

In order to control the flow of traffic during an emergency situation, the Chief of Police may implement a parking restriction. One of the most common is the Snow Emergency Parking Ban.

Whenever a Federal, State or City emergency threatens the flow of traffic to the degree that it may cause a problem with the transportation of food, fuel, fire apparatus, medical care, police protection, and/or other City services, the Police Chief shall declare an emergency. The most recurrent of these emergencies is weather. Beginning on November 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup> whenever an extreme weather condition threatens the public safety, the Police Chief shall declare a winter parking ban.

**Example:**

- ➤ During the even numbered years, vehicles shall park on the even numbered side of the street.
- ➤ During the odd numbered years, vehicles shall park on the odd numbered side of the street.

**Notification:**

- ➤ The public is notified of a Winter Parking Ban in a manner considered appropriate by the Chief of Police; examples are Local Television, Network Television, Radio, and Police patrols using a bullhorn.

If an existing ordinance prohibits parking on one or both sides of a street, you must obey the ordinance regardless of the parking ban.

You may not park within 20 feet of an intersection (corner). Some intersections are signed with “No Parking Here To Corner” these is a City ordinance and you are required to obey the posted sign regardless of the parking ban.

Listed below are certain main traffic arteries and/or parts they’re of, where vehicles are prohibited from stopping, parking, or standing in accordance with the Snow Emergency.

- ➤ Vehicles found in violation of the parking ban are considered a hazard to the safety of the general public and may be towed at the owner’s expense.
