4 MAYOR ALLEN: Welcome, everyone, to
5 our Reorganization Meeting.

6 I was sworn in a couple weeks ago, so
7 I had the opportunity to swear our new Council
8 in.

9 So, what we'll do is we'll do it by
10 Ward, one at a time. We have a Bible, if you
11 want it.

12 Family, you can come up, you can hold
13 the Bible. Whoever wants to do pictures,
14 that's fine, too.

15 So, we'll start with Ward 1; and
16 that's Diane Ford.

17 (Applause.)

18 MS. FORD: Who you want to hold the
19 Bible? Mom, do you want to hold the Bible for
20 me?

21 MR. OAKES: Microphone. Microphone.
22 Bring up the microphone.

23 (Brief pause.)

24 MAYOR ALLEN: Diane, if you'd go out
25 front. And put your left hand on the Bible.

1 If you'd raise your right hand, and just
2 repeat after me.

3 (Ms. Ford recited the oath along with
4 Mayor Allen as follows:)

5 MS. FORD: I, Diane Ford, do solemnly
6 swear that I will support, obey, and defend
7 the Constitution of the United States and the
8 Constitution of this Commonwealth. Further, I
9 will obey all the rules of the Home Rule
10 Charter of the Municipality of Bethel Park,
11 and that I will discharge the duties of my
12 office with fidelity, so help me God.

13 MAYOR ALLEN: Congratulations.

14 (Applause.)

15 MS. FORD: Okay, family, let's come
16 up here so we can take a picture.

17 - - -

18 (Brief pause to take pictures.)

19 MAYOR ALLEN: All right. Ward 3;
20 John Oakes.

21 (Applause.)

22 MR. OAKES: Do you want to hold it?
23 Or should we have Ms. Denne hold it?

24 MAYOR ALLEN: Yeah.

25 Ms. Denne?

1 MS. DENNE: This is a little --

2 MR. OAKES: This is the real deal
3 here.

4 MS. DENNE: Oh, I don't know, this is
5 a little heavy here, John.

6 MAYOR ALLEN: We don't want the
7 lightening hit.

8 MS. DENNE: I know. It hasn't
9 happened at St. Val's (phonetic) yet, though.

10 MAYOR ALLEN: Well, that's good.

11 Raise your right hand, and repeat
12 after me.

13 (Mr. Oakes recited the oath along
14 with Mayor Allen as follows:)

15 MR. OAKES: I, John Oakes, do
16 solemnly swear that I will support, obey, and
17 defend the Constitution of the United States
18 and the Constitution of this Commonwealth.
19 Further, I will obey all the rules of the Home
20 Rule Charter of the Municipality of Bethel
21 Park, and that I will discharge my duties of
22 my office with fidelity, so help me God.

23 MAYOR ALLEN: Congratulations.

24 MR. OAKES: Thank you, Mayor.

25 (Applause.)

1 MAYOR ALLEN: All right. Joe, repeat
2 after me.

3 (Mr. Janosik recited the oath along
4 with Mayor Allen as follows:)

5 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: I, Joe Janosik,
6 do solemnly swear that I will support, obey,
7 and defend the Constitution of the United
8 States and the Constitution of this
9 Commonwealth. Further, I will obey all the
10 rules of the Home Rule Charter of the
11 Municipality of Bethel Park, and that I will
12 discharge the duties of my office with
13 fidelity, so help me God.

14 MAYOR ALLEN: Congratulations.

15 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Thank you, Mayor.

16 (Applause.)

17 - - -

18 (Brief pause to take pictures.)

19 MAYOR ALLEN: Alison?

20 MS. PICCOLINO: Yep.

21 MAYOR ALLEN: Raise your right hand,
22 repeat after me.

23 (Ms. Piccolino recited the oath along
24 with Mayor Allen as follows:)

25 MS. PICCOLINO: I, Alison K.

1 Piccolino, do solemnly swear that I will
2 support, defend the Constitution of the United
3 States and the Constitution of this
4 Commonwealth. Further, I will obey all the
5 rules of the Home Rule Charter of the
6 Municipality of Bethel Park, and that I will
7 discharge the duties of my office with
8 fidelity, so help me God.

9 MAYOR ALLEN: Congratulations.

10 MS. PICCOLINO: Thank you so much.

11 (Applause.)

