VILLAGE OF ANTIOCH BURNING BAN

In order to maintain air quality and reduce possible nuisance or health impacts, the open burning of landscape and domestic waste materials within the Village limits is strictly prohibited by Village Code. The burning of fuels for campfire, recreational and cooking purposes, or in domestic fireplaces, in areas where such burning is consistent with other laws, is allowed provided that no garbage shall be burned.

PHOSPHORUS BAN

The Village Board of Trustees passed an ordinance banning the use of fertilizer containing phosphorus within Village Limits in order to limit the concentration of phosphorus in the Village's lakes, rivers and streams. Wherever fertilizer is sold within village limits, a sign must be posted that reads "The Village of Antioch prohibits the application of fertilizer containing phosphorus to any lawn or turf area and any impervious surface, drainage way, wetland or buffer zone". Please be sure when you purchase fertilizer that it does not contain phosphorus.

ROUTE 83 CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Due to the large interest and impact the Route 83/Main Street construction project has on everyone the Village would like to share some information that we have gathered from the Route 83 working team. Currently as you take a ride down Route 83/Main Street you can start to see what the finished product will look like but also notice many areas incomplete. Prior to winter a substantial completion of the project which will include a surface lift of asphalt and a temporary pavement striping.

In the Spring of 2011 the construction team will return to re-visit the project for pavement milling and final lift of surface asphalt, and provide permanent pavement striping.

We still have a decent amount of work left so please keep in mind that this is construction and weather can play a role in the completion of these items and could cause delays. Please remember to drive slow and safe through all of these zones.

ROUTE 173 RAIL ROAD CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULED

IL Route 173 will be fully closed approximately 1 block east of IL Route 83 in Antioch, Lake County, beginning at 7:00am, Wednesday, November 3, 2010 until approximately 5:00pm, Saturday, November 13, 2010 by the Canadian National (CN) Railroad for the purpose of removing and replacing the Railroad crossing grade at this location. The posted detour for eastbound IL Route 173 traffic will be to turn right (south) from EB IL Route 173 onto SB IL Route 83; proceed south on IL Route 83 to left (east) on Grass Lake Rd; east on Grass Lake Rd. to left (north) on Deep Lake Rd.; north on Deep Lake Rd. back to EB IL Route 173. The posted detour for westbound IL Route 173 will be to turn left (south) from WB IL Route 173 onto SB Deep Lake Rd.; proceed south on Deep Lake Rd. to right (west) on Grass Lake Rd.; west on Grass Lake Rd. to north (right) on IL Route 83; north on IL Route 83 back to WB IL Route 173.

ANTIOCH'S LEAF COLLECTION PROGRAM

Antioch's first leaf collection program begins Monday, November 1st and goes through November 27, 2010.

Antioch's Leaf Collection Program will take place each fall. Residents are asked to rake leaves to the curb where vacuum trucks will collect them. Residents are reminded that once the collection truck makes its final run in your neighborhood, it will not return to collect any additional leaves.

Waste Management will make every effort to collect leaves along each Village roadway every week. However, factors such as weather or large volumes of leaves may slow down collection. The target collection dates are shown on the Leaf Collection Schedule Map included in this newsletter.

Due to the limited reach of the vacuum truck, residents are asked to rake leaves as close to the street as possible. When placing the leaves at the curb, please do not block culverts or storm sewer openings. Leaves piled in these areas may create drainage problems in the event of heavy rains or melting snow. Please see the map in the middle of this newsletter for details and locations.

THE FIRE DEPT NEEDS YOUR HELP!

The Fire department wants to remind everyone that Snow-covered fire hydrants, blocked access routes, and covered address markings will slow down not only the department's response, but also our ability to provide the necessary emergency service. There is something that you can do to help.

Everyone in the community, residents, business owners, and snow removal crews can assist the Fire Department by clearing away the fire hydrants, and keeping an area approx. four feet around the hydrant clear. Furthermore, when possible, keep the sidewalks, driveways, and entrances to a business or residence clear. The snow removal companies can help by making sure they are not placing the plowed snow in any of the above-mentioned area, which would create the hazards we are trying to avoid. Last year due to many snowstorms combined with little or no snow melting we had a situation where the snow on the ground has passed the height of a hydrant.

In this situation, the clearing of hydrants becomes crucial; and by taking the extra effort, we may all be preventing a tragedy.

The fire department wants to remind everyone that shoveling snow can be a very labor-intensive process, and anyone who may doubt his or her physical condition should take it slow and get someone to help you.

SNOW REMOVAL ORDINANCE

- Persons Required to Remove Snow. The owners, occupants, or lessees of lots which abut a public sidewalk are required to clear snow after two inches has accumulated. Additionally, the owner is required to clear off accumulations of ice, sleet, or freezing rain. The responsible person is required to maintain the sidewalk in a reasonably clear condition.

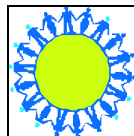
- Area required to be cleared. The responsible person is required to clear the lesser of 72 inches or the full width of the sidewalk. Additionally, owners must closely abutting sidewalk ramps are required to clear the ramps.

- Timing. Clearance should occur within 24 hours after the cessation of an event that deposits at least two inches of snow.

OPEN ARMS MISSION SEEKS DONATIONS FOR HOLIDAY FOOD BOXES

Open Arms Mission Food Pantry is seeking donations to purchase 775 food boxes to distribute to low income families for the holiday season.

