MINUTES OF MEETING

The Public Works Committee of the City of Farmington met in regular session on July 14, 2022 at the Development Services Building, 12 South Franklin Street, Farmington, Missouri, 63640.

At 5:08pm, G. Boatright called the meeting to order.

The roll was called with the following members present: Chad Follis – present; Wayne Linnebringer – absent (arrived later); Adam Parks – present; Garrett Boatright – present.

Guests present were: Larry Lacy and Kristen White.

ADDITIONS AND DELETIONS TO AGENDA

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

A. Parks motioned to approve the June 9, 2022 meeting minutes, seconded by C. Follis. The Committee voted unanimously in favor of this motion.

OLD BUSINESS

NEW BUSINESS

1. Lindsey Theobald at 4146 2nd St., Delassus, Connect to City Water – Lindsey Theobald addressed the Committee to explain that her well water tested positive for hexavalent chromium, and she would like to connect to City water. The Committee discussed the issue. G. Boatright motioned to have L. Lacy contact the Missouri Department of Natural Resources regarding the water and report back to the Committee, seconded by C. Follis. The Committee voted unanimously in favor of this motion.
2. “No UTV/ATV Vehicles on City Streets” Signage at City Limits – L.Lacy stated that the Mayor brought the issue to his attention. The Committee discussed the issue. G. Boatright motioned to deny the request and send to Public Safety with an unfavorable recommendation, seconded by C. Follis. The Committee voted unanimously in favor of this motion.
3. Stop Sign Request at KREI and Burkstone – L. Lacy stated that a complaint was received regarding the intersection. The Committee discussed the issue. G. Boatright motioned to deny the issue and send to Public Safety with an unfavorable recommendation, seconded by C. Follis. The Committee voted unanimously in favor of the motion.
4. Discussion of Grease Ordinance – L. Lacy stated that the purpose of change is to clarify the ordinance for food establishments. The Committee discussed the issue. W. Linnenbringer motioned to approve the ordinance and send a favorable recommendation

to City Council, seconded by C. Follis. The Committee voted unanimously in favor of this motion.

5. 2022 Reconstructor Project – L. Lacy stated that Haugland Energy Group won the bid. The Committee discussed the issue. G. Boatright motioned to approve the contract and send a favorable recommendation to City Council, seconded by C. Follis. The Committee voted unanimously in favor of this motion.
6. Repair of the Screw Pumps at East WWTP – L. Lacy stated that the repair cost is approximately \$234,000. The Committee discussed the issue. C. Follis motioned to approve the repairs and send a favorable recommendation to City Council, seconded by A. Parks. The Committee voted unanimously in favor of this motion.
7. Discussion of Radio Tower on Tower Ave Property – L. Lacy stated the tower is for police communications. The Committee discussed the issue. C. Follis motioned to approve the placement of the tower, seconded by A. Parks. The Committee voted unanimously in favor of this motion.
8. Other Items – Amy Jarrett, 130 Pine Street, addressed the Committee to request an update on the drainage easement in her yard. L. Lacy stated that work would begin in August.

G. Boatright motioned to adjourn the meeting, seconded by C. Follis. The Committee voted unanimously in favor of the motion.
