes from
18 all over the state to Minneapolis and back,
19 with families, and logistics, and everything
20 they do with volunteering.

21 They stay in the dorms all week in
22 Olympic Village. So, organizing that with all
23 the athletes, it's a big undertaking. So,
24 they do do a ton.

25 Who else do we want to thank, for

1 sure, here locally, Molly?

2 MOLLY MATHIAS: And I just want John
3 and Heather.

4 MR. MATHIAS: Yeah, the local -- John
5 and Heather Dennis. They own and operate the
6 Teleo Performance Gym over on Paxton Drive.

7 So, the only reason why Molly is
8 doing this is really because of them. They
9 started this Special Olympics Powerlifting
10 team years ago, got her involved in it maybe
11 three years ago.

12 So they dedicate their time, their
13 gym, they coach, they train. They're really
14 friends to all these athletes.

15 So, they do an amazing job, John and
16 Heather. And then Heather, especially, is
17 Molly's, like, direct trainer and coach.

18 And really a great friend of yours
19 now, right?

20 MOLLY MATHIAS: Yeah.

21 MR. MATHIAS: So, Heather does just a
22 great job. She actually came out and stayed
23 in the dorms with Molly for a whole week. So
24 she kind of went over -- above and beyond.
25 That kind of helped, which really allowed

1 Molly to do this, because you have to stay in
2 the dorms, and your parents aren't allowed in
3 there with you.

4 So, you know, really I owe them
5 everything for getting her involved in this.
6 They run a great business over there. And,
7 again, they open up their gym to -- and run
8 this, you know, to train Molly and other
9 athletes multiple times a week and, you know,
10 dedicate their time over there at the Teleo
11 Performance Gym.

12 So, thank you to them.

13 MAYOR ALLEN: I had the opportunity
14 to speak with them and watch Molly train over
15 there. And they -- they do a great job.

16 I mean, but now, I was thinking, your
17 dead weight 208 pounds, we could always use
18 security guards at the Library. So if you're
19 not doing anything, we might be able to get
20 you a part-time job protecting us.

21 So, anyhow, thank you again.

22 (Applause.)

23 MAYOR ALLEN: And that's my report.

24 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Thank you, Mayor
25 Allen.

1 Congratulations, Molly.

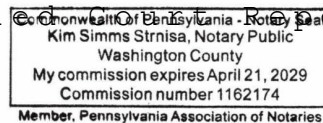