The holiday meal boxes will provide enough food to feed a family of eight. A donation of \$25 provides a traditional holiday dinner, including a 12-14lb turkey, potatoes, vegetables, gravy, cranberry sauce, stuffing, dessert and coffee. Each box also provides additional nutritious foods, said Executive Director Marytherese Ambacher.

"We distribute more than 2,000 pounds of food to an average of 257 families weekly, 194 gallons of milk and 70 weekend backpacks filled with nutritious food to school-age children," said Ms. Ambacher. "We know the number of families we serve increases during the holidays, so we are really counting on donations from our friends in our local communities to help us. We are thankful for their support."

The food pantry, located at 1548 S. Main St., provides food boxes weekly to many senior citizens and families with children who are facing financial difficulties.

All proceeds from this market go entirely to these Fair Trade organizations to help underprivileged people of the world achieve self-sufficiency and sustainability.

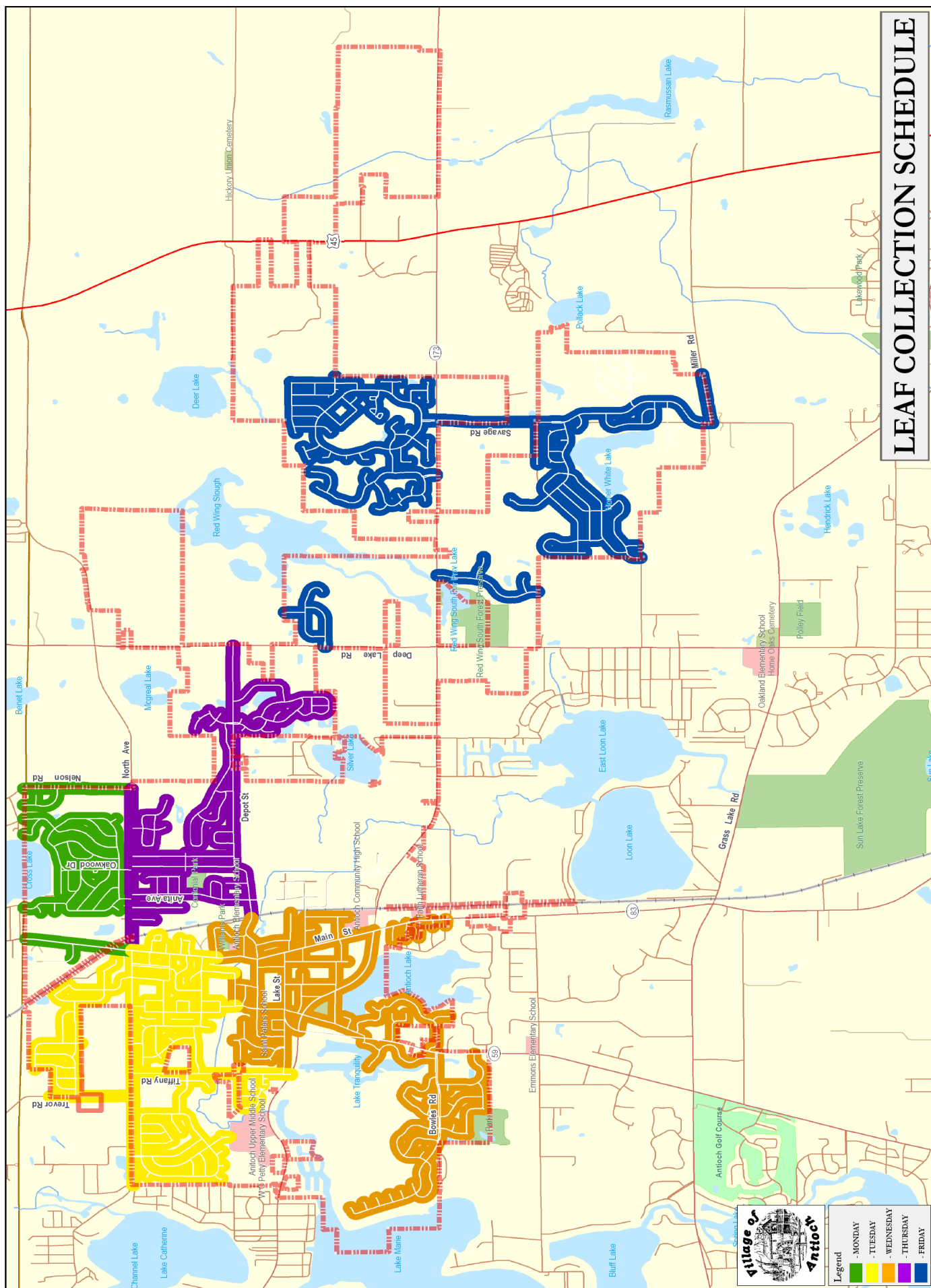

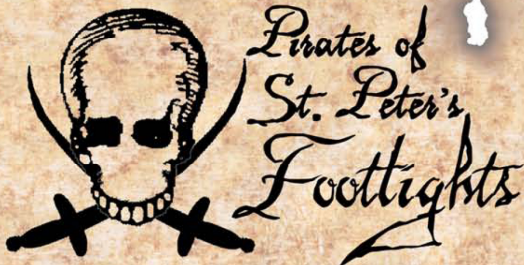
