PRESIDENT MOURY: All members present and accounted for.

This is a Public Hearing for the 2023 Municipal Budget. The way it will work, just for the public's information, is Lisa Lapaglia, who is our Finance Director, will give an overview of the budget.

At that time, we will open the floor up for Residents' Comments. If you're in opposition, opposed to the budget or you're a proponent, in favor of the budget, then there will be an opportunity for Council to speak.

So at this time, Ms. Lapaglia, would you please give an overview of the budget.

MS. LAPAGLIA: Sure.

and lows for the Municipality. The highs include the inaugural series of our Park and Play program series, the continued success of our No-Cook Tuesdays, our acclaimed Bethel Park Farmer's Market, the expansion of the Live Well Speaker Series, the Kindness Project, and the continued upgrade of our neighborhood parks.

The lows can be associated with the ever-increasing cost of supplies and materials, and the continued frustration with supply chain management, and noticeable absence of labor.

As we emerge into 2023, the challenges we face require a balance between fiscal restraint and responsibility. To achieve that balance, we must maintain the level of service and amenities that Bethel Park has become known for, while ensuring we obtain the best value with taxpayer dollars.

To facilitate this, the Municipality may need to pause key Capital Projects until this time of uncertainty has passed.

The most anticipated Capital Project for 2003 is the Splash Pad Project. With the combination of grants, fundraising, and allocated reserve funds, the Municipality is excited to get this project under way.

There are several programs and functions the municipal staff is eager to introduce in the coming year. Included are the balanced budgets for the General Operating Fund, Sewage Fund, Capital Projects Fund,

- 1 Liquid Fuels Fund, and the Fire Department Tax 2 Fund.
- In 2003, we are again able to

 maintain the current millage rate of 2.44

 mills for Municipal purposes and .34 mills

 for the Bethel Park Volunteer Fire Company on

 each dollar of assessed valuation, while

 continuing to provide an exceptional service
- We are also happy to report there
 will be no increase of utilization fees in the
 Sewage Fund.
- I was going to say, could I move that?
- MR. CHRISTIAN: You tell me and I'll move it.
- MS. LAPAGLIA: Go ahead.

to our residents.

- Okay. We're going to do a general
 budget overview, and then go through each
 individual overview or fund as we discuss key
 points.
- So, go ahead. Go ahead. Go ahead.
- This year, our Total Municipal Budget for 2023 is \$72,894,509. This is inclusive of fund balances.

You will see on the chart our General Operating Fund has the largest budget, then our Sewage Fund, followed by our Capital Projects Fund, and the Fire Department, and Liquid Fuels Fund.

We'll talk about the General
Operating Fund. This year, General Fund
Revenues are increasing by 1.4 percent or
\$319,245. This minimal increase is a
combination of increased grant funding for
Act 205 Pension Relief and realignment of
multiple items based on historical data and
changes in economic conditions.

On this chart, I am showing you what the breakdown by category is. Our enabling taxes, which are the earned income taxes, local services tax, are our biggest revenue generator, followed by real estate taxes, and then we have a combination of departmental grant, licenses and rents from there.

I also am showing how a budget dollar is distributed by department. We have -- Public Safety is our largest distributed

department at 30 cents per dollar spent on that department.

We then spend for Inter-Fund

Transfers, which is primarily Capital

Projects, 23 cents per dollar based on this

budget, and then Public Works follows.

Our least amounts that we spend are on Debt Service. We only spend three cents per dollar on Debt Service. And on insurance, we spend two cents per dollar on insurance.

Go ahead.

In this slide, I wanted to show you that based on category -- the way our budget is set up, we have categories: Salary and Wages, General Expense, Utilities, and Employee Benefits.

Based on category, you can see that on the overall budget of \$23,832,000, we spend about 41.2 percent, or a little over 9.8 million dollars on Salaries and Wages.

We also spend about 5 million dollars on General Expenses. This includes supplies, training, conferences, general building maintenance, that type of thing.

We have Utilities, which are

inclusive of, obviously, the gas, electric,
water. We do include our sanitation under
this utility because that is a cost to the
Municipality.

And then we spend about 4.3 million dollars or 18 percent of the overall budget on Employee Benefits. This would be the pension costs, tax costs, and contractual costs such as sick day buy-back and longevity.

