City Council Minutes of Meeting August 25, 2025 6:00 p.m.

The City Council of the City of Farmington met on August 25, 2025, at Long Memorial Hall, 110 West Columbia Street, Farmington, Missouri 63640.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Morrison.

Wayne Linnenbringer gave the invocation.

Mayor Morrison held a moment of silence for Gay Wilkinson and J. Lee Boyd.

The roll was called with the following Councilors present: Dan Combs, Vanessa Pegram, David Kennedy, Adam Parks, Chad Follis, Wayne Linnenbringer, and Joshua Smith.

Councilor Kauflin entered at 6:13 p.m.

Officials present were Tim Porter, Lainie Gault, Paula Cartee, Travis Trokey, Floyd Massey, Larry Lacy, Chris Bullock, Casy Moore, and Greg Beavers.

City Counselor, Scott Reid, was present.

Representative Dale Wright addressed the Council regarding a possible expansion of the S.O.R.T.S. facility and the transfer of offenders from across the state to the City of Farmington. He asked the city to consider working on a petition against the expansion of the facility and transfer of offenders.

Pat Collier, 155 Butterfield Dr, explained the significance of the David Murphy Springhouse to the formation of Farmington and asked the Council to work towards cleaning up the property surrounding the springhouse.

Karen Kleinberg, 1255 Possum Hollow and a member of the Monday Club, spoke on the historical importance of maintaining the David Murphy Springhouse.

Karen Jones, 2685 Wycliff Dr and a member of the local D.A.R. Chapter, asked permission from the Council to place flags around town for the celebration of America's 250th year. Council discussion followed, with Greg Beavers, City Administrator, stating flags would be placed at each city facility.

Reports were given by Committee Chairs with discussion.

Public Hearing Minutes of Hearing August 25, 2025 6:00 p.m.

The City Council of the City of Farmington met on August 25, 2025 at Long Memorial Hall, 110 West Columbia Street, Farmington, Missouri 63640.

The hearing was called to order by Mayor Morrison.

The roll was called with the following Councilors present: Dan Combs, Vanessa Pegram, David Kennedy, Adam Parks, Chad Follis, Wayne Linnenbringer, and Joshua Smith.

Councilor Kauflin was absent.

City Counselor, Scott Reid, was present.

Mayor Morrison stated that a Public Hearing is being held to gain input regarding:

A tax rate hearing will be held at 6:00 p.m. Monday, August 26, 2025, at Long Memorial Hall, 110 West Columbia Street, Farmington, Missouri, at which time citizens may be heard regarding the property tax rates proposed to be set by the City of Farmington, a political subdivision. The tax rates shall be set to produce revenues which the budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2025, shows to be required from the property tax. Each tax rate is determined by dividing the amount of revenue required by the current assessed valuation. The result is multiplied by 100 so the tax rate will be expressed in cents per \$100 valuation. Tax rates are subject to approval by the State Auditor and may be revised to reflect required changes.

Tim Porter, Development Services Director, explained the application request, stated the comprehensive plan shows the area as "C-2" General Commercial District, and a traffic study is currently being conducted.

Greg Beavers, City Administrator, explained the tax rate calculations.
