It is an unopened portion of Barlynn Drive off of Thornwood Drive, between Lots 43 and 44 in the Plan of Lots. They've also

attached to their application exhibits, survey exhibits as required by Municipal Code for each lot, which would divide the unopened portion of Barlynn Drive, half going to Lot 43 and half going to Lot 44 of the Ruthfred Acres plan.

I've provided the Court Stenographer for her record a list of all the public exhibits. And we have a public exhibit list made of everything in the file. I'll just go through those quickly.

We have the application. We have the site location map. We have the two exhibits for both properties.
