THE TEACHERS

Art Academy classes are staffed by qualified teachers who show proficiency in art and who have experience working with children and young adults in creative arts education. Art Teachers will provide a stimulating environment for students to create a wide range of art forms and express themselves through various media. During the creative process, teachers will instruct in technique and share the knowledge that guides expert judgment in the arts. Teachers will shepherd the creative process and enable students to express themselves in ways that give meaning and purpose to art.

THE STUDENTS

Students come from all walks of life and bring varying levels of skill and experience. We teach, they teach, and we all learn. Each student can expect quality instruction in the arts with opportunity to expand his/her knowledge of media and technique and to develop a sound judgment of the arts based on exposure to art history, and the elements and principals of design. 