We then spend about 3.4 percent on Debt Service, and 2.4 percent on Insurance costs.

Okay. Go ahead.

I incorporated this slide to show you that over the last year into this year, we are -- or have increased our personnel from 108 full-time equivalents.

A full-time equivalent is, obviously, a full-time individual that works 40 hours a week. And then any partial is considered a half-time equivalent to the department. We are looking to have 113 full-time equivalents budgeted in the 2023 budget.

Okay. Go ahead.

The next fund that I'd like to discuss is the Sewage Fund. We -- as I said before, we are holding the line on fees, utilization fees. We are budgeting revenues at 10 million dollars -- 10.3 million dollars, and expenses at 11.4 million dollars.

We have a healthy fund balance in the Sewage Fund. And, primarily, the difference in that money is for Debt Service that we have incurred.

So as you can see, Debt Service is our largest expense out of the Sewage Fund, at about 20.9 percent of the total budget.

Go ahead.

The next fund we have is Capital Projects. I have listed here, we have budgeted this year for 13.5 million dollars in Capital Projects. Community Service being our largest Capital Projects breakout. That includes the Road Program, Parks, Adjustments, different stormwater management areas.

So that's primarily the bulk of what we would spend in Capital Projects. As I stated before, we will obviously be cognizant

of what we're spending as far as Capital
Projects are concerned.

And this money is primarily funded through grants and a transfer out of the General Fund. So we will be well aware of what the Fund Balance or Reserve Balance is in General Fund as we move forward on these projects.

Go ahead.

In summary -- oh, go ahead.

I just wanted to point out what the Fund Balance are for the General Operating Fund, the Sewage Fund, and the Fire Department Tax Fund.

Capital Projects and Liquid Fuels do not necessarily carry a Fund Balance because they are funded either in or out. They're inflows or outflows totaling to other sections of the budget. These are only sections that actually carry a Fund Balance.

So you can see over time, from 2020 to 2021, we had a little bit of an increase.

2021 to what we anticipate completing at the end of this year, we have a little bit of an increase.

And then in 2022 to 2003, we anticipate a decrease. And that decrease is based on the transfers to fund the Capital Projects.

I wanted to provide this slide to show Neighboring Communities. These are communities that directly touch our community.

I wanted to show what the Millage
Rate was per community, what the Median
Property Value was per community, and the
Annual Tax Cost per community based on that
Millage Rate and the Medium Property Value.

I also wanted to show populations for each individual community, and then how much the cost per resident is based on assessed value times the millage rate, divided by the population within the community.

We are not necessarily the lowest, but we are not the highest either.

Go ahead.

In closing, I just wanted to point out that the information in this presentation is preliminary and will be reviewed until final adoption on November 14th at the Regular

Capital, we have a lot of money invested or projected to spend in Capital Projects.

I would ask staff, if this is adopted, that maybe we come up, come January, with a timeline. We always budget, and we have a wish list of what we want to do. I think when we get to that point, let's think about what we can do.

Some of the projects is the Splash

Pad. We ran into some delays, some beyond our control.

The market is an example with the Fire Department. We hit some renovations planned for this year. We bid them out mid-summer. They came in 50, 60 percent higher. We reevaluated and kind of pushed things off until, hopefully, 2022 -- or, excuse me, '23 or '24.

So just because everything is in here we're hoping to get done, we just really got to think about, from the staff's perspective, how much we can digest, how much

we can realistically do.

We kind of have our wants and our needs and prioritize. Road Program, things like that aren't going to be hampered. But we need to really sit back and decide on what are our priorities, what are the community's priorities.

We're taking a little different approach even on our mobility with sidewalks. We have some long-range plans for maybe some intersection upgrades. We're implementing strategies from the Blueprint Bethel Park.

So there's just a lot of moving parts to this. And I know we only meet twice a month. Lawrence gets 400 phone calls a week. But it's -- there's a lot going on here. And we really need to decide what our priorities and what the community's expectations are.

And the best news is, we're able to do this without really raising our taxes, whether it's on the Municipal side, on your property, or it's on the sanitary sewer side.

A year and a half, two years ago, we did a 30 million dollar bond issue to fund
