Tissue Paper Craft Days

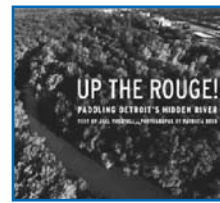

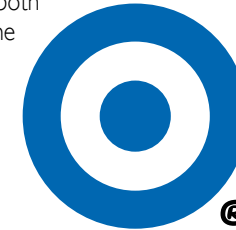

Arts & Scraps Event

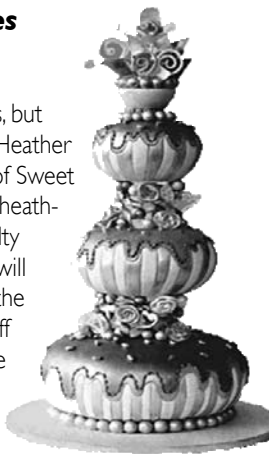

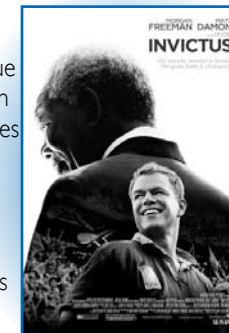

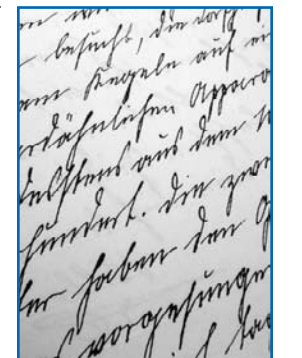
