APPROVAL OF AGENDA AND MEETING MINUTES

The Agenda for the October 1, 2020 meeting was reviewed. Mrs. Bay made a motion to approve the Agenda and Mr. Massey seconded the motion and all members were in favor.

The Minutes of the August 6, 2020 meeting were reviewed. **Mr. Bragdon made a motion to approve the Minutes** and **Mr. Dittmer seconded the motion and all members were in favor.**

Special Topics and Discussion

The Board reviewed the proposed 2021 Parks and Recreation Board Meeting dates. Mrs. Bay made a motion to approve the 2021 Parks and Recreation Board Meeting dates and Mr. Massey seconded the motion and all members were in favor.

Parks & Recreation Board Members Presentation and Discussion

Parks, Recreation & Lake Report - Ms. Dana Bradley

Ms. Bradley reviewed the Parks, Recreation and Lake September Report (attached) and introduced Jess Kerr from ROC and Bailey Hornstein the AmeriCorps Project Conserve Trails Coordinator.

Ms. Bradley mentioned that the Youngs Mountain Trail which still belongs to Conserving Carolina is a total distance of 5 miles (2.5 out and back). The trail is not yet complete. After the trail is complete, the plan is for Conserving Carolina to turn the land back over to Rutherford County. The County and the Town of Lake Lure will decide the future of the trail from there. Ms. Bradley also updated the Board regarding work days on Weed Patch Mountain. Ms. Bradley briefly discussed Naming Rights which she sent the draft of the plan, which had been written by Ms. Bay, Mr. Walters and Town employee Garrett Murphy, to Andy Bell who will review and add suggestions.

Ms. Bradley reviewed that she has measured the Buffalo Creek Park Kiosk plexiglass cover, which was vandalized, and get a cost for replacement. Ms. Bay asked about her previous month's suggestion regarding installation of donation boxes on town trails. Ms. Bradley mentioned that it has gone to the attorney to be reviewed. Ms. Bradley will keep the Board posted.

Ms. Bradley reviewed the Parks, Recreation and Lake Projects and mentioned the Boys Camp Road property. After researching dog parks and realizing that the Boys Camp Road property may not be suitable for one, they've sent their recommendations to Town Council. The Council, who has allocated some funds for a dog park, will make a final decision to use the Boys Camp Road property or not. Mr. Bragdon asked Ms. Bradley for an update on the Golf Course Study. Mr. Givens stated that they were analyzing the study and will meet with Council and Mr. Minick to work up a current business model and one for the future.

Buffalo Creek Park, Weed Patch Mountain & the Trail to Eagle Rock - Mr. Larry Czajkoski

Mr. Czajkoski thanked Ms. Bradley for the trail counter numbers and mentioned he is very happy and sees an upward trend. Ms. Bradley reviewed the work days on Weed Patch Mountain where large fallen trees were now removed. The Saddlewood Access road had also been worked on and is cleared and in good condition for First Responders. The Buffalo Creek Park Trail looks amazing after they repaired some erosion and drainage issues. Ms. Bradley also mentioned that Weed Patch Mountain has a cluster of six newly fallen trees that need to be removed.

There was also a discussion regarding the parking area needed at the Buffalo Creek Park Trailhead and Mr. Czajkoski asked for Ms. Bradley to put that on her action plan list. Ms. Bradley agreed the parking was needed being that the times she's been to the park, cars were parked up and down the roadway.

<u>Dittmer-Watts Nature Trail Park – Ms. Bradley</u>

Ms. Bradley told the Board that she had met with Mr. Dittmer and looked at a new small trail possibility. She mentioned the park looked really good but they were still having problems with a beaver, which has now rebuilt a dam up stream. She mentioned that they will destroy the new dam and may look at the possibility of trapping and relocating the beaver.

Lake Lure Flowering Bridge - Mr. Bill Massey

Mr. Massey was encouraged to see the trail counter numbers. Ms. Bay discussed an auction that will take place where they will be auctioning off the Sun's displays that had been a part of the decorations. Mr. Massey mentioned some areas that have been worked on by the river bank. He also mentioned a new compost display that will encourage others to try composting.

Lake Lure Public Golf Course - Mr. Dale Minick

Mr. Minick was not present.

Morse Park - Mr. Jim Walters

Mr. Walters gave accolades to both Town employees, Carl Landrum and Melody Potter, who have continued to keep Morse Park looking its best and mentioned it is the jewel of the town's parks. Mr. Walters discussed planned paving along the road by the riverbank and mentioned possible grants could be applied for. Mr. Walters stated that the Amphitheatre had been seeded and looks very nice. He also mentioned that there are plans in the works still to fill in part of one of the ponds.

Parks and Recreation Programs and Initiatives - Mr. Dan Bragdon

Mr. Bragdon had nothing new to add but mentioned that he will be looking into 2021 for ideas on programs and ways to monetize the parks.

Additional Parks and Recreation Discussion Items - Ms. Moe Bay and Mr. Martyn Watts

Ms. Bay mentioned that she had attempted to put together an art show but got little response. She felt that possibly next year would be a better time when people are more willing to get out after COVID. Ms. Bay also asked about the progress on the Open Space Plan. Mr. Givens mentioned there were no updates.

Mayor Pritchett thanked the Board for the work that they're doing for the town especially now that many people are wanting to get outdoors during COVID.

- 3. Dredging Grant: The written portion of the grant is completed and the grant will be submitted after the Town adopts a No Conflict of Interest Policy and it can be submitted, along with the grant.
- 4. Naming Rights Policy: We will continue to gather information for drafting a Naming Rights Policy for Town properties.
- 5. Lake Lure Trails: Work days will be held on Lake Lure trails each month to ensure they are properly maintained.