12 MR. PICCOLINO: I want you all to
13 know, out of all the people I know, she's
14 wonderful.

16 (Brief pause to take pictures.)

17 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. We have one more
18 left; Jillian.

19 Jillian is being sworn in by someone
20 else.

21 MR. AQRA: All right.

22 (Ms. Kautzman recited the oath along
23 with Mr. Agra as follows:)

24 MS. KAUTZMAN: I, Jillian Kautzman,
25 do solemnly swear that I will support, obey,

1 and defend the Constitution of the United
2 States and the Constitution of this
3 Commonwealth. Further, I will obey all the
4 rules of the Home Rule Charter of the
5 Municipality of Bethel Park, and that I will
6 discharge the duties of my office with
7 fidelity, so help me God.

8 MR. AQRA: Congratulations.

9 MS. KAUTZMAN: Thank you.

10 (Applause.)

11 - - -

12 (Brief pause for taking pictures.)

13 MAYOR ALLEN: All right. Welcome,
14 everyone.

15 Now that we have nine Council people,
16 three new ones, to welcome to them.

17 And we're here tonight just to do our
18 reorganization.

19 So, if I can have the roll call for
20 the new Council, please.

21 MS. DENNE: Mayor Allen?

22 MAYOR ALLEN: Here.

23 MS. DENNE: Ms. Ford?

24 MS. FORD: Here.

25 MS. DENNE: Ms. Kamenicky?

1 MS. KAMENICKY: Here.

2 MS. DENNE: Mr. Oakes?

3 MR. OAKES: Here.

4 MS. DENNE: Mr. Cenci?

5 MR. CENCI: Here.

6 MS. DENNE: Mr. Janosik?

7 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Here.

8 MS. DENNE: Mr. Jenkins?

9 MR. JENKINS: Here.

10 MS. DENNE: Mrs. Kautzman?

11 MRS. KAUTZMAN: Here.

12 MS. DENNE: Ms. Garis?

13 MS. GARIS: Here.

14 MS. DENNE: Mrs. Piccolino?

15 MRS. PICCOLINO: Here.

16 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. We have all nine
17 members present. So, hopefully, it will be
18 that way all year.

19 If we can stand for the Pledge of
20 Allegiance, please.

21 - - -

22 (Whereupon, the Pledge of Allegiance
23 was recited.)

24 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. Now for our
25 agenda items. Our first agenda item is

1 Election of President.

2 So, at this time, I will honor any
3 nominations for Council President.

4 MS. GARIS: Mayor, I'd like to
5 nominate Councilman Joe Janosik for Council
6 President.

7 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay.

8 Any other nominations?

9 (No response.)

10 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. I need a motion
11 to close the nominations.

12 MR. OAKES: Motion to close.

13 MAYOR ALLEN: All in favor?

14 MS. FORD: Aye.

15 MS. KAMENICKY: Aye.

16 MR. OAKES: Aye.

17 MR. JENKINS: Aye.

18 MR. CENCI: Aye.

19 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Aye.

20 MS. KAUTZMAN: Aye.

21 MS. GARIS: Aye.

22 MRS. PICCOLINO: Aye.

23 MAYOR ALLEN: Opposed?

24 (No response.)

25 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. Now we are going

1 to vote for the election of the nomination.

2 At this point, Joe Janosik has been
3 nominated.

4 Can we have a roll call for his
5 nomination, please.

6 MS. DENNE: Ms. Ford?

7 MS. FORD: Yes.

8 MS. DENNE: Ms. Kamenicky?

9 MS. KAMENICKY: Yes.

10 MS. DENNE: Mr. Oakes?

11 MR. OAKES: Yes.

12 MS. DENNE: Mr. Cenci?

13 MR. CENCI: Yes.

14 MS. DENNE: Mr. Janosik?

15 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Yes.

16 MS. DENNE: Mr. Jenkins?

17 MR. JENKINS: Yes.

18 MS. DENNE: Mrs. Kautzman?

19 MRS. KAUTZMAN: Yes.

20 MS. DENNE: Ms. Garis?

21 MS. GARIS: Yes.

22 MS. DENNE: Mrs. Piccolino?

23 MRS. PICCOLINO: Yes.

24 MAYOR ALLEN: Okay. Vote 9-0 for Joe
25 Janosik.

1 Congratulations.

2 (Applause.)

