Individual Meeting Reports and Actions:

Lake Operations Administrator – Dean Givens reported:

- Dean sent letters out to Camp Care, Kenneth Appling & Mary Sue Kelly to advise them of the recommendation to deny their commercial boat permits for the 2009-2010 Season. The Marine Commission upheld that recommendation for Camp Care and Kenneth Apling. Mary Sue Kelley was granted a conditional boat permit on a probationary period of one year. Approval letters for all others have gone out and people have started coming in and picking up their commercial boat permits.
- Dean stopped 13 boats the first Sunday in January for not having their 2009 boat permits. All were given warnings. The board discussed how to handle this in the future, in that all of the boats stopped belonged to lakefront owners and all but one of the boats stopped indicated that they knew that were supposed to have their permits on their boats before putting them in the water. The consensus recommendation to Dean was that a grace period up until January 15th should be observed, with the understanding that owners would be given only one warning would be given during the period.
- Dean mentioned a desire to have a stipulation in writing that says that "we reserve the right to refuse service to anyone" as a means of requiring boats to leave the lake, avoiding any loopholes in the Lake Use Procedures. The board will consider this for future evaluation.
- Dean has been elected to the Board of the North Carolina Lake Management Society.

- We still need some kind of bait fish in lake. N.C. Wildlife agrees and encourages such, and March and/or early April is the best time to do that. Dean and Gary are working on a fishery plan that would guide our spending on any stocking.
- Gary will meet with our 4 fishing guides to get their input on bait fish, and then take a summary of that to Barbara Wiggins and others, to get feedback from other Lake Managers.

- Russ Pits reported, in Robin's absence, that the upgrades to the Sewer Plant have been quite successful and the plant is operating more efficiently. We expect to have the SOC lifted upon its expiration at the end of February.
- The state is holding a public hearing on February 12th at Isothermal College to consider the renewal of our sewer treatment discharge permit.

Regulations & Law Enforcement - Chris Braund reported:

• Chris will be taking the position of Interim Town Manager effective the week of January 19th. A search (including the collection of resumes, interviews, etc.) for a long term Town Manager is underway with the intent to have the position filled by the end of March. Chris is a candidate for the position as well. Chris would like to remain on the Lake Advisory Board during the interim period. In the event he does not offer or accept the Town Manager position, he would like to continue on the LAB for another 2-year term, but would not seek reappointment as the Chairperson. In he remains as the Town Manager, he would resign from the LAB, thus leaving a

position to be filled by appointment. Chris asked the Board to be thinking about the appointment process and those would be best suited for those positions.
