DCC Cooperative Bids and Information Sharing	<p>Joint purchasing collaboration among Downriver Community Conference (DCC) member communities to increase purchasing power and promote cost savings among the communities. Some department of public works (DPW) items include: road salt, water meters, cold patch and uniforms. DPW/S directors from member communities meet once a month to discuss needs, evaluate bids, communicate progress, and discuss other timely and relevant issues. DPW/S Directors take turns developing the RFPs for the commodities needed; DCC provides administrative support through recordkeeping and meeting facilitation. Communities may 'opt out' of any bid that does not meet their particular needs. Alliance of Rouge Communities (ARC)	<p>The ARC members represent public agencies with water management responsibilities whose jurisdictional boundaries are in part located within the Rouge River watershed. The purpose of the Alliance is to provide an institutional mechanism to encourage watershed-wide cooperation and mutual support to meet water quality permit requirements and to restore beneficial uses of the river to the area residents. Since 2003, the group existed as a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to respond to the declining federal grant funds to Wayne County for the Rouge River National Wet Weather Demonstration Project that had supported watershed-wide management efforts since 1993.