3 MAYOR ALLEN: At this time, I'll turn
4 the meeting over to our new President,
5 Mr. Janosik.

6 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Thank you, Mayor
7 Allen. Thank you, members of Council.

8 The next item on the agenda is the
9 Election of Vice President.

10 I would ask for the nominations for
11 Council Vice President, please.

12 MR. OAKES: Mr. President, I would
13 like to nominate Kim Kamenicky for Vice
14 President.

15 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: We have a
16 nomination by Mr. Oakes of Ms. Kamenicky for
17 Vice President.

18 Any other nominations at this time?

19 (No response.)

20 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Hearing none, we
21 will close -- we will need a motion to close
22 the nominations.

23 MR. JENKINS: Motion to close.

24 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: We have a motion
25 to close the nominations.

1 I move that we close the nominations
2 for the position of Council Vice President.

3 Can we have roll call, please.

4 MS. DENNE: Ms. Ford?

5 MS. FORD: Yes.

6 MS. DENNE: Ms. Kamenicky?

7 MS. KAMENICKY: Yes.

8 MS. DENNE: Mr. Oakes?

9 MR. OAKES: Yes.

10 MS. DENNE: Mr. Cenci?

11 MR. CENCI: Yes.

12 MS. DENNE: Mr. Janosik?

13 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Yes.

14 MS. DENNE: Mr. Jenkins?

15 MR. JENKINS: Yes.

16 MS. DENNE: Mrs. Kautzman?

17 MRS. KAUTZMAN: Yes.

18 MS. DENNE: Ms. Garis?

19 MS. GARIS: Yes.

20 MS. DENNE: Mrs. Piccolino?

21 MRS. PICCOLINO: Yes.

22 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: We have 9 to 0
23 vote.

24 Congratulations, Vice President
25 Kamenicky.

1 (Applause.)

2 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: The next item on
3 the agenda is the Appointment of Committee
4 Chairs and Liaisons of the Municipality of
5 Bethel Park.

6 I'm going to do a brief bio of each
7 one of them before we go through it, so it's
8 going to take a little bit of time. I'm just
9 going to ask you to bear with me a little bit
10 here.

11 MR. OAKES: Three minutes.

12 The Bill Ruhl rule does not apply.

13 First off, I would just like to
14 thank my family and friends who have supported
15 me, and the voters of Ward 5 for rewarding me
16 with another four years of representing them.
17 And I am so grateful that my mom could be here
18 tonight.

19 I'd like to thank the previous
20 Council members, Joe Consolmagno, Dave
21 Espinar, and especially Lindsay Flinn, who's
22 here tonight, for their service to the
23 community.

24 I'd like to thank Mayor Allen for his
25 support and wisdom. I've been able to spend a

1 lot of time with you lately through the
2 holidays, and I appreciate our relationship
3 and your friendship very much.

4 I'd like to thank Municipal Manager
5 Kristin Denne, Assistant Manager Jhad Burns,
6 and all the directors and employees who work
7 hard every day to make sure our community runs
8 smoothly.

9 And finally, I'd like to thank the
10 new Council for having the faith in me to
11 elevate me to Council President. I'm humbled
12 and honored. And I promise you and the entire
13 community to never take anything for granted.

14 I'm a lifelong resident and graduate
15 of Bethel Park High School, Class of 1988.
16 And I cherish the opportunity to serve the
17 community where I grew up for another four
18 years.

19 Tonight is a historical night for the
20 Bethel Park's Council in that for the first
21 time ever there's a majority of women serving
22 on Council.

23 (Applause.)

24 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: And my choices
25 for leadership will reflect that.

1 I want to thank Ms. Kamenicky, our
2 new Vice President and Ward 2 Councilwoman,
3 who has been a great partner to me, and did an
4 excellent job as Chair of General Policy and
5 Finance Committee for the last two years.

6 She helped Molly Hill Park get the
7 improvements it badly needed last year. For
8 that, I and the Mollenauer Mine 3 and
9 neighboring community are extremely grateful.

10 Kim and her husband Brian and their
11 two children have lived in Bethel Park since
12 2016, after growing up here. She is a highly
13 respected IT professional, who recently
14 started a new job that I hope is going well.
15 She's also a graduate of Bethel Park High
16 School.

