- We completed stocking the threadfin stocking on Tuesday. We received between 18-20,000 from Birmingham, AL. There was very little loss during transport. Most were 2-4" long. The strategy was for these fish to spawn to create more forage fish. We aim to continue this for a few years.
- Trout releases are happening in the river over the next six weeks.
