## CITY OF FARMINGTON

City Council Minutes of Meeting March 11, 2021 6:00 p.m.

The City Council of the City of Farmington met on March 11, 2021, at Long Memorial Hall, 110 West Columbia Street, Farmington, Missouri 63640.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Forsythe.

Kevin Berry gave the invocation.

The roll was called with the following Councilors present: Adam Parks, Harry Peterson, Wayne Linnenbringer, Chris Morrison, Vanessa Pegram and Keli Keutzer.

City Counselor, Scott Reid, was present.

Officials present were Michelle Daniel, Ashley Bischoff, Todd Mecey, Tim Porter, Greg Beavers, Larry Lacy and Rick Baker.

Councilor Pegram made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Councilor Linnenbringer, and passed unanimously.

Chad Follis entered the meeting at 6:02 p.m.

Scott Jordan, 701 John David, addressed the Council regarding the noise of the breaking of rock [Pine Trails Subdivision] that went on last year from Spring to Fall. He stated that it's overwhelming and has started up again, but now includes Saturdays and earlier start times.

Chuck Koppeis, Developer, explained that the breaking is finished for now.

Mr. Jordan further explained his frustration on the matter.

Chuck Koppeis stated that the basements are left to do in the future but won't be as bad.

Joe Koppeis, Developer, stated that the worst of the rock breaking is by far over.