17 And she will serve as a liaison to
18 the Long Range Planning and Economic
19 Development Committee as well as the Grievance
20 Committee.

21 Anything to add or say,
22 Ms. Kamenicky?

23 MS. KAMENICKY: Just thank you. I'm
24 looking forward to working with you the next
25 couple years, and ready to get to work.

1 So, thank you.

2 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Yep.

3 Next, I want to thank Mr. Oakes for
4 serving as President for the last two years.
5 We spent a lot of time on the phone talking
6 about what was the best thing to do for Bethel
7 Park. And I have great respect for all the
8 hard work that you've put into the job. I
9 appreciate you very much. And I'm proud to
10 call you my friend.

11 John has lived in Bethel Park's
12 Ward 3 since 2010 with his wife Amanda and
13 their beautiful family. Mr. Oakes owns All
14 Pro Plumbing at the corner of Library and
15 Logan roads, and serves many capacities in the
16 community.

17 He's on the Executive Board of the
18 Bethel Park Historical Society, and is heavily
19 involved in the Rotary Club, and many other
20 local organizations.

21 With that, I'm appointing you as
22 Chairman of Public Works and Maintenance with
23 a promise that I won't give you a hard time
24 about spending all of our money.

25 Mr. Oakes will also serve as a

1 liaison to the Municipal Authority, where he's
2 been for two years, and prior to his time on
3 Council was a member of that Authority, The
4 Fire Company, and the Borough's Association,
5 as well as the Chamber of Commerce.

6 Anything to add or say, Mr. Oakes?

7 MR. OAKES: I appreciate and I accept
8 the nomination you are asking me. I love
9 serving the community that I live in. I think
10 our residents are our shining star. We have a
11 lot of volunteers, a lot of community
12 engagement. And I love living here and
13 raising my family here.

14 So, thank you very much.

15 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Yep. Thank you,
16 Mr. Oakes.

17 Mr. Todd Cenci is now the elder
18 statesman of the group, having served as
19 Ward 4 Councilman since 2019.

20 He's a former policeman who served on
21 former Mayor Bob O'Connor -- Mayor of
22 Pittsburgh Bob O'Connor's personal security
23 detail, and has a wealth of knowledge about
24 public safety. He's also a proud 32-member
25 [sic] of the Fraternal Order of Police. He

1 currently helps --

2 MR. CENCI: Year.

3 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: 32 -- what did I
4 say?

5 MR. CENCI: "Member."

6 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: -- 32-year member
7 of the Fraternal Order of Police. He
8 currently helps with elderly abuse cases for
9 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

10 With that, he will remain the Chair
11 of the Health, Safety and Welfare Committee,
12 as well as serving as liaison to the Police
13 Merit Board, the Fire Company, and the
14 Grievance Committee.

15 Anything to add or say, Mr. Cenci?

16 MR. CENCI: No, sir.

17 Thank you, Mr. President.

18 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Always a man of
19 few words.

20 Ms. Viola Garis currently works as
21 special projects manager for State Senator
22 Nick Pisciotano, and has been involved in
23 state and local government for the better part
24 of a decade.

25 She is what I like to call the

1 EF Hutton of our group. She doesn't say a
2 lot, but when she talks, we all listen. And
3 that's the truth.

4 For those of us who don't -- for
5 those of you who don't know the EF Hutton
6 commercials, you can Google it.

7 She is the Ward 8 Councilwoman who
8 moved to Bethel Park in 2021 with her partner,
9 former Allegheny Councilman -- Allegheny
10 County Councilman Tom Duerr, who is a lifelong
11 resident and graduate of Bethel Park High
12 School.

13 With that, I am appointing Ms. Garis
14 as the Chair of the General Policy and Finance
15 Committee. She will also serve as a liaison
16 to the Legislative Committee.

17 Anything to add or say, Ms. Garis?

18 MS. GARIS: I'd hate to contradict
19 you, so I won't say much.

20 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Thank you.
21 Perfect.

22 Introducing one of our newest
23 members, Ms. Alison Piccolino. She is a
24 mother of three who brings a wide variety of
25 knowledge and experience to Council from her

1 years of community involvement, volunteering,
2 and her professional background.

3 Alison is the director of external
4 affairs in the PA Senate -- PA Senate --
5 Pennsylvania State Senate -- sorry -- for
6 close to 20 years, working for several state
7 senators in that time.

