City Council Minutes of Meeting November 22, 2021 6:00 p.m.

The City Council of the City of Farmington met on November 22, 2021, at Long Memorial Hall, 110 West Columbia Street, Farmington, Missouri 63640.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Forsythe.
