Item 1. Call the Meeting to Order

Mayor Heflin calls the meeting to order at 3:36 p.m.

Item 2. Approve the Minutes from the March 18, 2026 MPO Policy Board Meeting

Mayor Heflin called for a motion to approve the MPO Policy Board Meeting minutes from the March 18, 2026 meeting. Chairman Long made a motion with a second by Councilwoman Werstler. The motion carried unanimously.

Item 3. Adopt Resolution 26-13 to amend the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to decrease funding on the following project:

Project Description – Reconstruction on Church Street from SR-3 (US 31/ 6th Avenue) to Somerville Road

Mr. Hellums explained that this resolution is to decrease the estimated cost for the preliminary engineering and construction phases of this project. For the PE phase the Original Cost estimate was \$125,000.00 with a Decreased Cost estimate of \$6,794.54 for a new Total Cost estimate of \$118,205.46. For the CN phase the Original Cost estimate was \$1,226,944.82 with a Decreased Cost estimate of \$341,907.98 for a new Total Cost estimate of \$1,003,242.30.

Mayor Heflin called for a motion to approve Resolution 26-13. Councilwoman Werstler made a motion with a second by Councilman Bullard. The motion carried unanimously.

- Item 4. Adopt Resolution 26-14 to amend the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add the following projects:

Projection Description – SR-20 (US-72) New location to increase capacity over the Tennessee River in Decatur from SR-67 (Beltline Road) to I-65

Mr. Hellums explained that this study is the follow up to the Tennessee River Bridge Feasibility Study. Rep. Dale Strong secured a \$3,000,000 Federal Appropriation and State Senator Arthur Orr worked with ALDOT to add approximately \$7,000,000 in state funding. This study will focus on the existing corridor including narrowing locations identified in the Feasibility Study to select a preferred alternative and solutions to improve the existing corridor. Extensive environmental and engineering will be performed during this study. The study will be managed by ALDOT. The MPO and its members will be stakeholders in the study.

Mayor Heflin called for a motion to approve Resolution 26-14. Councilwoman Werstler made a motion with a second by Chairman Long. The motion carried unanimously.

- Item 5. Adopt Resolution 26 – 15 to amend the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to decrease funding on the following project:

Project Description – Resurfacing, Bridge Guardrail Retrofit, Guardrail, Guardrail End Anchor Upgrades, and Guardrail Rest for Steel Blockouts on SR-3 (US-31) from the South End of Capt. W. J Hudson Bridge to Thomas Hammonds Road.

Mr. Hellums explained that this is a decrease in the project cost. The Original Cost estimate was \$4,616,011.00 with a decreased cost estimate of \$590,754.35 with a new total cost estimate of \$4,025,256.65.

Mayor Heflin called for a motion to approve Resolution 26-15. Councilman Bullard made a motion with a second by Councilwoman Werstler. The motion carried unanimously.

- Item 6. Adopt Resolution 26 –16 to adopt the Draft FY 2027 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)

Mr. Hellums explained that the 2027 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) contains the work tasks and budget to be conducted by the MPO staff for Fiscal Year 2027. Mr. Hellums stated the document will have a 30-day comment period.

Mayor Heflin called for a motion to approve Resolution 26-16. Councilwoman Werstler made a motion with a second by Councilman Bullard. The motion carried unanimously.

Item 7. Adopt Resolution 26– 17 to adopt the Draft 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)

Mr. Hellums explained that the Long-Range Transportation Plan is a document adopted by the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) every five years. He stated that the current update incorporates data from the 2020 U.S. Census, employment statistics, traffic counts, and school enrollment figures to develop the Travel Demand Model (TDM). He further explained that the TDM was validated by the ALDOT's Travel Demand Modeling consultant. Mr. Hellums explained the proposed projects for the 2050 planning horizon that were selected for inclusion in the Plan and explained the project evaluation criteria used in the selection process. He also informed the Board that the draft document will be available for a 30-day public comment period and that MPO staff will conduct two public meetings during that time, with one meeting to be held in Decatur and the other in Hartselle.