8 She has worked with numerous
9 grassroots nonprofit organizations and
10 community leaders over the years to provide
11 programs, initiatives, services, and is a
12 voice for many.

13 She's also the former secretary of
14 the Bethel Park Soccer Association Board of
15 Directors, chair and founder of community
16 events such as the Bethel Park Soccer
17 Association's Family Fun Fest, and former vice
18 president of the William Penn PTO.

19 Alison is a proud wife, mother,
20 daughter, and coach who looks forward to
21 growing our community and being a voice for
22 her neighbors in Ward 9 and all of Bethel
23 Park.

24 With that, I'm appointing
25 Ms. Piccolino as the Chair of the Planning and

1 Zoning Committee. She will also serve as a
2 liaison to community organizations, the
3 Legislative Committee, Parks and Recreation,
4 and the School District.

5 Anything to add or say,
6 Ms. Piccolino?

7 MS. PICCOLINO: Thank you very much
8 for your belief in me. I'm very -- I'm really
9 looking forward to being part of, you know,
10 Bethel Park Council and our community.

11 And I just do have a couple -- a
12 couple words to say.

13 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Absolutely.

14 MS. PICCOLINO: You know, public
15 service has been in the forefront of my life
16 since I can remember.

17 I have to read this, or I'll just
18 start crying. So I have to just say emo- --
19 I'm just going to keep the emotion straight.

20 You know, if it was my beautiful
21 mother who stood with -- you know, stood with
22 me this evening for our photos, showing me the
23 importance of volunteering or my father who
24 has literally a lifetime of public service
25 under his belt, whether it was administrative,

1 fighting fires, or holding service, including
2 school board, council, and 18 years as mayor
3 in the City of Duquesne, where I am proud to
4 see that I was born and raised.

5 They have taught me what love for
6 others and the importance of doing our part
7 for our communities truly is.

8 So, many years I got to stand by your
9 side, Dad, as you took your oath. And to have
10 you by my side holding the Bible means more
11 than you will ever know.

12 And here I am now as a new
13 Councilwoman with my three beautiful children
14 with me this evening that I am incredibly to
15 call them my -- that they call me Mom. And I
16 hope I make them and all of Bethel Park, a
17 community that we love, proud.

18 You know, in life, we do nothing
19 alone. And while he couldn't be here this
20 evening due to a work obligation, I would be
21 remiss if I do not mention my very best
22 friend, my husband Frank. Many of you know
23 Frank. And, as you know, he is just a light.
24 And I'm so lucky to have him and his constant
25 support.

1 And, you know, I truly believe that
2 Bethel is a community filled with so much to
3 offer and so much to grow. And I'm honored to
4 bring my experience here with, you know, these
5 individuals that I sit next to.

6 And all of you have a wide range of
7 knowledge and experience, and I look forward
8 to working with each and every single one of
9 you.

10 Lastly, I just want to thank all of
11 my family, all of my friends, new and old.
12 You know, to my neighbors in Ward 9 for
13 trusting me with the opportunity to represent
14 you on Council and help lead Bethel Park into
15 the future.

16 As I have said, public service is a
17 gift. Regardless of what level of government,
18 the opportunity is a gift. And people trust
19 you, right? They trust us and to do what's
20 best for the communities that they love.

21 And I look forward to getting to work
22 with my colleagues, not only for my neighbors
23 in Ward 9, but for all of my neighbors in this
24 wonderful community.

25 So, thank you very much.

1 (Applause.)

2 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: And thank you,
3 Alison, for making me not the only one who had
4 a lot to say tonight.

5 MS. PICCOLINO: Sorry.

6 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: I appreciate
7 that.

8 I'd also like to introduce Ms. Diane
9 Ford from Ward 1 and Ms. Jillian Kautzman from
10 Ward 7 as new members of Bethel Park Council.

11 Diane has the pleasure of being the
12 executive director of Melting Pot Ministries,
13 an out-of-school time program for at-risk,
14 suburban, poor youth and families.

