The City Council of the City of Farmington met on November 27, 2017, at Long Memorial Hall, 110 West Columbia Street, Farmington, Missouri, 63640. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Forsythe.

Councilor Robinson gave the invocation.

Mayor Forsythe stated that a Public Hearing is being held to gain input regarding:

In accordance with Section 99.865 of the Missouri Revised Statutes, the City Council of the City of Farmington, will hold a public hearing on Monday, November 27, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers at Farmington City Hall, 110 West Columbia St., Farmington, Missouri 63640 to determine if the following tax increment financing plans and the redevelopment projects associated with such plans are making satisfactory progress under the proposed time schedules contained within the approved plans for completion of the projects:

- Karsch Boulevard and Downtown Farmington Tax Increment Financing District
- 2. Highway 67 Tax Increment Financing District

Greg Beavers, City Administrator, updated the Council on revenue and expenditures of the two TIF Districts. He stated that the Karsch Boulevard and Downtown Farmington TIF expires in 2018, and the Highway 67 TIF expires in 2028.