Mayor Heflin called for a motion to approve Resolution 26-17. Chairman Long made a motion with a second by Councilman Bullard. The motion carried unanimously.

Item 8. Adopt Resolution 26 – 18 adopting ALDOT FY 2026 Transit Asset Performance Measures for Tier II 5307/5311 Agencies.

Mr. Hellums explained that this is a performance measure for NARCOG's transit program. The performance numbers were determined by a consultant. He explained that the MPO does not manage the transit program but the MPO board does have to approve the measures for NARCOG to receive transit funding.

Mayor Heflin called for a motion to approve Resolution 26-18. Mayor Evans made a motion with a second by Councilwoman Werstler. The motion carried unanimously.

Item 9. ALDOT and MPO Staff News and Updates

Travis Kilgore from ALDOT updated the board on the following projects:

- I-65 Bridge repair is ongoing. Repair work will have to be paused during winter months for migratory birds.
- I-65 resurfacing in Morgan County is ongoing.
- I-65 ITS project is ongoing.
- 6th Ave beautification project is ongoing.
- AL 67 on the Beltline in Decatur pavement project is nearing completion.

- AL 67 repaving project from I65 to the Beltline to start soon.
- AL 20 Lawrence County Line to the Beltline pavement project nearing completion.
- Greenway Dr and AL 24 Intersection improvement project to start soon.
- I-65 bridge replacement in Lacon over the CSX railroad is in the design phase.
- I-65/Cedar Creek/AL 67 bridge deck rehab project is in the design phase.
- Vaughn Bridge RD and US 31 intersection improvement project in Hartselle expected to start soon.
- West Morgan RD Culvert replacement is ongoing.
- US-31 and Norfolk Southern railroad bridge replacement in south Limestone County is in the design phase.
- AL 67 resurfacing project from Indian Hills RD to US 31 is expected to bid in April 2026.
- AL 67 on the Beltline resurfacing project from AL 24 to Al 20 is expected to bid in April 2026.
- US 31 resurfacing project on Decatur Causeway is expected to bid in soon.
- Lando Cain RD and AL 36 intersection improvement project in Hartselle design is ~85% complete. Right of way acquisition is ongoing.
- Church St resurfacing project in Decatur has let to Rogers Group.
- Upper River Rd and AL-67 intersection in design phase.
- US 31 and Sparkman St intersection improvement project in Hartselle is in the design phase.
- US 31 repaving project along the Tennessee River Causeway to Calhoun Community College to start soon.

ALDOT Region Director Derrick Wilson introduced Travis Kilgore as the new Pre-Construction Engineer for ALDOT's North Region.

Mayor Heflin commended ALDOT for the managing and communication during the I-65 Tennessee River Bridge rehab project.

Mr. Hellums provided the Board with an update regarding the development of a new federal transportation authorization bill. He reported that the U.S. House of Representatives has passed legislation through the House Transportation and Infrastructure Subcommittee, while the U.S. Senate continues to work toward passage of its version of the bill. Mr. Hellums also advised the Board that a continuing resolution by congress may be necessary before final legislation is passed.

Chairman Long thanked Mr. Hellums and the MPO staff for the work on the Draft 2050 LRTP.

Item 10. New Business
No new business.

Mr. Faruqui asked if the potential new interchange projected by Huntsville's interchange study is captured in the Draft 2050 LRTP.

Mr. Hellums explained that that project and potential infrastructure falls inside the Huntsville MPO. The Decatur MPO would capture any effects of said interchange using external counts.

Mr. Faruqi asked if the Draft 2050 LRTP would account for the future growth.

Mr. Hellums explained that the Draft 2050 LRTP does account for future growth.

Item 11. Adjournment

Mayor Heflin called for a motion to adjourn. Chairman Long made the motion with a second from Councilwoman Werstler. The meeting adjourned at 4:18 pm.