15 She grew up in Bethel Park, and is a
16 daughter, sister, wife, mom, grandma, cousin,
17 and friend. Diane owns and operates Reverse
18 Aging Naturally Energy Spa - RANES, in Bethel
19 Park, and is the co-founder of The SEED
20 Project, a grass-roots organization that helps
21 meet the needs of community members who need a
22 hand up through initiatives like Operation
23 Feed a Neighbor, which is a Thanksgiving food
24 giveaway, and the Samuel and Anna Mae
25 Richardson Community Garden.

1 Additionally, Diane assists with
2 Adopt A Family South Hills, a Christmas
3 gift-giving giveaway that has blessed hundreds
4 of families through the generous contributions
5 of our community members.

6 Diane was born to love, and believes
7 that it's her responsibility to share the love
8 of God with everyone she meets. Her heart's
9 desire is to transform lives by helping people
10 recognize that they are valuable, important,
11 and absolutely necessary.

12 Diane believes that we are all God's
13 children and are made in his image to be
14 kingdom builders. Hashtag, "let's get her
15 done."

16 She's also a graduate of Bethel Park
17 High School, who has served as liaison to the
18 Commerce -- Chamber of Commerce, the Library
19 Board, Parks and Recreation, and the Shade
20 Tree Commission.

21 Anything to add or say, Ms. Ford?

22 MS. FORD: Of course.

23 I just would like to say thank you to
24 all of my family. This has been a trying
25 year. And I just feel honored and blessed to

1 have been selected by the community of Ward 1
2 in particular to serve in a greater capacity.

3 And Alison, I probably will cry.

4 But this is huge, because we don't
5 only just make history with all women on this
6 Board, but I'm the first African-American.

7 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: That's right.

8 (Applause.)

9 MS. FORD: My family has been here
10 in Bethel Park since 1927. And for that to be
11 a first, we have a lot more firsts to come.
12 But I just feel blessed and honored.

13 And I just want to also say to all of
14 the community, if you ever need or have any
15 questions about me or want to get to know
16 what's going on in our Ward or in our
17 community, please don't hesitate to give me a
18 call. I'm here for the people.

19 And that's all I have to say.

20 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Equally --

21 (Applause.)

22 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: That's equally as
23 important as impressive.

24 And I totally meant to talk to you
25 about that to see if you wanted me to say that

1 or you.

2 MS. FORD: That's okay. I --

3 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: And I'm glad you
4 did.

5 MS. FORD: I can say it.

6 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Absolutely.

7 MS. FORD: Thank you.

8 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: I'm sure you will
9 not be shy.

10 MS. FORD: No, not at all.

11 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Jillian Kautzman
12 is a 16-year resident of Bethel Park, and
13 lives with her husband Shawn and kids, Bryce
14 and Delaney (phonetic).

15 She is a graduate of Penn State
16 University with a Bachelor of Science in hotel
17 and institutional management. Her
18 professional career has been spent working in
19 the hospitality industry, where she has met
20 and worked with people from all walks of life
21 and from all over the world.

22 She is currently an area director of
23 revenue management for a hotel management
24 company, where she focuses on marketing and
25 pricing strategies, budgeting hotel revenue

1 and expenses, and analyzing economic and
2 industry trends.

3 Her favorite things to do are
4 spending time with her family and pets,
5 camping and hiking, and creating art.

6 And I can tell you Ms. Kautzman is a
7 very talented artist. We've seen some of her
8 work on Facebook, and always been impressed.

9 She will serve as liaison to the
10 Library Board, Parks and Recreation, and the
11 Shade Tree Commission.

12 Anything to add or say, Ms. Kautzman?

13 MS. KAUTZMAN: Yes.

14 Thank you, Mr. President. I'll try
15 to be quick.

16 To the residents of Bethel Park, and
17 specifically Ward 7, I am honored to have the
18 privilege of serving for the next four years.
19 I commit to spending this time listening,
20 learning, collaborating, and pushing forward
21 for you.

22 I commit to pushing beyond "it can't
23 be done," "we've never done it that way," or
24 "that will never work." When I don't have the
25 answers, I will not be shy about continuing to

1 ask the hard questions and to try to stay
2 curious to find out the answers.

3 I firmly believe that government,
4 especially local, can and should work for all,
5 and that it is our job to create space for
6 voices to be heard.

7 To the current members of Council,
8 Mayor Allen, Municipal management and staff, I
9 look forward to developing a partnership with
10 you, learning from you, and working together
11 for Bethel Park. There is such a vast amount
12 of experience and knowledge among you, and I
13 can't wait to begin the journey.

14 To my fellow newcomers, Ms. Ford and
15 Ms. Piccolino, you both are amazing women who
16 possess years of serving your communities. I
17 know I have so much to learn from you both.
18 I'm glad to go on this adventure with you.

19 To my people, you know who you are,
20 the support, advice, encouraging words,
21 relentless work have gotten me here, and I am
22 forever grateful. I hope to make you all
23 proud.

24 To my family here supporting me, I
25 love you, and thank you for your support. My

1 mom, thank you for always cheering me on. My
2 sister and brother-in-law, who swore me in
3 tonight, nieces and nephew, I love you, and
4 I'm so grateful to have you here tonight.

5 My kids, Bryce and Delaney, I love
6 you more than anything in the world. You are
7 the reason when anyone asks, what made you
8 want to be involved. I want to help make our
9 little world of the world just a little
10 better, safe, inclusive, a place where you
11 will always be proud to call home.

12 I also hope to show you that when
13 things are challenging in the world, you keep
14 pushing, you help where you can, you find your
15 voice and you keep using it.

16 To my husband Shawn, thank you for
17 only a brief side eye every time I tell you
18 about the next endeavor I want to take. I'm
19 grateful for your ability to just roll with it
20 and for your support through it. I'm also
21 grateful that you found our little house in
22 this community I love 16 years ago. I love
23 you.

24 Thank you.

25 (Applause.)

1 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: All right.
2 Almost done.

3 Rounding out Council, and certainly
4 last but not least, is returning Councilman
5 Jim Jenkins from Ward 6.

6 He is also a graduate of Bethel Park
7 High School, making four of us up here, who
8 owned his own landscaping business for 40
9 years, and works hard in retirement to make
10 sure Bethel Park succeeds.

11 Jim will remain as liaison to the
12 Municipal Authority and the Shade Tree
13 Commission, where he has served for the last
14 two years. He will also serve as the liaison
15 to the Delinquent Property Review Committee.

16 Anything else to add or say,
17 Mr. Jenkins?

18 MR. JENKINS: Thank you, Joe. And
19 congratulations on becoming President of
20 Council.

21 I've been a councilman for two years.
22 I've been here all my life. And all I've ever
23 tried to do is make things a little bit better
24 and nicer wherever I can in Bethel Park with
25 helping out with different things, the

1 Blackhawk Family Relief Fund, things like
2 that, and --

3 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: That's right. I
4 didn't mention.

5 New President?

6 MR. JENKINS: Yes, sir.

7 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Of the Blackhawk
8 Family Relief Fund, Jim Jenkins.

9 MR. JENKINS: So, I'll just keeping
10 continuing in working together and keep moving
11 forward in Bethel Park.

12 Thank you.

13 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: All right. Thank
14 you, Mr. Jenkins.

15 (Applause.)

16 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: There were some
17 late changes to the liaison list, so I'll be
18 finalizing it and circulating it before next
19 Monday's meeting.

20 Last thought. I tried to be as
21 thoughtful as I could to play this down the
22 middle. The leadership and committee chairs
23 consist of three Republicans and three
24 Democrats, and three men and three women. And
25 I think that's appropriate given the make-up

1 of this Council.

2 And I want you all to know that we
3 will always do what we think is best for the
4 residents of Bethel Park at all times and in
5 all circumstances.

6 That's all I have for now.

7 We'll be celebrating tonight, and
8 looking forward to getting to work at our
9 first meeting of the year next Monday.

10 Does anyone have anything else they
11 would like to add for the good of the order?

12 (No response.)

13 MR. OAKES: Motion to adjourn.

14 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: I have a motion
15 to adjourn.

16 Is there a second?

17 MR. JENKINS: Second.

18 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: So moved.

19 All those in favor?

20 MS. FORD: Aye.

21 MS. KAMENICKY: Aye.

22 MR. OAKES: Aye.

23 MR. JENKINS: Aye.

24 MR. CENCI: Aye.

25 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Aye.

1 MS. KAUTZMAN: Aye.

2 MS. GARIS: Aye.

3 MRS. PICCOLINO: Aye.

4 MR. JANOSIK: All those opposed?

5 (No response.)

6 PRESIDENT JANOSIK: Meeting

7 adjourned.
